

INTRODUCTION

The LMEI has continued to grow since our last report in August 2005 as is evident from the Programme of Activity listed below and our statement of accounts. We have also taken on an additional member of staff to help with the administration of our burgeoning programme of events. Highlights of the period include the 15 May symposium on Islamic finance sponsored by Merrill Lynch through its Global Private Clients Division, and attended by HRH the Duke of York, and the third event in the Soudavar series on the Idea of Iran, held on 10 June. Both events are resulting in publications. The Middle East in London magazine has been taken in-house and is now produced by SOAS post-graduates who work for us part-time, together with LMEI staff and our Editorial Board. In the last two months the LMEI has reached agreement with the London based publisher, Saqi Books, to produce four volumes in 2007. Two of the books will be based on conferences (that on the role of families in the Gulf, and one on British-Egyptian relations since Suez, to be held in November), one on oil and democracy in Iraq that was the result of a DIFD consultancy, and one by Bill Hale entitled Turkey, the United States and Iraq.

We are gratified by the success achieved this year and are appreciative of the contribution made to that success by SOAS and everyone associated with the LMEI, including the Board of Trustees. We continue to see growing awareness of the LMEI in governmental, academic, business and regional circles, and are pleased that this awareness, in addition to our public programmes, repays some of the goodwill shown towards us by SOAS.

MISSION STATEMENT

The aim of the LMEI, through education and research, is to promote knowledge of all aspects of the Middle East including its complexities, problems, achievements and assets, both among the general public and with those who have special interest in the region.

In this task it will build on two essential assets. First, it is based in London, a city which has unrivalled contemporary and historical connections and communications with the Middle East - political, social, cultural, commercial, scientific and educational. Secondly, the LMEI is closely linked to SOAS, the only tertiary educational institution in the world whose explicit purpose is to provide training and scholarship on the whole Middle East from prehistory until today.

INSTITUTIONAL NEWS

Visit by HRH The Duke of York

HRH the Duke of York visited the London Middle East Institute on 17 January 2006 to become familiar with its activities and personnel and to participate in a roundtable discussion on contemporary issues in the Middle East. Since 2001 HRH The Duke of York has served as Special Representative for International Trade and Investment for the Department of Trade and Industry. HRH was received by the Principal of the School of Oriental and African Studies, Professor Colin Bundy and several representatives of the LMEI Board of Trustees and Advisory Council. During his meeting at the LMEI the Duke of York emphasised the importance of non-governmental institutions such as the LMEI in contributing to public interest in and knowledge of



the Middle East in the UK. He placed particular emphasis on the need to bring together Middle Easterners with UK based specialists to exchange views and explore means through which important contemporary issues can be addressed more effectively. The personal interest of the Duke of York in Islamic law and its application in global financial dealings, in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and in the current political situation in Iraq stimulated a lively debate on these and related issues. It was these fruitful discussions which led to the organisation of a symposium on Islamic Finance later in the year.

THE MIDDLE EAST IN LONDON




BIRTH OF THE PERSIAN EMPIRE

Vesta Sarkhosh Curtis and Sarah Stewart. Published by I.B. Tauris.

Of the great ancient civilizations, that of Persia is the least known and the most enigmatic. This book explores the formation of the first Persian Empire under the Achaemenid Persians. It brings together a multi-disciplinary view of ancient Iran in the first millennium BC and concentrates on the art, archaeology, history and religion of a geographical area far beyond the present borders of modern Iran in the period beginning just before the formation of the Persian empire in the middle of the 6th century up to its collapse following conquest by Alexander the Great in the late 4th century BC. Eminent scholars here give a critical approach to some of the traditional interpretations and discuss topics which help the reader towards a better understanding of the formation of the Persian empire. This is the first volume in the "Idea of Iran" series which will be a four-volume collection encompassing the history of that country.

Volume 2: The Age of the Parthians will be launched on 25 November at the 4th symposium in the series 'The Idea of Iran'.




FUTURE PUBLICATIONS

The LMEI has reached agreement with the London based publisher, Sagi Books, to produce four volumes in 2007. Two of the books will be based on conferences (that on the role of families in the Gulf we held last year and one on British-Egyptian relations since Suez, to be held in November), and two will be based on manuscripts that were originally intended for our occasional papers series (one on oil and democracy in Iraq that was produced as a result of a DIFD consultancy, the other by Bill Hale, Turkey, the United States and Iraq.)

On 15 June 2005 SOAS Interface and the LMEI submitted to the MOD a bid on a tender for a one year contract to provide weekly analyses of the Arab media. The LMEI was successful in winning the contract with the MOD contract which will expire on 30 June 2006.

In August 2005 the LMEI together with the Commonwealth Journalists' Association, and the support of the Global Opportunities Fund of the FCO, *Engaging Islam* programme, continued its series of Middle East journalists training programmes. The aim of the two workshops, which targeted both the print and broadcast media, was to provide assistance in preparing journalists to cover forthcoming elections in Afghanistan and Egypt.



CENTRE OF CONTEMPORARY CENTRAL ASIA AND THE CAUCASUS (CCAC)

With the emergence of the independent states of Central Asia and the Caucasus, SOAS, University of London has expanded its teaching and research resources for these important regions. SOAS currently hosts a multi-disciplinary team of scholars working on Central Asia and the Caucasus, the largest grouping in any single institution in the U.K. and Europe. The principal role of the Centre is to promote, coordinate and disseminate information relating to, the academic study of Central Asia and the Caucasus across the disciplines and to act as a resource for academic, governmental, non-governmental and business constituencies with an interest in Central Asia and the Caucasus. It does so through the research and publications of its staff, new teaching programmes, an established seminar series and special events.

Its regional focus has been the Middle East and North Africa because this was, and remains, the region most challenged by its negative water balance. During the 2001-2002 academic year the Water research group at SOAS merged with related activities at King's College London and became the KCL/SOAS Water Research Unit. Currently the water research unit is headed Tony Allan . Ten researchers focus on the socio-economic, trans-boundary and legal aspects of water resources management. The unit has an international reputation in first - water, food and trade. Secondly - institutions and water policy reform in the water sector. Thirdly - trans-boundary water conflict and conflict resolution The interdisciplinary nature of these themes requires inputs from specialists in other disciplines such as politics, economics, international finance, development studies and law.





IN MEMORIAM - ZAKI BADAWI

The LMEI deeply regrets the death of Zaki Badawi on 24 January 2006.

His death, at the venerable age of 83, marks a sad loss for both Muslim and non-Muslim communities. After taking a BA in psychology at University College, London, graduating in 1954, Mr Badawi undertook a PhD as an external degree from London University (with a SOAS adviser), on Modern Islamic Thought. Mr Badawi enjoyed a long career of teaching Islamic studies globally and held many important positions as a leading Islamic scholar. As a lecturer, Badawi was well received on many occasions by the SOAS community, who enjoyed his lectures (always given without a text, for this man had a remarkable memory and full confidence in his abilities).

Zaki Badawi had a full life. Wherever he went he was ever resourceful, and left his mark. He was always confident that his vision, his aspiration and his activities were firmly based on the teachings of Islam. Badawi's legacy will remain a fitting tribute to a truly remarkable man.
