The district is located 95 Km (4 hours drive) to the North of Lashkar Gah district. To the North of the district is Kajaki district, to the South is Grishik district, to the East is Kandahar province and to the West is Musa Qala district. The district is divided into 5 sectors (Bostanzai, Nasuzai, Katozai, Malmond and Sangin). Each sector has 96 villages. Sangin is the main bazaar of the district. Offices of the authorities are in Sangin bazaar.

The temperature in summer is 47°C and 5°C in winter.

The head of the district is a former member of Jamiat party, and was appointed following the fall of Taliban

Security of the district is not stable, and there are cases of theft, looting and robbery in the district.

Gaul Mohammad (Head of the district) takes money from shopkeepers and businessmen in Sangin by force. He is backed by his brother (Amir Dado), who is the chief of intelligence for Helmand province. Gul Mohammadd and the head of police department have their own forces, which has created a lot of problems of insecurity in the district.
