TIDES CANADA FOUNDATION is pleased to celebrate 2001 as our first complete operational year!

We are Canada's first national public foundation focused on the environment and social justice. Our founding was propelled by both challenges and opportunities.

The challenges are the major social and environmental trends that hang over the 21st century: the growing social dislocation in our communities and the thinning web of life, seen through declining biodiversity and ecological distress.

The opportunities reflect the growing worldwide influence of informed citizen initiatives to build solutions and pathways toward social and environmental sustainability.

Through our innovative services, it is our privilege to partner with concerned and farsighted donors to support entrepreneurial charities providing leadership in the move towards progressive social change.

Some highlights from our start-up include:

- Partnerships with 24 founding donors who have supported 119 grants, totaling over \$1.5 million, to 70 charities across Canada
- Collaborating with collegial organizations such as the Canadian Women's Foundation and members of the Canadian Environmental Grantmakers Network (CEGN)
- Establishing our national office in Vancouver and a satellite office in Toronto
- Joining the Canadian Centre for Philanthropy and adhering to its Code of Ethics.

The success of our first year confirms our vision that social and environmental values play a vital role in the impact and growth of strategic philanthropy across Canada. This is reinforced by the fact that contributions to donor advised funds for the first half of 2002 greatly exceed all of 2001.

We thank all those who have helped us in start up, by offering advice or by recommending us to their colleagues, family and friends. We are especially grateful to our founding donors and contributors, most importantly Carol Newell whose vision of a better

world made it all possible.

NOTE TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS/YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2001

I. OPERATING MANDATE

The Tides Canada Foundation (the "Foundation") is a registered non-profit society and is non-taxable under the federal Income Tax Act. It changed its status from corporation to society on February 22,1999 and changed its fiscal year end from April 30 to December 31 in 2000. The year ended December 31, 2001 is the first full year of staffed operations for the Foundation. The Foundation receives funds through grants and donations from individuals, foundations, and corporations. Distribution of funds for philanthropic purposes is made primarily through the direct operation of a grantmaking program. The mission of the Foundation is to create partnerships with donors and charitable organizations to grow and organize resources for social change and environmental sustainability. The Foundation wishes to facilitate innovative and effective grantmaking programs, foster opportunities for learning, and build a donor community.
