#### <u>Methodology</u>

This Léger Marketing survey was conducted among **1203** Quebec respondents between March  $28^{th}$  and March  $31^{st}$  2003. The maximum margin of error for a sample of this size is  $\pm 3.0\%$ , 19 times out of 20. The sample size for the three daily questions is **301** Quebec respondents. Those interviews were conducted on March  $31^{st}$  2003 and the margin of error is  $\pm 5.6\%$ .

Using data from Statistics Canada, the results were weighted according to geographic location, gender and language spoken at home to ensure a representative sample of the entire Quebec adult. The distribution of the 13% of undecided voter was done in proportion to voting intentions.



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
# 1. Voting Intentions are Stable


