

IOWA HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL ALL TIME BEST LIST

In 2001 the IHSAA constructed the first all-time best baseball list from records, newspaper stories and school reports. Some of those performances qualified for inclusion in the National High School Record Book printed by the National Federation of State High School Associations. While the IHSAA recognizes performances accomplished in the summer after a student's eighth grade year, the NFHS recognizes only performances accomplished **after** a student enters ninth grade.

Obviously, the game has changed through the years with technology of equipment, playing surfaces, playing rules, rules concerning the use of a pitchers and the number of games that constitutes a season. There is no definitive way to factor those things from performances. We do acknowledge that there have been many great players and teams that you will find on these lists. Nonetheless they were a significant part of Iowa prep baseball history and in a real sense why this list was generated.

Following are the "best on record" performances we have been able to identify. (The vast percentage of those listed was summer performances.) **The following list is a work in progress and it is not complete!** We will continue to accept verified information of performances previously not submitted. Not all coaches report performances that meet the standards that have been established. We urge each school and community statistician to review your records and send us the performance(s) so that students can be officially recognized.

Performances must have been achieved in a high school game sanctioned by the IHSAA. Additions, corrections can be sent to: Iowa High School Athletic Association; c/o Bud Legg; PO Box 10; Boone, Iowa 50036-0010. My appreciation is extended to those who sent corrected spellings.

Iowa was the first state to have an athletic association sponsored Summer State Baseball Tournament, inaugurating the program in 1946. Those summer marks are the basis for this list, although we have listed some career performances that include, with notation, spring or fall seasons. High school students have played baseball in Iowa for literally over 100 years. The IHSAA administered a Spring State Tournament which ran from 1928 through 1972 and also a Fall State Tournament, 1939 through 1985. Iowa State College sponsored a spring invitational "state tournament" from 1924-27 that attracted usually 40 or more high schools.

A synopsis of the Summer State Tournaments and the championships scores of the fall and spring championships is included in the State Tournament Stat Book, which the IHSAA updates annually and places on our website (www.iahhsaa.org).
