1. Command Composition and Organization.

a. Mission. USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) keeps open sea lanes of trade and communication by projecting air superiority to all points on the globe. Maintaining her equipment and men in the highest state of readiness enables her to carry out a wide variety of missions including anti-air warfare, anti-surface warfare, antisubmarine warfare, and electronic warfare. She also shares, with other Navy ships, a mission of replenishing ships at sea and performing various non-combat missions such as rescue at sea of vessels in distress and transport of refugees and others in need of help, enclosure (1).

b. Organizational Structure and Home Port. Captain Dayton W. Ritt is the Commanding Officer. Enclosure (2) contains his biography and photograph. Captain Alan M. Gemmill is the Executive Officer. His biography and photograph are contained in enclosure (3). USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT's organization, including Heads of Departments, staff members and collateral duty assignments, is shown in enclosure (4). USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) is homeported in Norfolk, Virginia and assigned

to Commander Carrier Group EIGHT.

c. Chronological Listing of Significant Events. Enclosure (5) is a chronological listing of significant events and enclosure (6) contains a chronological list of visitors.

2. Narrative.

January 1st, 1989 found USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) underway in the first days of her maiden Mediterranean deployment. Embarked in TR was RADM (L) David B. Robinson, Commander Cruiser-Destroyer Group EIGHT, who served as Commander Task Force 60 during the Mediterranean deployment. To prepare the crew for the upcoming six months, TR held a safety standdown (3 & 7 Jan), a security standdown (5 Jan) and a chemical warfare standdown (6 Jan). On January 5th, TR conducted the first of 70 fueling at-sea evolutions when USS FARRAGUT pulled alongside for over 96,000 gallons of JP-5. During the cruise, TR pumped more than 21,957,000 gallons of JP-5 to ships in the battle group.

The cruise also marked the maiden deployment of the Navy's first and only "TR" or ten-squadron air wing, Carrier Air Wing EIGHT. This new line-up adds one squadron of A-6's and one each additional E2C & EA6B aircraft to the traditional line-up, giving TR more power projection capability than ever before.

TR entered the SIXTH Fleet on January 11th and welcomed the first of more than seventy flag officers the next day when VADM J. D. Williams, Commander U.S. SIXTH Fleet, flew aboard for a familiarization visit along with VADM R. M. Dunleavy, Commander Naval Air Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet. During his visit, VADM Dunleavy presented TR with the Engineering "Red E" and Communications "Green C" for CY 1988. Further detail is provided in enclosure (6).

The USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT Battle Group relieved USS JOHN F. KENNEDY as Task force SIX ZERO in the Mediterranean on January 15th. Briefers from COMSIXTHFLT embarked TR to update crew and officers on political and operational events in the Mediterranean. TR then joined JFK for the first exercise of the cruise, National Week 1A.

USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT's Sailor of the Year was also selected on 15 January. Master at Arms (Surface Warfare) First Class Charles J. Vincuilla, Jr. won the honor.

TR entertained the Chairman of the Italian Joint Chiefs of Staff, Admiral Mario de Ugo Porta for an overnight embark on 21 January 1989, the first of more than fifty embarks hosted by TR during the cruise.

The first liberty port after 24 days at sea, Palma De Mallorca, offered many TR sailors their first visit to foreign soil. Crewmembers took advantage of offered tours to jousting tournaments, the scenic countryside and to the many surrounding beaches. Traveling to the town of Petra, birthplace of Juniper Sera, founder of California, crewmembers entertained children at a local school with songs and games. Sailors participated in goodwill visits to schools and hospitals throughout the cruise, singing songs, playing games and distributing toys donated by the Hasbro Company.

Departing Palma on 31 January, TR headed to Marseille, France. TR hosted the first of 12 media embarks when representatives from the Associated Press, ABC television and Cable News Network flew aboard 4 Feb. The resulting stories were broadcast worldwide. In early February, TR joined forces with the French Navy in the first joint exercise of the cruise, Phinia '89. CVW-8 aircraft flew missions in support of amphibious operations, including an opposed landing and a non-combatant evacuation. At the conclusion of Phinia '89, VADM Tripier, Commander of French Naval Forces, praised the ship's performance saying, "It was a great privilege and a real pleasure to work together during this exercise. Your professionalism and devotion has been impressive and appreciated". During Phinia '89, the ship entertained visits from ADM James Busey, Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces Europe and Gen Schmitt, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff for France.

Following completion of the exercise and one day prior to TR's next port call, the ship entertained the Honorable R. Susan Wood, Consul General of the U.S. in Marseille, France on 9 Feb. The next day TR dropped anchor in Marseille for what was scheduled as a six day

port call. However, unexpected Mistral winds forced an emergency sortie on 14 Feb. Members of TR's Reactor and Engineering plants were manned, ready and steaming in six minutes during very adverse conditions. The ship returned to Marseille on 16 Feb to pick up crewmembers and departed the next day.

Underway from 17 - 24 Feb, USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) hosted a visit from Houston radio station KRBE who broadcast live from the TV studio. The visit was taped and rebroadcast on "Entertainment Tonight" and "Navy News This Week". TR also hosted a Battle Force Warfare Commander's Conference. COMSIXTHFLT flew aboard to supervise operations north of Libya on 21/22 Feb.

An experience of a different kind awaited TR in Alexandria, Egypt as crewmembers learned about Moslem culture. While at anchor in Alexandria, TR hosted fifty-three distinguished visitors for lunch and tours. Guests, including four Egyptian cabinet members and the U.S. Ambassador to Egypt, flew to the ship by helo from Cairo and Alexandria. TR crewmen took advantage of the short visit to participate in tours to the pyramids, the sphinx and Egyptian Museum of Ancient Cultures.

Underway from Alexandria on 27 February, members of the Naval Propulsion Mobile Training Team embarked TR to test her Reactor and Engineering Departments in preparation for the upcoming Operational Reactor Safeguards Examination. Also during the transit from Alexandria to Antalya Bay, Turkey, TR entertained the Honorable William K. Perrin, U.S. Ambassador to Cyprus on 1 Mar and General Necip Turumtay, Chief of the Turkish General Staff on 2 Mar. General Turumtay, hosted by VADM J. D. Williams, Commander SIXTH Fleet, was an observer during successful barricade recovery of a VS-24 S-3 aircraft. The following day, TR dropped anchor in Antalya Bay.

Following a port call of seven days, TR headed West via the Straits of Messina to Naples, Italy for a five day port visit. During her visit members of the Swiss Guard, the Italian Red Cross and USO Naples toured TR. On 19 March, Michele Cardinal Giordano, Archbishop of Naples, became the highest ranking church member to visit TR. He confirmed nine TR crewmembers during a Palm Sunday Mass held in the ship's hangar bay.

Prior to anchoring in Tangier, Morocco, the ship hosted thirty-six distinguished visitors including former Prime Minister Mohammed Krim Lamrani, who flew aboard the ship on March 23 for a flight demonstration and tour. This marked the first Moroccan visit to a U.S. warship in more than five years. During the short two-day anchorage, TR hosted the Honorable Mr. Amrani Abdelhay, Secretary General of Tangiers. TR celebrated Easter Sunday with a sunrise service held on the ship's flight deck enroute to anchorage in Augusta Bay, Italy. While at Augusta Bay Secretary of the Navy William H. Ball, Jr. embarked and praised the TR/CVW-8 Team in a speech to the crew. "You are halfway through an extremely successful deployment and that sends out a strong signal to our friends and allies in this part of the world...we will defend our basic interests and we'll do whatever is necessary to ensure our goals and objectives are met and the values we cherish are protected and defended here in the Mediterranean." Secretary Ball's visit was the first of two cabinet level embarks hosted by TR during the cruise. In mid-April, Samuel Skinner, Secretary of Transportation, embarked for a day-long look at TR's operations. Secretary Skinner was accompanied by eight other members of the Department of Transportation and VADM James Busey, Commander U.S. Naval Forces Europe. TR reached the halfway point of the cruise in Augusta Bay. Crewmen celebrated with a "steel beach" picnic complete with talent show and concert by the ship's band. During the two day anchorage, TR hosted Commanders from CTF-60/61/62/63/66/67 and 69 for a conference.

TR hosted more than 600 local dignitaries in her next port call of Toulon, France for her first "Sunset Parade." Guests were treated to a flawless "silent drill" presented by the ship's Marine Detachment. Also during her port visit, TR hosted the Master Chief Petty Officer of the Navy, AVCM(AW) Duane R. Bushey (former TR CMC) for a one day visit.

Enroute to Monaco, more than 30 distinguished visitors including General Herve G. Navereau, Military Governor of Paris, embarked TR for a day-long display of firepower. A list of participants and all visitors can be found in enclosure (6).

A routine transit between port calls in Toulon and Monaco became drama on the high

seas for USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT. Aircraft from Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron NINE (HS-9), embarked with CVW-8, aided by TR and USS SOUTH CAROLINA (CGN-37), rescued fifteen British yachtsmen from four sailboats foundering in hurricane-like seas. The sailboats were part of a 16 boat flotilla sailing from Toulon to Corsica. Search and rescue swimmers from HS-9 entered the chilly water in waves estimated at 35 feet and winds clocked at 70 knots. One survivor, who suffered a broken leg, was airlifted to Toulon for treatment while the others walked ashore the following day when TR arrived in Monaco. The rescue was broadcast on television in France, Italy and the United Kingdom, and reported in newspapers around the world. Details on the rescue can be found in enclosure (7).

The operational tempo of the deployment was tested for a third time during exercise Dragon Hammer '89. TR joined with NATO allies from Italy, the Netherlands, Turkey and the United Kingdom along with non-NATO forces from France and Spain for the exercise from 20 April - 2 May. This large-scale live exercise involving air, land and sea operations took place in Italy, Turkey and the Aegean, Ionian and Tyrrhenian Seas. The exercise was designed to improve combat effectiveness, readiness, coordination and interoperability of allied sea, amphibious and air forces while demonstrating the capability to defend and reinforce the southern region of Europe. TR and CVW-8 supported amphibious landings in Sardinia, as well as naval warfare exercises and air combat operations in Italy and Turkey. Details on the exercise can be found in enclosure (8).

During the exercise, Peter Sommer, U.S. Ambassador to Malta embarked TR with the Commander of the Armed Forces of Malta, a Senior Advisor to the Prime Minister, Foreign Minister, and a Special Assistant to the Prime Minister. This visit was the first visit to a U.S. Navy vessel in several years by representatives of this strategically important island nation and was covered by three members of the Maltese media. The importance of the visit was emphasized during a news conference held on board. VADM J. D. Williams, Commander SIXTH Fleet, remarked, "As long as there is water in the Mediterranean, Malta will have strategic value (to the United States)." Captain Ritt echoed those words, "I consider the Maltese visit every bit as important as the visit of the Marshal of the Soviet Union last year."

TR completed Dragon Hammer '89 on 2 May and two days later arrived in Haifa, Israel for some well earned liberty. More than 3,000 crewmembers took advantage of tours offered to Jerusalem, Galilee and the Dead Sea during the ship's two visits to Haifa. During a special trip to the Jordan River conducted by TR's Baptist Chaplain, 11 crewmembers were baptised in the holy waters. The ship also hosted tours by members of the Israeli Defense Force and a visit from the Israeli Minister of Transportation.

Between the two Haifa visits, TR conducted a three-day air combat exercise.

A second trip to Palma de Mallorca proved to be the crew's favorite. With warm weather and tourist season in peak, crewmembers rated this second stop as their favorite port. More than 300 men viewed their first bullfight.

TR departed Palma 3 June, joining with units from Italy, France and Spain in Exercise Sardinia '89. During the exercise, CVW-8 aircraft flew missions to protect convoy ships, low level bombing runs to support an amphibious landing, and air patrols to guard against opposing air attacks. USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) also hosted several visits during this exercise including ADM James R. Hogg, U.S. Representative to NATO Military Committee, and Air Chief Marshal Sir Michael Knight, United Kingdom Military Representative to NATO.

TR turned over duties in the Mediterranean to USS CORAL SEA (CV-43) on 15 June and left the SIXTH Fleet on 20 June.

As TR outchopped, VADM Williams commented on the ship's performance during the cruise saying, "I've been quite pleased with the performance of the TR battle group, THEODORE ROOSEVELT in particular...There's nothing you (TR) can't do... You're the largest and newest of our carriers but that does not make you a good ship. People make it a good ship...Theodore Roosevelt would be quite proud if he saw the performance of the maiden voyage. You have done the name well."

Subj: COMMAND HISTORY, OPNAV 5750/1 REPORTING

Returning home to a hero's welcome, USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) pulled pierside to the cheers of thousands of anxious wives and girlfriends on 30 June. VADM J. K. Ready, Commander Naval Air Force, U.S. Atlantic Fleet flew to TR prior to her arrival and praised TR's performance in the Med. The ship also entertained members of all the local television stations, and the resulting publicity was used extensively throughout the Tidewater area. Further details on TR's return can be found in enclosure (9).

A period of standdown followed the ship's return from deployment. During the standdown, TR entertained General Duane Cassidy, Commander in Chief, U.S. Transportation Command/Commander in Chief Military Airlift Command and a group of four on 17 July and Ambassador Yuriy V. Dubinin, Soviet Union Ambassador to the U.S. and the Captains of three Russian ships visiting Norfolk on 24 July. The visit was hosted by VADM J. K. Ready, COMNAVAIRLANT and RADM D. B. Robinson, Commander Cruiser-Destroyer Group EIGHT.

Following standdown, TR headed up the Elizabeth River to Norfolk Naval Shipyard for a three and a half month availability period. The \$26 million Selected Restricted Availability resulted in over 2000 completed jobs. Major work included modification to the EA-6B facility to accommodate vans upgraded to ECP-390 configuration and work to remove six KY-8 communications antennas and install ten KY-58s. Enclosure (10) details AIMD changes. During 1989, TR completed 17 K alterations and 41 D & F alterations. Three-hundred seventy-eight (378) controlled jobs were accomplished by ship's force.

After a two day Fast Cruise, USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) departed NNSY 24 November for sea trials. In December TR landed her first fixed wing airplane in five months during Fleet Carrier Qualifications held off the Virginia Capes. During both at-sea periods TR continued in her role of hosting distinguished visitors with visits from MGEN Ryan, USAF, Deputy Commander in Chief, U.S. Atlantic Fleet; BGEN Huey, Deputy Commander, Fleet Marine Force Atlantic; and six congressional staff members during TR's December at-sea period.

The end of 1989 found USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) spending the holidays in Norfolk following a very successful year.

At the start of business 1 January 1989, USS THEODORE ROOSEVELT (CVN-71) had an enlisted crew of three thousand six hundred fifty-four (3654), at close of business on 31 December 1989 there were 2733 enlisted crewmembers aboard. On 1 January 1989 173 officers were assigned to TR and at close of business 31 December 1989 there were 175 officers assigned.

During 1989, 1092 crewmen graduated from the two week School of the Ship held biweekly for newly reporting personnel. During 1989, TR conducted 10,600 catapult launches and 10,600 arrested landings, and CVW-8 aircraft flew almost 22,000 flight hours.
