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## Summary of Surrey-White Rock By-Election

### Reason for By-Election

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On May 2, 1997, Liberal Wilf Hurd resigned as MLA for the Surrey-White Rock electoral district to become a candidate in the federal election which was called on April 27, 1997. The by-election was held to fill the resulting vacancy in the Legislative Assembly.

### The Electoral Event

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This by-election was the first by-election conducted under the *Election Act* which was brought into force September 1, 1995.

On August 18, 1997, pursuant to Order in Council 984, a Writ of Election was issued by the Chief Electoral Officer to Lorraine Livesey, the District Electoral Officer for the Surrey-White Rock electoral district. The Writ ordered that an election be held on September 15, 1997.

At the commencement of the by-election, temporary voter registration centres were set up in the electoral district at four locations with high pedestrian traffic. The centres were open from August 19, 1997 (Day 1) up to and including August 25, 1997 (Day 7).

Under section 41 of the *Election Act*, voter registration and updating was available at all voting opportunities for qualified individuals who were not registered or who were no longer registered at the correct address.

There were 1,149 voter registration transactions completed at the time of voting, resulting in 651 new registrations and 498 updates to the Voters List for the Surrey-White Rock electoral district.

Nominations filed under section 56 of the *Election Act* were accepted by the District Electoral Officer from 9:00 a.m. Monday, August 25 until 1:00 p.m. on Tuesday, September 2, 1997. At the close of nominations, six candidates had filed with the District Electoral Officer. All six candidates were endorsed by registered political parties.

No standing nominations were filed with the Chief Electoral Officer under section 57 of the *Election Act*.

Alternative Absentee Voting commenced in the office of the District Electoral Officer on Tuesday, August 19, 1997.

The four consecutive days of Advance Voting began September 10, 1997, and 1,677 voters cast ballots during the Advance Voting period.

General Voting Day was Monday, September 15, 1997, and voting places were open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. At the election, 20,322 voters, or 48.4% of registered voters turned out to vote.

## Final Count

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Section 128 of the *Election Act* requires a 12-day delay before commencing Final Count unless an earlier time is authorized by the Chief Electoral Officer. At a by-election, however, the period of delay is the time required to prepare for Final Count. As there were no coincidental by-elections, there was no Absentee Voting outside the electoral district, and consequently, no need to wait for ballots from other electoral districts. The Chief Electoral Officer, authorized the District Electoral Officer to begin Final Count on September 19, 1997, and the count was concluded that day.

## Official Results

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At the conclusion of the Final Count on Friday, September 19, 1997, Gordon Hogg, the candidate endorsed by the Liberal Party of British Columbia, was declared elected as the Member to represent the Surrey-White Rock electoral district in the Legislative Assembly. On Monday, September 29, 1997, the District Electoral Officer returned the Writ of Election to the Chief Electoral Officer, and on that date the Chief Electoral Officer delivered a certified report to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly confirming the election of Mr. Hogg.

## **Sponsorship of Election Advertising by Registered Political Parties**

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The following issue is presented for the consideration of the Legislative Assembly.

During the Surrey-White Rock by-election, an issue arose around the legislated provisions regarding expenditures by a registered political party during a by-election.

Section 230 of the *Election Act* prohibits indirect sponsorship of election advertising. When a registered political party spends on behalf of its candidate, these expenditures are required to be reported as expenditures by the candidate and included in the candidate's expense limit.

When a registered political party advertises during a by-election, it is difficult to differentiate between a message in support of the party, and a message in support of its candidate. At a single by-election, the party is fielding only one candidate. Therefore when the registered political party spends to promote itself, is not the party indirectly promoting its sole candidate?

Should some legislated accommodation be provided to ensure that expenditures by a registered political party to promote itself in a by-election are clearly not considered to be indirectly supporting its candidate, and therefore not considered to be an expense against the candidate's spending limit?

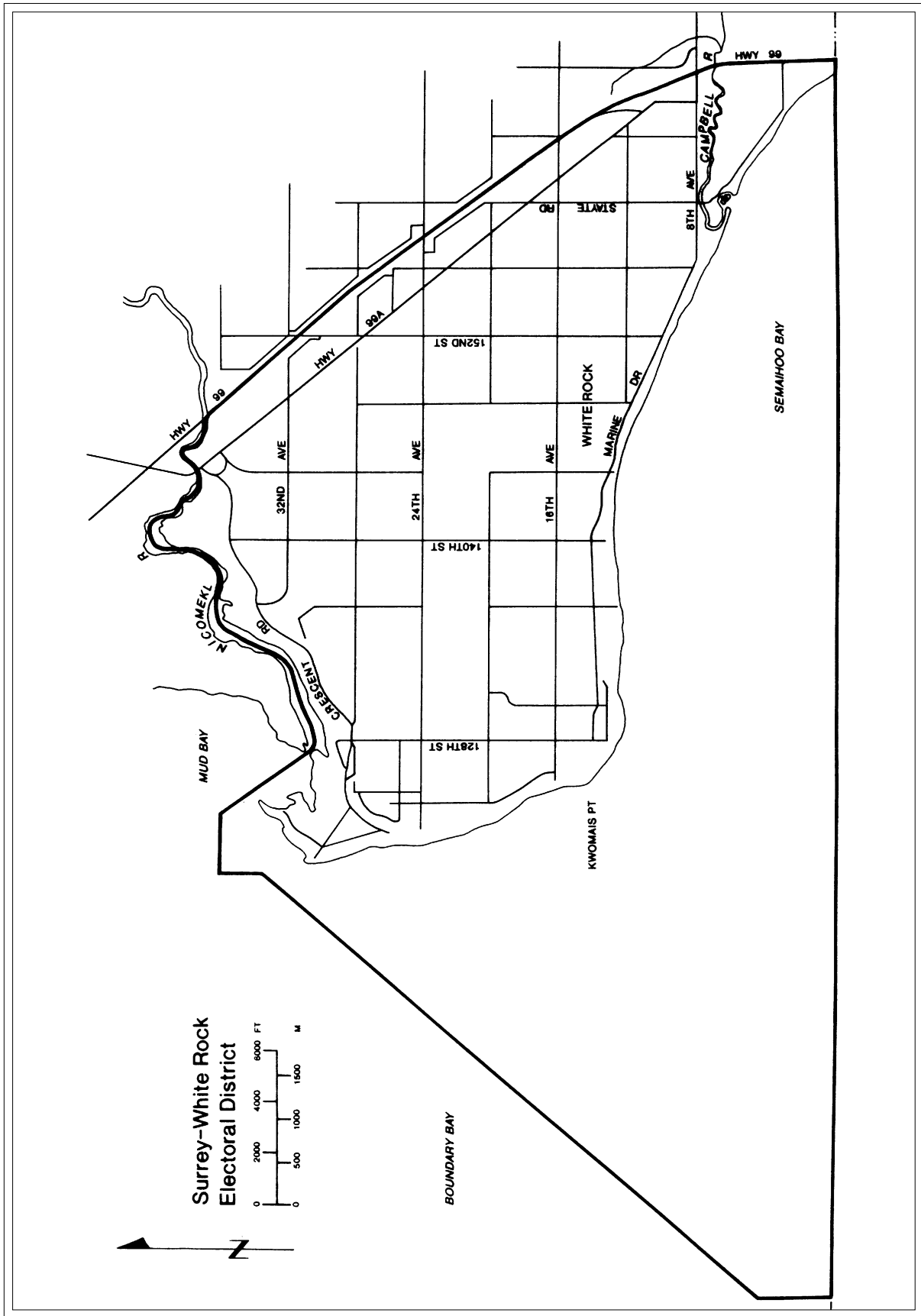
