PEMAGATSHEL DZONGKHAG ROYAL GOVERNMENT OF BHUTAN

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1. Current Situation

Chongshing Borang Gewog has a total area of approximately 30.1 square kilometer with a sparsely distributed population in the nine villages of Thongsa, Mandi, Guyum, Lanangzore, Yomzore, Chongshing Borang, Chongshing Goenpa, Jorphung, and Kalishong. The gewog ranges from 100m to 3500m above sea level and enjoys a moderate climate. As the topography of the gewog is steep, settlements are scattered on steep slopes and landslides are very common particularly during monsoon season. Tseri and dryland cultivation dominate agriculture landuse with no wetland farming at all.

The gewog has one RNR centre, two ORCs, two community schools, two suspension bridges, about 56 km of mule tracks, and nine water supply schemes.

The diverse agro-ecological condition in the gewog provides potentials for growing cash crops such as ginger, cardamom, and orange and cereal crops such as mustard, millet, buckwheat and maize. The gewog's development potential is limited by lack of access road and market, lack of water source for irrigation, crop damage by wild animals, farm labour shortage, and post harvest losses.

Rural livelihood support program

Construction of irrigation canal

More than 15 households in Thongsa village have flat land that can be converted to wetland, for which facilitation it is proposed that an irrigation channel 0.8 km long be constructed.

Farm mechanization

To address farm labour shortages, farm machineries through government subsidy and rural credit facilities will be supplied to farmers based on their needs.

Strengthening of RNR center

The existing RNR center at Thongsa will be renovated and be connected to an independent water supply to develop demonstration plot at the center.

Plant protection program

Based on demand from the farmers, chemical fertilizers, pesticides and weedicides shall be made available to the farmers as and when required.

Nature conservation and environment protection program

Demonstration on sustainable use of natural resources and awareness workshop shall be conducted at Chongshing Borang, Jorphung and Guyum villages for 40 households.

Employment generation program

To create employment opportunities for school dropouts, it is proposed to establish agro-industry and auction yard at Denchi under Shumar gewog. Proposal for feasibility study has been submitted to Trade and Industry Ministry for the Ninth Plan.

The details of training for farmers, extension staff, and study tour are as follows:

Livestock program

Income generation

Three dairy backyard farms will be established and 500 pullets and 20 piglets given to farmers. Dzongkhag shall provide technical support and help acquire BDFC loan.

Breed improvement

Breed improvement program shall be carried out through AI provision, supply of improved breeding bulls and conservation of improved breeds.

Feed and fodder developmen

To ensure reliable and quality fodder for improved breeds, four acres of pastureland shall be developed and 3000 fodder seedlings supplied for plantation. Pasture demonstration shall be carried out in five acres for the benefit of 135 households of Mandi, Yomzore, Chongshing Borang, Kalishong, and Lanagzore.

Animal health services

Extension staff shall continue to provide regular animal health services and be helped by village animal health workers trained on basic animal health treatment.

Institutional and capacity development Program

Under this program, it is proposed to provide trainings to the farmers on backyard farm management and production and to organize livestock show cum exhibition.

Forestry Program

Income generation Program

Private forestry

Farmers shall be encouraged to establish private forestry through awareness campaign, workshops, and free supply of seedlings. During the Ninth Plan, Thongsa, Mandi and Yomzore villages are identified for private forestry development.

Private nursery

To ensure adequate supply of seedlings for establishment of private and community forestry, and to generate income, it is proposed to establish a private nursery. The required trainings in development of private nursery management shall be provided by the dzongkhag.

Nature conservation and environment protection program

Fire management and contro

To prevent natural resource depletion, 150 farmers will be trained on forest fire control methods. Fire-fighting equipment shall also be provided to fire prone areas.

Afforestation program

To protect and conserve watershed/catchments areas, afforestration shall be carried out in depleted and barren areas.

Institutional and capacity development program

Under this program, various farmers' training and study tours will be organized to expose farmers to new farm technologies.

Health Program

Renovation of two ORC

The existing ORC at Thongsa and Chongshing Borang shall be renovated and maintained on regular basis by the beneficiaries. Institutional latrine shall also be constructed in each ORC during the Ninth Plan.

Promotion of model village

The model village concept shall be promoted through the construction of model village at an appropriate location. Further, it wil be promoted through health program in the BHUs.

Construction and Rehabilitation of RWSS

It is proposed to construct two RWSS schemes at Thongsa and Mandi villages and rehabilitate two existing schemes at Jorphung and Chongshing Borang. The new schemes have a coverage of more than 49 households. Three spring source protection works shall also be carried out in Zungri, Mandi and Yomzore, which would cover about 17 households.

Education Program

The Chongshing Borang gewog has two community schools serving 258 households.

As shown in the table above, although the gewog has only two community schools, the education coverage is quite satisfactory, as it is covered from Dungme, Yurung and Tshebar lower secondary schools. The GPER for Chongshing Borang is estimated at 21% while the intake rate at Pre-Primary is 64%.

Strengthening of Thongsa community school

Thongsa Community School accommodates classes from PP-VI. Since the school does not have required facilities, it is proposed to construct staff quarter, reconstruct main academic building with eight classroom blocks, develop a play field, fencing of school compound, and renovation of the existing structures.

Strengthening of Chongshing Borang Community School

Chongshing Borang community school was established during the 8th FYP period and will expand struturally by construction of staff quarter, development of play field, and fencing of school compound during the Ninth Plan.

Road (Mule Track & Suspension bridges) Program

Improvement of mule track

The mule track improvement and maintenance works shall be carried out by the gewog on regular basis.

Rehabilitation of Suspension bridge

It is proposed to rehabilitate two suspension bridges at Chemrizam and upper Urizam. The dzongkhag engineering cell shall execute the work and the beneficiaries contribute labour.

Gewog Administration Program

Construction of Gup's Offic

Keeping in view the important role that the Gup has to play in the development of the gewog, it is proposed to construct a Gup's office with GYT hall during the Ninth Plan. The site for construction of the office is identified at Thongsa Ngangsingma.

Renovation of lhakhangs

Three community lhakhangs at Guyum, Chongshing Borang Goenpa and Yomzore are proposed for renovation during the Ninth Plan. The beneficiaries shall execute the work, while some support for purchase of CGI sheets, materials and payment for skilled labour are requested from the government.

5. Plan implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation

The GYT Chathrim 2002 delineates specific roles and responsibilities to all functionaries involved in development administration and management in the Gewog. It is, however, necessary to underscore essential processes that must be observed in executing the above roles and responsibilities. The financial powers and authority of the Gewog Administration for the implementation of the planned activities are also enshrined in the GYT Chathrim 2002.

Plan implementation

The Gup, GYT *Tshogpas* and the community as a whole will take on full accountability and ownership of gewog development activities. The clear delineation of implementation time frames, responsibilities and contributions from the community should be developed for the effective implementation of gewog activities.

Annual and Quarterly Plans

Based on the Five-Year Plan, the Gup will prepare Annual Plans and Budgets (AP&B) in consultation with the gewog sectoral staff and submit it to GYT. After the GYT discusses and approves the Draft AP&B, it will be put up for approval to the DYT. Once the DYT approves the AP&B, the GYT will develop a Quarterly Work Plan and Budget in consultation with the sectoral staffs and other functionaries in the gewog such as Mangmi, Chimi and Tshogpas.

The implementation of the Quarterly Work Plan will be the responsibility of the Gup and the Tshogpas with technical support from the staff of the concerned sectors. Based on the Quarterly Work Plan, the concerned sectoral staff responsible for the implementation of any planned activity will elaborate a detailed implementation plan and budget for approval and budget release by the Gup. Copy of this plan will be sent for information to the concerned sectoral heads and relevant agencies. Upon completion of the activity, the responsible person will submit a report to the Gup and the concerned sectoral heads and relevant agencies.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring

The GYT in the Gewog will be responsible for progress and performance monitoring of the planned activities. The GYT should convene monthly meetings with technical staff and other responsible persons for implementation to review the progress in the implementation of every activity and to take timely corrective actions when required. The Gewog will seek technical back-up services from the Dzongkhag Administration when necessary. Based on the received reports and monthly meetings the Gup will submit a quarterly report to the Dzongkhag administration. Technical reports from the different sectors will be attached to the Gup's quarterly report. The Gup will verify the travel claims of all sectoral personnel in the gewog so that the performance of the Gewog staff can be monitored.

Evaluation

To assess the impact and benefit of development programs and projects in the Gewogs, the Government will launch periodic evaluation missions in coordination with the Dzongkhag Administration.
