

Academic Excellence

Preparing for Academic Excellence: The Junior School

In Forms 3 and 4, boys are rigorously prepared for the senior school. All boys take courses in English, Maths, Science and the Social Sciences, as well as experiencing a range of Technology and Arts subjects (including Music). They follow a Physical Education course and study a language of their choice. For those with an aptitude, two languages are offered.

NCEA and Cambridge International Examinations

We are proud to be able to offer two pathways to academic success. All students have the opportunity to take a very wide range of courses in Forms 5, 6 and 7 leading to NCEA qualifications. These are the New Zealand national qualifications, and performing well in them will allow access to universities in New Zealand or overseas.


If a boy is placed in the top 40% of students at the end of Form 4, he has the chance to follow the Cambridge pathway. Cambridge International Examinations are based in the UK and are linked to the University of Cambridge. They are taken by thousands of schools all over the world, as well as by many of the top schools in the United Kingdom and New Zealand. They follow the British model of qualifications – IGCSE, AS Level and A Level, taken in Forms 5, 6 and 7. Performing well in these examinations will, as is the case with NCEA, allow access to universities in New Zealand and overseas.

We call these options our 'dual pathway'. Every year, a number of our students receive 'Top in the World' or 'Top in New Zealand' awards in the Cambridge examinations, and we were delighted that many of our students have their NCEA qualifications endorsed with either 'Excellence' or 'Merit' each year. Our overall pass rates are also exceptional in both NCEA and Cambridge examinations, evidence that our 'dual pathway' offers two clear routes to success.

James obtained a CIE IGCSE average percentage of 95, with eight A*'s; and an average percentage of 78, three A's and a B at AS Level. James' cultural activities and achievements include Debating, being an Auckland Junior Premier Champion, an Auckland Debating Team Member, Impromptu Cup Champion, Auckland MCC Business Champion and also an ANZ Economics Champion.

Scholarship

Our students have the opportunity to sit the New Zealand Scholarship examinations in their final year at school. Scholarships can be awarded in most subjects, and we encourage our students to enter them. The awards offer the greatest challenge available to school students in New Zealand, and carry with them money to help finance their years at university. Each year, a number of our top students are awarded 'Outstanding Scholarships'. Indeed, in 2008, and in 2010, our students received 'Premier Scholar' awards, placing them in the 'Top Ten' of performers nationwide. We are confident even more will do so in the future. This is testimony to our outstanding academic programmes and our ability to ensure that our students achieve the best results possible.

Academic Institute

As part of our commitment to excellence, we have an Academic Institute. The top stream of boys in both Form 3 and Form 4 experience a special programme of accelerated learning in Maths, English, Social Sciences and Science. In Forms 5, 6 and 7 this extension programme continues, allowing students to take a broader range of subjects, some of them a year earlier than their peers.

NZQA Scholarships 2012

Our students achieved 79 Scholarships in 2012. These included 11 Outstanding Scholarships, making our results the best on the North Shore and amongst the very highest in New Zealand. There were 24 Scholarships in English and Media, and 21 Scholarships in Mathematics with Calculus and Statistics and Modelling.

Alternative Programmes

These occur at NCEA Levels 1, 2 and 3 in English, Mathematics, Science and Physical Education. The courses are designed for students who, after two or three years, have achieved at a level that would not allow them to gain entry into a full NCEA Level 1 or Level 2 course. These courses are designed to enable students to progress at a pace that complements their learning ability and educational needs.

Individual Education Programmes

For the boys with additional learning needs, highly qualified teacher aides work with classes and individual students at the student's own pace, according to his particular needs. Extra support in English and Mathematics is offered when appropriate. Students with little or no English are offered ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages.)

Gateway

We offer Gateway as an opportunity for students to gain first-hand work experience in their chosen fields. Interviews for the selection process begin in Term 3.

Academic Pathways

Form 3 Classes are streamed for core subjects

All eight learning areas are covered to create a broad and balanced curriculum.

All students have a core set of compulsory subjects:

- English
- Language (one of ٠ Chinese, French, German, Japanese or Maori)
- Mathematics
- Physical Education/Health Education
- Social Studies
- Science

These courses will run for the entire year.

A further set of compulsory subjects will run as either one or two term courses.

- Art
- Computing
- Electronics
- DVC (Design and Visual Communication)
- Materials Technology
- Music
- Performing Arts

All students follow courses in learning areas which develop the key competencies outlined in the New Zealand National Curriculum.

Form 4

Classes are streamed for core subjects

All Form 4 students study the compulsory core subjects of:

At least 30 credits are available to count towards an NCEA Level 1 qualification.

They begin to specialise by choosing THREE other full year option subjects. Students in the A band must select at least one language.

NCEA Pathway - Level 1

Matthew obtained a CIE IGCSE A* Top in New Zealand in ICT, two A's and 3 B's; and two A's at AS Level. Matthew has participated in a number of sporting activities including Distance Running, New Zealand Cross Country Nationals, Waterpolo and the New Zealand Schools' Motocross Nationals. He was the Head Technician in the 2012 school show, Oliver and provided technical advice and support for the Jubilee events. Matthew started and ran the Technician Training Programme and has made various video presentations, including the 2012 Graduation video.

Form 6 Cambridge Pathway - Advanced Subsidiary (AS)

- Students select English and three other subjects. To gain a full A Level, the course must also be studied in Form 7.
- An AS course is half of a full A level course
- Students can study one NCEA subject with approval from a Deputy Headmaster.

Boys will choose four AS subjects from the same subjects as those offered in Form 5.

NCEA Pathway - Level 2

Entry into Form 6 is based on Level 1 results.

A wide range of subjects are available. English is compulsory in Form 6. Most Form 5 subjects continue into Form 6.

Form 7

Cambridge Pathway continues - Advanced Level (A2)

- Students select four subjects
- A combination of some A2 and AS subjects is possible
- Most students will study between two and four A2 subjects
- Resits of AS subjects are possible.
- Students can study one NCEA subject with approval from a Deputy Headmaster.


NCEA Pathway Level - 3

Music

At Westlake Boys our musicians are high achievers. We provide opportunities for musically talented young men to thrive and excel both in a classroom environment and as part of our exciting and dynamic co-curricular musical ensembles. Through the combined efforts of the Westlake Boys and Westlake Girls Music Departments we are able to offer opportunities for our top musicians that are virtually unmatched elsewhere in the country.

The combined music groups from Westlake Boys and Girls High Schools are consistent winners of Gold Awards in all four categories of the KBB Music Festival: Symphony Orchestras, Concert Bands, Big Bands and Chamber Orchestras. Our 2012 Barbershop Quartet "East Meets West" capped off their winning streak as three-time Auckland Champions with a top placing at the National Final. Both Voicemale and Choralation (our combined choir with Westlake Girls High School) were placed in the top 18 choirs in New Zealand over the last four years. Choralation remains the only choir to have won the top Platimum Award for 3 years in a row at the National Finale of the Big Sing.

In the search for musical excellence (and fun) Westlake Boys musicians commit to regular tours, camps and festivals. In 2010 the bands toured New Plymouth schools and Choralation finished a stunning year with a very successful tour to England. In 2011, the Concert Band and Big Band travelled to the Rhapsody Rotorua International Music Festival. In 2013 we will reprise our tour of New Plymouth schools and in 2014 we look forward to undertaking a major international trip to Europe.

At Westlake Boys every auditioned co-curricular music group is matched by a similar ensemble for which there is no barrier or entry requirement. No matter what their musical background there is something on offer for every aspiring young musician at Westlake Boys:

Music Institute

All junior musicians have the opportunity to take music as an elective full year option, through a course that focuses on Performance, Composition, Aural, History and Music Theory. Working at a more advanced level of composition and performance are the Music Institute students, who are selected by entrance test and audition at the start of each year. The aim of the institute is to create innovative, personalised programmes to ensure the most talented students achieve their potential.

Within the cultural environment of Westlake, our boys are high achievers.

Westlake Boys High School, with its wide multicultural diversity, celebrates a variety of cultural events and successes through school assemblies and special events. One of the cultural highlights is the annual celebration of the Westlake Culture Week, which is an opportunity for students to celebrate the diverse nature of our school.

Our Drama department regularly delights the community with shows and musicals. In 2011, we joined with Westlake Girls High School to produce 'Guys and Dolls' and in 2012 the show 'Oliver' swept through both schools. In addition, the Westlake Debating and Chess teams also regularly compete and excel in local and national competitions.

The Westlake Kapa Haka group has regularly competed at Polyfest and in 2013 they will compete at the inaugural North Shore Schools festival. They are also regular features at high profile school wide events. The wider Māori community are engaged with regularly through Whānau hui. Westlake Boys High School has a strong Pasifika Parents Komiti (PPK) that meets monthly and contributes to the success of our Pasifka Students. The PPK have been instrumental in organising specific events such as the inaugural Pasifika Celebration evening in 2012.

Cultural communities such as the Korean and Chinese community hold annual events to share their culture with the wider community.

Westlake Community Service

The students of Westlake Boys High School contribute in a variety of ways towards our community. The student body raises a large amount of money annually through 40 hour famine for World Vision and also support our local charitable organisations.

Sporting Excellence

Westlake Boys High School has built a fine tradition of sporting achievement at regional, national and international levels. Our teams compete in all Auckland and North Harbour secondary school competitions, which lead to regional, national and international championships.

The participation of teaching staff and talented parents, many of them highly qualified coaches, ensures that all teams and activities are well organised, supervised and successful.

All boys are encouraged to participate in at least one summer and one winter team sport each year. Boys are expected to be committed to their school teams, and their loyalty to Westlake Boys High School is highly valued.

Sport is a key part of the Westlake experience as it helps develop character and encourages lifelong healthy living. The more a boy participates in sport, the greater the benefit we will gain from his time at the school.

Traditional sporting exchanges with Tauranga Boys High School, Christchurch Boys High School and Hamilton Boys High School are all crucial in our drive to extend our students to achieve at the very highest level.

In keeping with the commitment to excellence, Westlake teams continue to travel abroad and play against the best overseas teams. Cricket, Rugby, Hockey, Basketball and Athletics teams have all travelled overseas in the last two years. Plans are well underway for further tours in the next two years.

We have over 31 different sports in which students can represent the school. Our major traditional codes all have a Teacher in Charge to oversee that sport. We also have a full time Director of Sport who ensures the smooth running of all sports at the school.

Our students have won national titles in many sports, including Basketball, Badminton, Cross Country, Football, Hockey, Rowing, Squash, Sailing, Volleyball and Water Polo. At regional level Westlake has been the dominant school in Auckland Secondary Schools Cross Country, Basketball, Hockey, Orienteering, Golf, Cycling, Volleyball and Tennis over the last three years.

There have in addition, been a number of individuals who have recently represented New Zealand at age group levels in the following sports: Fraser Wickes (Athletics), Robert Loe (Basketball), Craig Cachopa (Cricket), Henry Tam (Badminton), Joseph Bartholomew (Hockey), Chris Smith (Rugby), Taylor Gunman (Cycling), Tommy Smith (Football), Chris Steele (Sailing), Adrian Franklin (Water Polo), Dan Davies (Tennis) and Jordan Stanley (Rowing). In 2010 five Westlake Boys High School rowers were selected for New Zealand to compete in the World Junior Championships, while in 2011 three boys were selected for New Zealand Under 19 Volleyball.

The Sports Institute

To support our students in achieving their academic and sporting goals, Westlake has developed through its Sports Institute a Gifted and Talented programme. Students in our Form 3 and Form 4 programmes benefit from high quality coaching and rigorous physical training. The purpose of the Sports Institute is to achieve high performance from elite sportsmen within their specialised sport. In 2012 the Sports Institute programme will be extended to Form 5. A separate application form must be completed for our Sports Institute programmes. This course is designed specifically for students not in the A or B bands in Form 4. They normally would have been in the F4 SPI programme.

The Sports Institute offers talented young sportsmen quality coaching in five sports in Form 3, and eight sports in Form 4: Basketball, Cricket, Distance Running, Hockey, Football, Rowing, Rugby and Volleyball. All students within this programme must maintain excellent levels of attendance and sustain strong academic performance. The Director of Sport monitors closely all students' academic records and boys are expected to maintain excellent effort grades to remain in the Sports Institute programme. Students selected for this programme are expected to represent Westlake Boys High School in their chosen sport at the highest level possible while enrolled at the school.

Westlake Boys High School encourages those Intermediate school students (both in and out of zone), who wish to excel in their chosen sport, to apply for our Gifted and Talented Sports Institute programme. Please note that any out-of-zone student is subject to the same ballot procedures as all other applicants to the school.

Our Sports Institute application form can be collected from the school prior to the enrolment interview. Further enquires should be made to Mr Rob Taylor, Director of Sport.





Student Pastoral Care
