Part of Speech adjective

Definition 1 having spotted colors, colorful patterns (usually on cotton

cloth)

Word Used in Context

Her ragged dress had once been rose-colored *calico* but was now gray.

She boiled eggs and painted faces on them and made little calico bonnets for

them.

The *calico* cat with the orange spots led me out of the yard and down the street.

GENTEEL Pronunciation jen-teel

Part of Speech adjective

Definition 1 extremely polite and careful in your behavior

Word Used in Context

She always loved visiting her Uncle Jeff in Georgia and enjoyed his *genteel*

Southern charm.

Few visitors failed to comment on the *genteel* and friendly cheerfulness of the

place.

I had put such behavior as always using the correct silverware down to their years of *genteel* breeding.

Definition 1 to pierce or wound with something pointed (as a horn or

knife)

Word Used in Context

The mountain goats try to *gore* the wolves with their horns.

The javelina was just about to *gore* the little roadrunner with its sharp tusks when

the roadrunner woke up.

Its heavy head is already there in the stone, lowered and ready to *gore* the other

rhinoceros.

* HEIFER Pronunciation hef-ur

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a young cow that has not had a calf

Word Used in Context

The young *heifer* would graze in the grass with the older cows and their calves. There were the four pairs of oxen, two milk cows named Lillie and Blackie, and

our tame little *heifer*, Daisy.

The little *heifer* twisted her neck to look up at the farmer, and said, "moo."

* **IMMIGRANT** Pronunciation **im**-uh-gruhnt

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 someone who comes from abroad to live permanently in a

country

Word Used in Context

An *immigrant* is a person who comes to another country to settle.

"My name is Marika, and I am an immigrant from Hungary."

My friend Frederico is an *immigrant* from Ecuador who came to the United

States five years ago.

INFEST Pronunciation in-fehsst

Part of Speech transitive verb

Definition 1 to become full of animals, insects or pests

Word Used in Context

Fleas can carry tapeworm and can *infest* the dog's bedding, and eventually a

whole house.

The birds eat the flies that *infest* their backs.

Rats infest our storehouse of corn.

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a covering or layer of material designed to stop heat or

electricity from escaping

Word Used in Context

Insulation prevents heat from passing into or out of an area.

Inuit clothing is light but provides excellent *insulation* from the snow and cold air.

The element has a covering of *insulation* that keeps the electricity away from

the water but lets the heat pass through.

* **MEMOIR** Pronunciation mem-wor Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a narrative composed from personal experience

Word Used in Context

Laurie was writing a personal *memoir*, recounting her life experiences.

The former president was writing a memoir of his years in the White House, his

meetings with world leaders, and the accomplishments he made during

his presidency.

Cassandra was asked to write several facts she would include in a memoir

about her life.

* RATION Pronunciation rash-uhn

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 a limited amount or share, especially of food

Word Used in Context

The water *ration* was small, and we were always thirsty.

He had cared enough for me to insist on an extra *ration* when some officials

unexpectedly distributed food and I had not been there to demand my

share.

Each group got a *ration* of food and then went off to spend the night in barns.

* **REVIVAL** Pronunciation rih-vye-vuhl

Part of Speech noun

Definition 1 an often highly emotional evangelistic meeting or series of

meetings

Definition 2 renewed attention to or interest in something

Word Used in Context

There was a big *revival* at my Auntie Reed's church.

That morning, Brother Lyte had introduced the guest preacher from Knoxville,

reminding the congregation that it was time for the winter *revival*.

A *revival* of hope and courage possessed her after the depressing day.

Part of Speech adjective

Definition 1 occurring occasionally, singly, or in scattered instances

Word Used in Context

These three rivers all have irregular water flows because of **sporadic** rainfall. I tell my clients up front that my gift is **sporadic** and occasionally unreliable.

Only **sporadic** shortages of gasoline created any difficulty.

STREWN Pronunciation **stroon**

Part of Speech intransitive verb

Definition 1 to scatter, sprinkle, or throw here and there

Word Used in Context

The guitar lies sprawled across the couch, and sheet music is **strewn** about.

His library books were *strewn* about on the floor. Straw was brought in and *strewn* all over the floor.

* THRESH Pronunciation thresh

Part of Speech transitive verb

Definition 1 to separate the seed or grain from a cereal plant such as

wheat by beating

Word Used in Context

A farmer used a flail to *thresh* grains so that the chaff could be removed.

Father and the neighbors are working hard to *thresh* our grain. The next day neighboring farmers came to *thresh* the oats.


