### NATIONAL FLAGS AND JAMBOREE FLAGS

Every National Contingent Leaders are requested to bring two National Scout Organization Flags with them.

The standard size of the flags are;

- (1) 120cm × 180cm for flag pole hoisting
- (2) 90cm × 120cm for Parading

Regarding the national and Jamboree flags to be hoisted at the Jamboree, our National Council and its Jamboree Committee have decided as the followings to solicit the overseas contingents to co-operate with the host organization to welcome the Scouts from all member organizations of WOSM.

- (1) Only 5 flags, i.e. Japanese National Flag of host organisation, World Scout Flag, A-P Regional Flag, Scout Association of Japan Flag and 23rd APR/13th Nippon Jamboree Flag, will be hoisted during the opening and closing ceremonies.
- (2) NSO flags will be used when the representative Scouts of overseas contingents parade in the stadium during the opening and closing ceremonies, and no national flags will be used.
- (3) No national flags will be hoisted throughout the term of the Jamboree at stadium and arena. All participating NSO flags will be hoisted at the event plaza.
- (4) Only Japanese National Flag and Jamboree Flag are allowed to be hoisted at all Sub-Camp Headquarters areas.
- (5) Each Jamboree Troop will not be allowed to hoist their national flags at the campsite nor in the Sub-Camp.

### **ORGANIZATION**

The standard size of a Jamboree Troop is 32 Scouts and 8 leaders, 40 members in total. There are 9 Sub-Camps (SC's) in the Jamboree, each of which is operated under the responsibility of a Region of the Scout Association of Japan, with 47 Jamboree Troops, 2 Venture Scout Service Corps and Sub-Camp Headquarters (SHQ).

The Japanese Standard Troop consists of 1 Troop Leader, 2 Assistant Troop Leaders, 2 Junior Assistant Troop Leaders, 2 Assistant to Troop Leaders, 1 Senior Patrol Leader and 4 Patrols of 8 Scouts, 40 members in total.

Jamboree Headquarters (JHQ) composed of 6 Centres is responsible for the over-all control and operation of the Jamboree. JHQ International Service Centre will assist overseas contingents with the cooperation of SHQ International Sections.

### CAMP WITH HOST TROOPS BY TWOS

In a Sub-Camp, overseas Scouts will be assigned in pairs (2) to camp with Scouts of a Japanese host troop. Host Troops look after the overseas scouts. They cook, join various activities, perform routine service work and sleep as part of their host Japanese Troop. Leaders may stay or serve at the Headquarters of their assigned Sub-Camp.

Overseas contingents are requested to furnish the paired Scout name-list to the Scout Association of Japan by 30 April 2002.

### FOOD AND COOKING

Jamboree food issues commence with lunch on 3 August, ending with lunch on 8 August with a total of 16 meals

Overseas contingents may get supplementary rations, such as rice, bread, milk, tea and meat on request. Special dietary requirements are available on advance request. During the term before the rations are provided, overseas contingents will be provided meals at JHQ Dining Hall till breakfast on 3 August, in case their assigned Japanese host troop is not in the campsite.

### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Arrival and departure points at the Jamboree for chartered bus will be on the main road near assigned Sub-Camps. To permit to enter the Jamboree site, and to ensure the points, bus sticker will be distributed through your travel agency in Japan. This bus sticker indicates the points of arrival and departure. Each contingents or travel groups are requested to inform the Scout Association of Japan of contact person and telephone number of your travel agency in Japan by **July 15** if contingent will charter a bus or truck.

Upon arrival at Jamboree site, you will proceed to the assigned Sub-Camp directly. Contingent leaders need to make a arrival report to JHQ International Service Centre with SC staff.

### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE STAFF

As International Service Staff, individual leaders are invited to serve in JHQ or SHQs. These staff members must be nominated by their Scout/Guide Organizations as part of their National contingent to participate in a working capacity. Jamboree Fee is also ¥28,000- per person.

Flags are hoisted simultaneously at 08:30 every morning. Scouts and leaders in proper uniform assemble in front of the troop flagpole and wait for signal sounded at 08:30. Flags are retreated simultaneously at 18:30 every evening. At the first signal sounded at 18:27, two responsible Scouts of each Troop stand ready to retreat the flags. At the second signal (18:30), the Scouts retreat the flag with the other Scouts standing still on the spot and saluting in the direction of the flag. At the third signal, the lowering finishes and Scouts are dismissed.

### PROGRAMME & ACTIVITIES

The Jamboree Programmes are classified into two major groupings: On-site Activities and Off-site Activities.

Theme for participation in Jamboree programmes and activities is 'Independence & Exchange'. To encourage the theme, Jamboree Award is not set up and many local students will visit Jamboree and experience Scouting activities.

Scouts are expected to design his/her own Jamboree Programme. Leaders are requested to render necessary advice or assistance to their Scouts to deepen friendship with Scouts & leaders of other troops and Local Students.

### A. On-site Activities

- (1) Activities organized by troops
  - 1. Basic Activities
    - a. Patrol Flag Making (Overseas Scouts are not required)
    - b. Discussion
    - c. Service Activities

By discussion with and suggestion from Troop leader, Scouts choose their service project, to be conducted individually or group.

Selected projects shall be run between 30 and 60 minutes. If the place is under control any authority, you must get permission and strictly follows the instructions given by officials in charge. Ex: Cleaning public area, road, toilet etc.

### d. Exchange Programme

Tea party, friendship campfire, sports match, exchange meals etc. are suggested. Patrols and Troops by your campsite may arrange for a joint lunch or dinner.

### f. Friendship

During the Jamboree period, Scouts may exchange greetings and make friends from 9 different Sub-camps. Name cards noted Name, Scouting Position, Address and e-mail address are useful.

### g. Conservation Camping

Scouts will consider Draining, Waste, Fires, etc to encourage the conservation camping.

The JHQ Programme Centre is responsible for the planning of the whole-camp activities and On-site & Off-site selective activities and On-site & Off-site Religious Service and leave the operation of these activities to the hand of the Sub-camp programme section.

Opening Ceremony will be held at Maishima Baseball Stadium on Saturday, 3 August at 18:30-21:00. Representatives of Overseas Contingents are requested to parade in stadium in full uniform by nations. Flags (National Organization flag) are prepared by JHQ and guidance will be made by Scouters in charge of the assigned Sub Camps.

### (2) Grand Arena Show

Grand Arena Show will be held on Maishima Baseball Stadium on Monday, 5 August at 18:30-21:00. Overseas contingents exceeding 20 people may be requested to prepare performance or display in parade style for 4-5 minutes. Program officers in the assigned Sub-Camp will discuss with Contingent Leaders on the details beforehand.

### (3) Closing Ceremony

Closing Ceremony will be held on Maishima Baseball Stadium on Wednesday 7 August at 18:30-21:00 is the official closing of the Jamboree.
