## Homecoming Kicks Off Prep@100 Celebrations

A-Day (UCC's annual homecoming celebration) takes on a very special focus this year. It not only marks the annual occasion for Old Boys, students, and parents of the school to gather together, but also marks the official launch of year-long celebrations at the Preparatory School as it turns

100 years old.

On Saturday, September 28 starting at 8:00 a.m. (see attached flap for the schedule of the day's events), the College opens its doors for day-long activities for alumni, parents and students that include a breakfast for all new parents and the parents of boarding students, tours of the campus, fabulous activities for children at "KidsZone", a "SoccerFest" at the Prep and a barbecue lunch. Also scheduled are musical performances by UCC's own Jazz Ensemble as well as visiting musicians including the St. Jamestown Steel Band, the Jay Jackson Musicians and the Sandy McIntyre Celtic Band. And what homecoming would be complete without sports? All day there will be events to either participate in or watch: the Hugh Wiley Run and Walk, volleyball, soccer and football matches against tradi-

tional UCC rivals, an open shinny hockey game, tennis tournament and ultimate (Frisbee) tournament and a



tug-of-war. The day's sporting focus culminates in the Varsity Football team's game against Trinity College School, kicking off at 2:15 p.m. on the Oval.

Centenary festivities at the Prep also commence on A-Day with "Then & Now", an art exhibit of past and recent work by Prep alumni in George Weston Hall at the Prep. The exhibit will be open for viewing over the A-Day weekend only: Saturday and Sunday, September 28-29. It will feature the works of twenty-two diverse artists including Michael Snow '48, Peter Dako '78, architect David Sisam '63 and the Moriyama brothers '80 and '82. The show will touch on the evolution of the artists' progress by juxtaposing their current work with that of their early years at UCC. "Then & Now" will include painting, mixed media,

film and video as well as architectural renderings.

## Governors Agree: UCC to be a Green School

t their June, 2002 meeting the College's Board of Governors unanimously approved an innovative and far-reaching intiative that "has the potential to transform UCC". The Board has put its full support behind a *Green School* program that will, over the next few years, see UCC become a community leader in the areas of environmental education, monitoring and sustainability.

In keeping with UCC's *Aims and Objectives* and *Strategic Plan*, the Board recognizes that the College has an important role to play in addressing global environmental issues. Together with community service, leadership and internationalism, environmental responsibility should be one of the four hallmarks of a UCC education. By becoming a Green School, UCC can better address global environmental challenges both as an organization and through its students and graduates.

The goal of the Green School initiative is to transform the UCC experience and culture in order to achieve four outcomes:

**1. Ecological Literacy:** To develop, in each student, a comprehensive understanding of the basic patterns and processes by which nature sustains life and how these

core ecological concepts relate to sustainable human communities.

- **2. Learning It by Living It:** To model as an organization how core ecological concepts can be applied to create sustainable human communities.
- **3. Environmental Ethic:** To develop an environmental ethic in all members of the UCC community.
- **4. Contributing to Society:** To fulfill the College's commitment to be a private school with a public purpose through research, publications and outreach in the areas of outdoor and environmental education, environmental monitoring and sustainability.

As plans for executing this initiative evolve, the College hopes to hire three new staff members to facilitate the achievement of the Green School goals. They will work in a matrix model with faculty and staff at the Prep, Norval and the Upper School and will develop a three-pronged focus to green the school – organizational behaviour, curriculum and facilities.

The purpose of UCC's application is to clarify the existing by-law with respect to the use of the property as a private academic institution. While there is no specific development proposal related to this application, the meeting provided an opportunity to discuss the College's long-term vision for improvements to the school and the preservation of existing green space.

a consultation meeting that took place on August 13.


This application has been filed as a result of inconsistencies in the historical planning designations for the property that mean that the private school zoning permission does not extend to the whole campus. These divided zoning categories produce an unusual

## **Double Cohort Graduates** shine in IB results

he graduates of the Class of 2002, consistent with their predecessors, have achieved outstanding IB results. In a year that saw 80% more graduates than usual due to the double cohort class, UCC is particularly proud to announce that ninety-nine percent of the class achieved the IB Diploma, with the younger members of the cohort acquitting themselves just as well as their older class-

mates. The school's median score was 34 out of a possible 45 points. To put that number in a broader context, the world average for the last several years was 31. The 2002 world average will be announced this fall. Two young men - Jonathan Faria and John Blickstead - achieved perfect scores of 45. The entire UCC community extends its congratulations to the Class of 2002.

he 2001-2002 Annual Fund raised over \$800,000 from Old Boys, parents, faculty and staff, past parents, grandparents and friends. ## First Class graduates from Horizons Program

t a July graduation ceremony filled with music, curriculum presentations, slide shows and many joyful embraces, 24 Horizons students became the first group to complete the threeyear Summer Program and graduate. Horizons students, selected by their teachers and principals, enter the tuition-free summer school program at UCC after completing Grade 6. They are invited to attend for 3 consecutive summers. The 2002 graduates (who are now entering Grade 9) have completed an academic program which focussed on learning Canadian History through drama, using inquiry skills in advanced mathematics, studying Latin as part of English literature and enhancing their understanding of forces, structures, mechanical efficiency and global issues through hands-on projects. Note-taking skills, posing questions, critical thinking and reflective writing have been key components of their program. Plans are now underway for a high school support and scholarship

program for these students.

Director Nanci Goldman explains that The *Horizons* Program at Upper Canada College captures all the elements of an exemplary public-purpose initiative. It is a

multi-faceted partnership program with the Toronto District and Toronto Catholic School Boards and involves both UCC students and students from Regent /Moss Park, Cabbagetown and Parkdale. Throughout the school year, more than one third of UCC's Upper School students meet once a week to tutor students from inner city schools. The UCC tutors work in teams of 25 to 30, each team linking with an entire class and its teacher at one of the designated schools. In addition, boys coach hockey teams from these schools and parents volunteer their time assisting teachers.

Also honoured at the Summer Program graduation ceremony were Senator Michael Meighen and Dr. Kelly Meighen, lead benefactors and committed volunteers to the *Horizons* Program since its inception. Kelly Meighen is a member of the Upper Canada College Board of Governors. She and Senator Meighen are parents of a UCC alumnus (Hugh 2001) and current student (Max 2007).





## **Update: Legal Matters**

n November 2002, the preliminary hearing with respect to the criminal charges against former UCC teacher Douglas Brown is expected to get under way. The hearing may last several weeks; while there is a publication ban on any evidence, news about the history of the charges and the hearing itself will likely be covered in the media. In addition, the College has been served with two civil lawsuits by lawyers representing former students involved in the Brown case. The school's legal counsel is reviewing these claims and, at this time, no hearing date has been set. However since these suits have been filed with the court, they are now in the public domain and may receive media coverage during the coming year.
