FROM THE PRINCIPAL.....

Dear Parents, Friends and Students of St. Paul's,

Over recent weeks I have had occasion to look up some of the school's past records and old annuals, and no matter how many times I do this, I always find it fascinating, particularly in the changes that have occurred since 1959.

A few pieces of nostalgia and interesting facts to share with you

- The first group of students commenced on February 2, 1959. 218 students in 4 classes—Year 5, 6, 7 & 8 (today this number of Year 5-8 students accounts for almost 8 classes).
- John Barrey of Clearview was Registration #1 on the Student Registrar.
- The location was then named Strathmont (meaning Windy Hill).
- Of the 218 boys who were on-site on February 2, 1959, 96 were classed as "New Australians" - 46 from Britain, 16 from Holland. Others from Eastern European countries such as Latvia, Poland, Lithuania. Many had their address listed as the "Gepps Cross Hostel (near the current drive-in).
- The Brothers Community House records for 1959 show the following items:

School expenditure	7,000 pound
Groceries	511 pound
Servants	249 pound
Alcohol	6 pound

(the 1962 records show a nil entry for alcohol but 4 pound for tobacco—a change in vices?)

Congratulations to the students and staff involved in last Monday evening's Year 5 to 7 Information Night.



News from East Timor:

Our prayers go out to all students who are sitting exams at the present. I know this can be a stressful time for both students and parents. I offer you this news from East Timor, which I received this week to show you how amazingly tough exams are for some students.

The physical endurance of the villagers is quite amazing. There are so many instances of it. When we were organizing the young people to come to Dili to sit for the entrance exam for the Agricultural *College, we asked them to be at our house* in Railaco Craic ready to go to Dili early on the Friday morning. Three of the boys walked from Samalete and one walked from Railaco Leten. They arrived at our house at 6 am having walked for about 2 hours. We actually left Craic at 8 am and located the venue and the relevant person at 11 am. The plan was to go down on the Friday, as the exam was on the Saturday, but when we spoke to the supervisor he said the boys could do the exam there and then! With one thing and another, they actually commenced the exam at 12 noon. After the written exam they had an individual interview. The process was completed by about 3 pm. We knew the boys had not had lunch and hadn't had anything to drink all this time. What we didn't know was that they hadn't had any breakfast either! At no time did they complain, say they were tired or ask for anything to eat or drink! Needless to say, we treated them to a very late, but filling lunch. They then boarded a truck for the ride back to the mountains and the ensuing long return walk to their villages. No wonder we want them to get the opportunities they so richly deserve, and which our western youngsters take so much for granted!


