

Spanish Air Force P-3B Modernisation

The programme began in December 2000 with the signing of the modernisation contract.

he FITS integrates, controls and presents all the information provided by the complex equipment selected by the Spanish Air Force. This equipment includes: a search radar, FLIR, ESM, acoustic subsystem and datalink, among others.

During the preliminary and critical reviews, held respectively in October 2001 and February 2002, all the relevant aspects of the design of the new mission system were studied in detail.

The P-3 enters the shop

The time has come for the new system design to be implemented. This will take place with the arrival of the



first P-3 aircraft at the EADS CASA facilities in Getafe (Madrid).

The Prototype Shop will carry out the modifications and assemble the mission system into the first of these aircraft.

Delivery calendar

Likewise, all of the functional and acceptance tests will be carried out on the new weapon system at the Getafe facilities. It is planned for the first modified airplane to be delivered to the Spanish Air Force in September 2003.

The C-295 MSA/MPA in Portugal


he C-295 aircraft visited Montijo Air Base No. 6, where Squadron 601 of the Portuguese Air Force is located and operates six P-3P Orion aircraft.

The crews of these aircraft had the opportunity to become familiar with and successfully evaluate the operation and characteristics of the CASA FITS system and of carrying out a standard patrol mission over the Atlantic.

The flight carried out with personnel of the Portuguese Air Force was a unique opportunity to share experiences and to present the characteristics of the new mission tactical systems that will update the veteran anti-submarine aircraft, which, as is the Portuguese case, will undergo a modernisation and upgrade process.

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Modernisation of P-3 Orion

The Brazilian Air Force is immersed in the selection process to modernise eight P-3 A Orion aircraft that will allow them to recover their anti-submarine activity that they had to abandon in 1995 when they decommissioned the P-16 (S-2) aircraft that carried out these types of missions.

he P-3 A recently acquired will be modernised though a process that covers different areas: the replacement of mission sensors with modern equipment and the installation of a tactical system that integrates these sensors and the aircraft navigation and communication equipment. In this way the anti-submarine operation effectiveness will be increased.

Besides the modernisation of the mission system, a complete structural and systems revitalisation of the aircraft will be carried out, enabling the aircraft to fly for another 20 years.

EADS CASA with its experience in this field is involved in the main programmes for modernisation of mission systems and P-3 Orion aircraft.
