

Artist Spotlight

Merrill Densmore was born in the mid-40's and raised in Vermont's Northeast Kingdom. Merrill started to paint by using "paint by numbers" and drawing with crayons. He has been using acrylic paint and working with the GRACE program since 1994. Merrill works independently at home and travels to GRACE once a month for a one-on-one critique. He occasionally attends the GRACE workshop at "Our Drop-in Center" in Newport.

Merrill's work has been exhibited in numerous shows in Vermont as well as outside the region.

One of his favorite subjects is the Vermont landscape. Merrill uses bold color patterns to fill his paintings with clouds, mountains, moose, cows and familiar buildings. Merrill is a prolific painter who continues to express his highly personal vision in a truly individual manner.



GRACE's Program Travels to Ireland

n May, Michael and I had the pleasure of traveling to Dublin, Ireland to conduct a week-long training program at Tallaght Community Arts Centre (TCAC). The Art Centre hosted a Disabilty Arts Week in conjunction with The South Dublin County Council and the Irish Arts Council. The week-long program included GRACE training (master classes) for artists/facilitators and a series of five art making workshops for individuals with disabilities. Twelve pre-selected artists participated in the morning sessions, and the afternoon workshops included up to thirty individuals from various residential and day centers. An exhibition - Six Artists from GRACE - was on view at TCAC's gallery from May 13-24 and will travel to three additional sites in Ireland. The following week we traveled to the west coast of Ireland and presented a GRACE slide lecture at Castlebar Art Centre.

Tom Meskell - an artist from Dublin Ireland - introduced the GRACE program to his colleagues at TCAC who proposed a collaborative project . Tom spent three months in residence with us in 1998 becoming familiar with GRACE as a model for community based arts programming. His residency included visiting our workshop sites, working with individual artists, and assisting with community exhibitions. Upon returning to Ireland he undertook a project working with individuals with special needs in sheltered housing settings. Tom assisted us during our week's residency and he and his family served as our gracious hosts while we were in Dublin.

"Community arts" in Ireland is gaining more recognition and is becoming an important part of the country's social fabric. We were extremely impressed with the artist/facilitators we worked with during Disability Week and inspired by their great work in the community ! To date, very few sustainable long-term art programs have been initiated with people with disabilities in Ireland. Most community art projects are short-term, and are based on specific goals and/or the resulting "product". We were asked to conduct this training because of the unique GRACE working method, which is a non-teaching approach and focuses on the process of long-term artistic development. We look forward to furthering the partnerships we made during our residency, and following the progress of community art projects throughout Ireland.
