




Food for the Hungry (FH) & USAID Grants Build Effective and Sustainable Programs


In 2010, FH received **\$31 million** in USG grants for food security programs with \$15 million in cash and \$16 million in donated commodities and freight.

FH and USAID's **Food for Peace (Title II)** resources are used to build sustainable development programs.

Democratic Republic of the Congo, 2008-2011

- Approx. 213 villages/27,000 households reached
- 47% increase in children under 6 months being exclusively breastfed in the last 24 hours
- 188 Care Groups initiated with 1,870 members
- % of population practicing 3+ sustainable agriculture technologies (crop rotation, reforestation, etc) more than doubled
- % of population with year round access to improved water source within 200m of house tripled





Mozambique, 2005-2010



- Approx. 111,000 people reached
- Developed 24 Savings Groups in Cabo Delgado;
 there were none in 2005
- 139 Care Groups initiated with 15,290 members
- 93% of Beneficiary Mothers continue to meet with their Leader Mother long after the program continues
- Developed 182 Farmer Field and Life Groups with 3,276 people receiving extension services
- The average cost per life saved in FH's Child Survival Program is **\$441** (\$852 less than the average Child Survival and Health Grants Program)

• Ethiopia, 2008-2011

- Approx. 84,652 households reached
- 180,456 farmers had improved access to markets due to road construction and maintenance
- 116 Saving and Credit Groups formed and provided with selected value chain crops
- 299 bee-hives with tools were distributed
- 109 Care Groups initiated with 1,114 members
- % of children 0-24 months old started breastfeeding within one hour after birth increased from 44% to 94%
- % of beneficiary children 0-6 months old exclusively breastfed in the last 24 hours increased from 72% to **91%**



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
