VANDERBILT-FLORIDA SERIES

The Gators have dominated recent games in a series that dates to World War II.

Though the schools were charter members of the SEC in 1933, the teams didn't meet until 1945. Vanderbilt won the first three games, and five of the first seven contests. Florida has taken the last 12 meetings. The

teams have played annually since 1992 when both were designated for the SEC's Eastern Division.

FIRST-YEAR HEAD COACHES TO SQUARE OFF SATURDAY

The Florida-Vanderbilt game pits Bobby Johnson against Ron Zook, and provides the only opportunity this season in the Southeastern Conference for an encounter between first-year head coaches.

Johnson has faced two other first-year coaches this year, Chan Gailey at Georgia Tech and Bobby Lamb at Furman. He is 1-1, losing to Georgia Tech and beating the team he guided before joining Vanderbilt, Furman.

Johnson has coached against Florida twice, dropping games as a Furman assistant in 1990 and 1981. Furman went on to win conference titles in both seasons.

Twenty-five seniors on the Vanderbilt football team will be honored Saturday during ceremonies scheduled prior to the Florida kickoff.

Scheduled to participate in the ceremonies are FB **Mike Adam**, DT **Brett Beard**, center **Jamie Byrum**, FB **Bara Cola**, WR **Ryan Cuffee**, PK **Chuck Folino**, WR **M.J. Garrett**, safety **Justin Giboney**, PK **Greg Gulinson**, LB **Hunter Hillenmeyer**, WR **Markessus House**, CB **Rushen Jones**, DE **Chuck Losey**, safety **Mike Martin**, holder **Howdy MacPherson**, CB **Aaron McWhorter**, FB **Juan Rojas**, safety **Jonathan Shaub**, TE **Tom Simone**, WR **Dan Stricker**, LB **Brandon Walthour** and OG **Jim May**. Three non-active players - **Wes Gunter**, **Chris Mitacek** and **Jason Tant** - also will take part in the ceremonies.

COMMODORE HIGHLIGHTS ENTERING FLORIDA GAME

★ Vanderbilt's defensive unit against Alabama featured five freshmen starters - CB **Dominique Morris**, LBs **Herdley Harrison** and **Marty Morgan**, DE **Jovan Haye** and DT **Ralph McKenzie**. Four of Vanderbilt's top defensive reserves - LB **Moses Osemwegie**, DE **Antoine Morgan**, CB **Cheron Thompson** and safety **Andrew Pace** - also are playing as freshmen.

On offense, the Commodores started three freshmen - QB **Jay Cutler**, TB **Kwane Doster** and RG **Mac Pyle**.

Two key special teamers - P/K **Greg Johnson** and PR **Grant Brigham** - also are first-year players.

★ The Commodores remain the SEC's least penalized team, getting flagged for 48.9 yards per game.

★ Vanderbilt has 1,690 rushing yards, good for fifth best in the SEC and 35th in the NCAA.

The rushing total is Vanderbilt's highest since 1994, when the Commodores piled up 2,494 yards on the ground enroute to a 5-6 season.

The Commodores are averaging 334

yards in total offense. The average is an improvement over nine of the last 10 years.

STRICKER TIES VU TOUCHDOWN MARK AGAINST ALABAMA

Senior All-SEC candidate **Dan Stricker** had just one reception against Alabama, but it was enough for a share of another Vanderbilt record.

Stricker, after going without a catch for the first three quarters, hauled in a 10-yard touchdown from Jay Cutler with 5:43 remaining. It was the 20th TD reception of Stricker's career, matching the school record previously held by **Chuck Scott**. (1981-84).

THE LAST VY-FLORIDA MEETING VANDERBILT 13, FLORIDA 71

NOV. 3, 2002, BEN HILL GRIFFIN STADIUM

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - The Florida Gators showed its abundance of talent before a soldout homecoming crowd, opening a quick 24-0 lead and extending it throughout the game. Any thoughts of a Vanderbilt victory were dashed early as the Gators marched to a six-play touchdown on the opening drive. By halftime, the Commodores were down 37-0. Vanderbilt backup quarterback Benji Walker engineered two fourth quarter scoring drives for the Commodores. He finished with 33 yards rushing and two touchdown runs while reserve tailback Norval McKenzie contributed 37 yards rushing. The 'Dores were hurt by five turnovers and two blocked punts.

INDIVIDUAL SUPERLATIVES

ENTERING FLORIDA GAME

Freshman TB **Kwane Doster** needs just 30 yards rushing to become the all-time leading Vanderbilt freshman running back.

Doster rushed for 33 yards on 15 carries, giving him 615 yards on the season. The effort was enough to move ahead of Rodney Williams, who rushed for 608 yards in 1998. The school record of 644 rushing yards by a freshman was set by Carl Woods in 1983.

Doster also established another career high when he went 44 yards with a screen pass from Jay Cutler during the fourth quarter. His previous long reception was 11 yards.

Doster, a Tampa native, continues to be the freshman rushing leader in the SEC, ranking eighth overall with 68.3-yard average.

He is third in the SEC in all-purpose yardage (146.9 per game) and third in kickoff returns (25.7-yard average).

★ Senior middle linebacker **Hunter Hillenmeyer** posted another superb defensive effort against Alabama.

The All-SEC candidate had 10 primary tackles and five assists in the loss. He also contributed an 11-yard sack and three quarterback hurries.

Hillenmeyer has been remarkably productive this season, posting at least 10 total tackles in every game. He leads the SEC in total tackles (124) and primary stops (85).

★ Punter/kicker **Greg Johnson** continues to solidify his candidacy for freshman All-American honors.

The Georgia native averaged 43.4 yards on eight punts against Alabama, including a 70-yard effort in the second half. The booming punt was a personal high for Johnson, eclipsing his previous best of 65 yards earlier in the year. It also ties as the longest punt this season in the SEC.

Through nine games, Johnson is fifth in the NCAA with a 43.9-yard average. He is also seven of 11 in field goal attempts and has converted all 22 extra point attempts.

★ Freshman QB **Jay Cutler** needs 319 yards passing during the last three games to break the team record for passing yards by a freshman quarterback.

The existing record, 1,483 yards, was set in 1985 by John Gromos.

★ Safety **Justin Giboney** played one of the finest games of his Commodore career against Alabama, contributing 13 total tackles and a defended ball.

Giboney is second on the team with 100 total tackles and is on a streak of four consecutive games with at least 10 tackles.

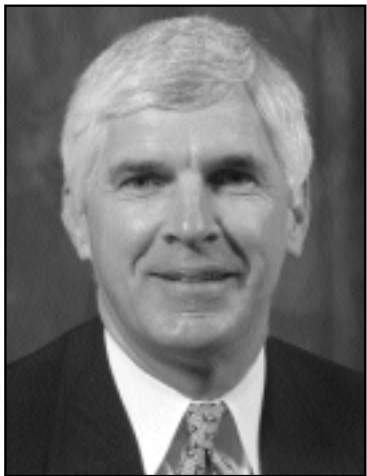
