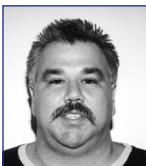

Roving Infield Coordinator

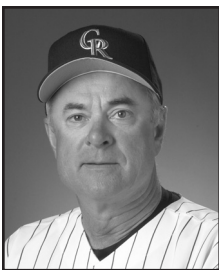
Mike Gallego enters his sixth year of coaching, his fifth with the Rockies organization...Gags served as Roving Infield Instructor in 2000-01 and began 2002 in that same capacity before joining Clint Hurdle's big league coaching staff on May 1, 2002...he returned to his minor league duties in 2003...Gallego worked as Boston's minor league infield instructor prior to joining Colorado in 1999...his 13-year major league career ended in spring training of 1998 after 1,111 games with Oakland, New York-AL and St. Louis...he owned a .239 lifetime average at the big league level with 42 homers and 282 RBI despite battling several injuries throughout his career...a valuable utility infielder, he played in three straight postseasons with Oakland (1988-90)...in 1993, he won the Good Guy award from the N.Y. Press Photographer's Association and the N.Y. Baseball Writers...was taken by Oakland in the second round of 1981 June draft after a stellar career at UCLA, one which got him elected into the school's Hall of Fame...Mike and his wife Caryn have twin sons, Nicholas and Joseph, and a daughter, Allison, and reside in Yorba Linda, Calif.



Jim Johnson

Roving Hitting Coordinator

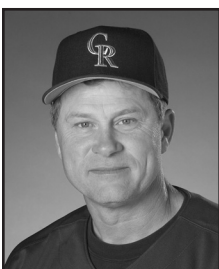
Jim Johnson begins his 31st season in professional baseball, his second as Colorado's Roving Hitting Coordinator...Johnson, 56, has managed and coached at nearly every level of the minor leagues, including 25 seasons with the Houston Astros...he joined the Rockies after managing the St. Paul Saints of the Independent Northern League in 2002...prior to that, Jim was a member of the Dodgers organization, working as the minor league field coordinator (2001), hitting instructor (2000) and manager of Class AA San Antonio (1999)...after an eight-year minor league playing career, Johnson began his coaching career in 1974 as a player/coach with the Astros' Southern League affiliate in Columbus, Ga...after three seasons, he retired from playing and was named manager of the club's Florida State League affiliate in 1977...was named Southern League Manager of the Year with Columbus in 1979 and then Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year with Tucson in 1980...assumed the role of Special Instructor of Sports Psychology for the Astros in 1986-87...from 1988-93, he was Houston's minor league field coordinator...then joined the Yankees organization in 1994 as their minor league defensive coordinator and hitting instructor for Tampa (A) of the Florida State League...worked with future All-Star Derek Jeter among others...in 1995, he managed at AA-Norwich and then on an interim basis for A-Greensboro in 1996...joined the Kansas City Royals for two seasons as minor league infield coordinator in 1997 and hitting instructor in 1998 before moving on to the Dodgers...the former infielder was an all-WAC performer for the University of New Mexico where he received his bachelor's degree in 1969...earned his masters from Arizona State in 1973...he and his wife, Joanne, have been married for 35 years and reside in Phoenix, Ariz...has two sons, Jace (29) and Josh (24)...Jace played in the Oakland, Boston, Kansas City and Arizona organizations.



Fred Kendall

Roving Catching Coordinator

Fred Kendall begins his second season as Colorado's Roving Catching Coordinator after spending the previous three years as the club's major league bullpen coach and catching instructor...the 2004 season marks his fifth in the Rockies organization, as he was hired on Buddy Bell's inaugural staff in 2000...from 1996 to 1998, Fred was Bell's bullpen coach with the Detroit Tigers...before his stint in Detroit, Kendall managed four seasons in the White Sox system...he guided Utica (1992) and Hickory (1994) to their respective postseasons...during that '94 season, Hickory went 46-17 after July 1 en route to the White Sox organization's best record...the former catcher spent 12 seasons in the majors with the Padres, Indians and Red Sox...Fred's best overall season came in 1973, when he earned San Diego's MVP honors from the local chapter of the baseball writers...in 1976, he led NL catchers in games (146) and only Johnny Bench (.997) finished with a higher fielding percentage than his .994 mark...for two seasons from 1975-76, he caught every game for San Diego ace Randy Jones, who won 42 games and a Cy Young Award during the period...after a brief tour in the American League, Kendall returned to San Diego to finish his career...he and his wife, Patricia, have three children: Michael, Jason and Kathy...Jason, the starting catcher for the Pittsburgh Pirates the last eight seasons and 1992 first-round draft pick, is a three-time all-star.



Jim Wright

Roving Pitching Coordinator

Jim Wright begins his eighth season in the Rockies organization, his second as Roving Pitching Coordinator...he was the club's major league pitching coach in 2002, where he helped guide Jason Jennings to the National League Rookie of the Year Award...Jim was AAA-Colorado Springs' pitching coach from 1999-2001 and tutored the pitchers at AA-New Haven in 1997 and '98...prior to that, he coached in the Phillies farm system from 1990-96, including part of the 1996 campaign as the major league pitching coach as a replacement for Johnny Podres who was ill...also made stops in Iowa, Pittsfield, Peoria and Quad Cities, where he got his start in coaching with the Cubs organization in 1984...the right-handed pitcher was drafted by Kansas City in the 1980 Rule V draft despite missing the 1979 season with an arm injury...made his big league debut with the Royals on April 22, 1981...went on to post a 2-3 record with a 3.46 ERA in 21 games (three starts) as a Royal that season...was up with the club again in 1982, pitching in seven games...spent his final year as a player in the Cubs system and retired after the 1983 season due to arm injuries...threw two minor league no-hitters, the first with Auburn in 1974 and the second in 1975 with Spartanburg...Jim and his wife, Pamela, and children, Jim, Coby, Megan, Ben and Emma, reside in Peoria, Ill.

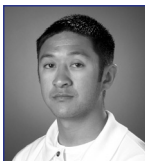

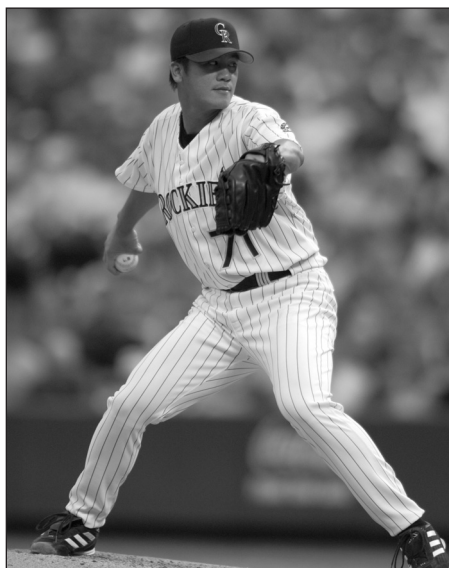

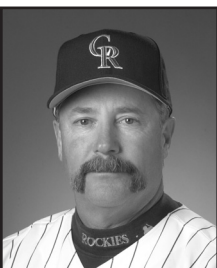


Marv Foley Manager

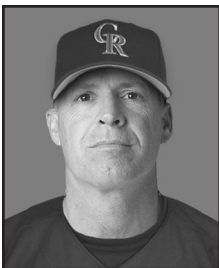

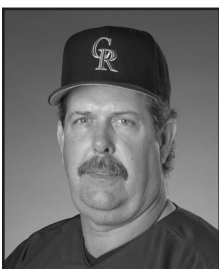
Tom Runnells

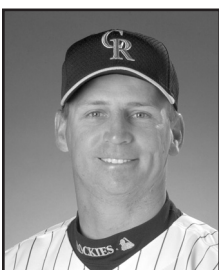

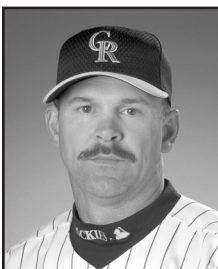

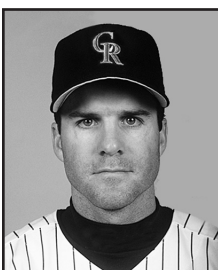
