Much of the colour and creativity displayed on Fremantle's streets is also strongly reflected in the arts and crafts on offer in the port - many made by traditional methods.

Festivals

Being home to so many cultures makes Fremantle the perfect 'stage' for a great many colourful and entertaining festivals and celebrations. Often the streets are a blaze of colour as different ethnic groups commemorate their traditions with parades and parties. An example is the annual Blessing of the Fleet festival which sees Mediterranean cultures and their extended families coming together to bless the fishing boats and crews as the lobster season opens.

Maritime

Visitors to Fremantle can view a real commercial port and a busy traditional fishing boat harbour in action and then enjoy fresh Western Australian seafood in one of the many surrounding restaurants. Once the home of the America's Cup, Fremantle has since gained an international reputation for building replicas of heritage vessels. The Batavia exhibit in the Maritime Museum is one of the top maritime archaeological exhibits in the world.

Heritage

Fremantle has the largest collection of heritage-listed buildings in Western Australia including the State's oldest public building, the Round House. The city has been recognised by experts as the world's best preserved example of a 19th century port streetscape.

Hundreds of beautiful old heritage buildings line the streets of Fremantle, many of them renovated as restaurants, museums, shops, hotels, offices and a university campus. These buildings as well as the convict built prison and original residential houses contribute to Fremantle's special
