	Availability of Potable water (%):	35%	
	Sanitation and Drainage:	Very poor.	
	Comments: Pool water is mainly used, but it needs chlorination (chloride powder). Villages from Khasm up to Ghotorei Jabe don't have water and there is need to have deep and half deep wells.		
AGRICULTURE:	Main crops:	Wheat, barley, millet, rice and corn.	
	Current Land Condition:	70% rain fed and 30% irrigated land.	
	Existing Irrigation schemes:	Rivers, rain and streams.	
	Agri/tool Banks:	Very poor, they use oxen.	
	Animal Husbandry	Sheep, cows and camels, but in very small numbers.	
	Comments: There is a need for fertilisers, machinery/equipment for land cultivation, good cultivation systems and a veterinary clinic.
