#### ZONE LEADER VACANCY

olks, here's your chance to help serve your community! Aranda-Cook (Area No 98) Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) was formed in April 1986 when the police divided the Area into 37 zones. One of these zones - No 33 - comprises 25 homes including all premises in Ambara Place plus even numbered homes 12 to 26 Barada Crescent, and odd numbered homes 37 to 43 Mirning Crescent.



Over the past 18 years, Zone 33 has been represented by three successive zone leaders. They were Peter Mc L. from 1986 to 1990, Frank C. from 1991 to 2000, and Tom H. from 2001. After 12 years of service to Neighbourhood Watch, Tom is now retiring and we thank him for all the good work he has done. This leaves an opportunity for someone who lives in the zone to step forward as a volunteer zone leader. # STREET NAMES

n February, Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) passed a seven-page submission to the ACT Place Names Office enclosing 22 proposals (from 10 contributors) for the naming of two streets leading to the Aranda District Playing Fields. The Place Names Officer was very impressed with the submission. A panel from NHW that included a resident linguist recommended 'Arrernte Place' and 'Bardi Place', but all 22 proposals will be assessed by the Place Names Committee. We will keep you informed of progress. In the meantime I would like to thank all those residents who entered suggestions. The Place Names Officer indicated that proposals not adopted in Aranda might be considered for use elsewhere in Canberra.

#### METER REPLACEMENTS

During late February and early March, Fieldforce Services Pty Ltd, on behalf of ActewAGL will be replacing 300 ageing water meters and stopcocks at premises across Aranda. Affected residents should have already received letters. Fieldforce will leave a card in your letterbox a couple of days before work commences. # CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY

This year we have coincided our Adopt-a-Road clean up of Bindubi Street with Clean Up Australia Day on Sunday 7 March.

Owing to lack of public liability insurance cover we have been unable to clean Bindubi Street since July last year, but on Clean Up Australia Day insurance cover is being provided by AON.

On 7 March, residents have a choice of clearing litter from two main roads. Friends of Aranda Bushland will be tidying up Caswell Drive (please contact David Kelly on 6253 1859 for details), and Neighbourhood Watch will clean up Bindubi Street (please contact Jens von Brasch on 6251 3056 to express your interest).

All members of the community over 10 years of age are invited to participate.

The Bindubi Street clean up will start promptly at **9.00am** at the Aranda Playing Fields carpark at the Belconnen Way end of Bindubi Street (opposite Canberra High School). After a safety briefing, participants will be divided into three parties and proceed south along Bindubi Street to William Hovell Drive. The task should be completed by just after 11.00am when the group walks back up Bindubi Street to return equipment, and have a photograph taken at the Bandjalong Crescent traffic lights. Wests Rugby Club has agreed to stage a free barbeque lunch at noon for participants and their guests. (Thank you Wests!)

#### ARABA COMMUNITY FIRE UNIT

L ast year 25 residents from Araba Street and Araba Place in Aranda were trained by the ACT Fire Brigade to become one of the first Community Fire Unit (CFU) teams in Canberra. In January 2004 the team became operational when members were issued with personal protective clothing and a trailer equipped with fire fighting gear. While Canberra was experiencing total fire ban days this month, there was extensive email traffic within the Araba CFU as they prepared to test hydrants, draw up plans for practice sessions, and draft fire safety checklists for delivery to local residents. They are taking their role seriously and developing a high level of community spirit and cooperation.

# HISTORY PROJECT TAKING SHAPE

Our project to research, record and display the history of Aranda, Cook and Macquarie is progressing quite well. Surprisingly we received no response to our December appeal for 8mm home movie footage, but Carol of Banambila Street has provided us with two interesting 35mm colour slides taken of the 1968 snowfall in Banambila Street, and stormwater flowing by the intersection of Nungara Street and Bandjalong Crescent in 1969. We also received photographs of snowfalls on 19 July 1982, 12 October 1987, 6 July 1990 and 28 May 2000.

We are in the process of scanning photographs, slides and newspaper clippings, and have purchased 20 display books to retain historical information. Our suburban history will be captured as entries under the headings: 'Organisations', 'Events' and 'Personalities'.

Over the past two months, the project team has made contact with Wests Rugby Club, Big Splash Waterpark, long term staff of the Aranda nursing home (now Amity), present and past owners of the Jamison Centre, the Jamison Inn, Lighthouse Christian Fellowship and Belconnen Community Council.

# BUSHFIRE PROTECTION

n December the ACT Government endorsed a report by fire management consultant (and former ACT Chief Fire Officer and Director of ACT Forests) Roger Fenwick. The Fenwick Report outlined measures to minimise the fire risk to Black Mountain and Aranda. Some residents raised concern about aspects of the Report and the effectiveness of its recommendations. By letters, calls and emails to the Chief Minister as well as liaison with Government agencies, two meetings were arranged in late January and early February to allow for community consultation.

Representatives of four groups: Friends of the Aranda Bushland, Aranda-Cook Neighbourhood Watch, Aranda Residents Group and the Araba Community Fire Unit went on a walking inspection of affected areas to clarify the work that will be undertaken by Environment ACT and Canberra Urban Parks and Places. The meetings were useful and helped allay many concerns. Hazard reduction measures should be completed over the next few weeks and not involve excessive loss of natural vegetation. In the meantime, residents are encouraged to inspect their own properties and implement fire-safe housekeeping practices. A checklist has been prepared by the Araba CFU and may be obtained from team leader Mark Thomson on 6253 1486.
