**Summary of Legislation:** This bill designates portions of U.S. 6, State Road 9, and U.S. 30 as extra heavy duty highways.

Effective Date: Upon passage.

Explanation of State Expenditures: For the Department of Transportation (INDOT), there will be additional expenditures involved if any portions of the newly designated extra heavy duty highways and/or bridges do not meet specifications to be so designated. The expenditure level involved will depend upon the work to be done and available resources.

Background Information: There are several areas considered when looking at the capability for a road to carry extra weight on a consistent basis: geometrics / meeting the design criteria for the size/weight, life of the pavement, structure and life of each bridge, axle configurations/limitations, gross weight limitations and most importantly addressing any safety concerns.
