#### 10. Woolshed Creek Fossil Site and Narrabundah Ashstone Locality [V26]<sup>1</sup>

#### Location

District of Majura, Division of Pialligo, Section 6 (Part) and in addition, land in the Fairbairn Avenue road reservation, as identified in Figure 10 and indicated on the Territory Plan Map by the Heritage Places Register Overlay H10.

The fossil site is in and adjacent to Woolshed Creek from a point approximately 26 metres north, to approximately 200 metres south of *Woolshed* Creek Bridge on Fairbairn Avenue between Majura Road and Morshead Drive Pialligo.

The Narrabundah Ashstone locality is on the northern side of Fairbairn Avenue at the intersection with Morshead Drive.

### Features Intrinsic To The Heritage Significance Of The Place

A fossil bed of grey well bedded calcareous mudstones and siltstones extending from 26 metres north of the bridge to about 200 metres south of the bridge, about 150 millimetres average thickness and coveting an area of approximately 0.5 hectares.

A section of Narrabundah Ashstone with an exposure in the road cutting on the north side of Fairbairn Avenue approximately 50 metres from Woolshed Creek Bridge.

## **Statement Of Significance**

The Woolshed Creek Fossil Site has outstanding Australian and international significance from both a historic and scientific perspective. The first Silurian fossils recorded in Australia were, collected from Woolshed Creek in 1844 by the Reverend W B Clarke. The site is rich in fossiliferous biota and has been used to interpret both time scales and the environment of the geological past. The site is a valuable educational aid for geology.

The Narrabundah Ashstone Locality is significant as it displays evidence of early volcanic activity in the Canberra Region. The section displays excellent examples of jointing and bedding and as such enhances the scientific and educational value of the Woolshed Creek Fossil Site.

When viewed as a unit the sites are representative of two totally different types of geological environments in juxtaposition; marine and volcanic.

## **Specific Requirements**

- ii) The encroachment onto the site by stock.
- iii) The construction of facilities and/or trails on or adjacent to the site.
- iv) The installation of capital infrastructure and communication equipment.
- v) Excessive pedestrian traffic on the site.
