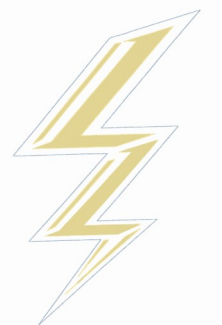

ENROLLMENT

There are 2,035 students enrolled at Legacy High School, with a Senior Class size of 452 for the 2010 - 2011 school year.

COMMUNITY

Located in Broomfield, Colorado, Legacy is a public high school for grades nine through twelve. The Adams 12 Five Star School District serves over 42,000 students. It is located northwest of Denver in an economically diverse suburb.

PHILOSOPHY

Legacy High School was founded in 2000 as a secondary school based on the belief that all students are provided with opportunities and support to be able to achieve academic excellence.

SCHEDULE

Legacy High School operates within a semester schedule and offers block and single period classes.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

L2K (Legacy 2000)

This is a rigorous four-year program designed to develop the tangible and intangible skills and experiences that assist students interested in preparing themselves for a career involving mathematics, science, and technology. The four-year course objectives include career and technology exploration, research practice, job shadowing, and a final project presentation. This project encapsulates real-world experience, professional codes of conduct, and adherence to the regulations and procedures inherent in successful companies.
