This district has three big valleys: Shibi dara (12 small villages which is the most populated valley), Masken dara (15 villages), Allah Saiy dara(21 villages).</p> <p>The district office is lactated in Allah Saiy village but the building is destroyed. People are speaking in differed languages like Dari, Pashtoo and Pashaee. District has no office; the officials use the school building as an office.</p>
