## Introduction and Methodology

- Gregg, Kelly, Sullivan & Woolstencroft: *The Strategic Counsel* is pleased to present findings of The Globe and Mail/CTV Polling Program for January 2006 Election.
- Results are based on nightly tracking among a proportionate national sample of Canadians 18 years of age or older.
- Findings have been rolled up and analyzed over a three day period. Interviews were conducted on December 31<sup>st</sup>, January 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>.
- The following table outlines the sample distribution and associated margin of error to date.







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
