#### A Pet-Free Blessing of the Animals?

Rabbi Yitz Greenberg often speaks about a concept known as "Sacred Envy," which is a very healthy impulse of admiring something about a faith tradition other than your own. It's healthy as long as you realize that your own faith tradition has much to offer as well, and it's healthy because it helps us to see some of the deeper things that all religions share.



One thing Judaism shares with Christianity is a love of animals, "all creatures, great and small." What I'm envious of is something that many churches do, when the parishioners bring in their pets for an annual "Blessing of the Animals." I've wanted to do something like that for several years, but we've gotten hung up on a few problems, primarily, and in no particular order:

- 1) the length of Jewish services
- 2) the lack of an ideal time to gather for this other than Shabbat
- 3) the carpet in the sanctuary

I wanted to do something that we could plan indoors, primarily because the ideal time to bless our animals is when reading the portion of Noah, which typically happens once it's gotten too cold to plan an activity outside. This year Noah falls on November  $5^{th}$ .

Now, I personally have no problem with animals in the sanctuary. Our sanctuary actually bears a resemblance to Noah's ark, in fact. But, given the fact that it might make our Bar Mitzvah boy that day a little squeamish to have my standard poodles chasing their toy bone (which, by the way, says "kosher" on it) while he recites his Haftarah, I opted for Plan B: an animal-free blessing of the animals.

That's right, DON'T bring your pets to services on November 5<sup>th</sup>. But DO send me your favorite photo. Your pets will be with us in spirit as we compile a "Bark" Mitzvah Booklet, complete with photos of TBE animals, along with information about Judaism and animals and a profile of your pet.

If you would like your little darling to be blessed (albeit in amentia), here's all you have to do:

By November 2<sup>nd</sup>, e-mail to me or submit a hard copy of:

- 1) Your pet's photo and name
- 2) "An All About Me" including (but not limited to) the following:
  - -- Pet's and owner's name
  - -- Favorite toy
  - -- Favorite food
  - -- Favorite kosher food
  - -- Favorite Jewish expression
  - -- "My pet seems very Jewish because..."
  - -- Pet mitzvah project (e.g. visiting the sick, sharing a bone)
  - -- Stupid pet trick (if any)
  - -- Why my pet has blessed my life...

If you have any other ideas that could make this "pet project" of mine even more meaningful (and fun), by all means, let me know. This is all a dress-rehearsal, after all, for the second annual "Blessing of the Animals," the one where we actually invite the little critters in.

Join us on November 5<sup>th</sup>, and don't forget to come back on the following Friday night at 7:30 p.m. for our first SHABBAT UNPLUGGED of the new season, followed that night by the first of Professor Dan Bahat's two presentations on the secrets of ancient Jerusalem (the second one will be on Sunday morning, November 13<sup>th</sup> at UConn).

#### RABBI SELILAH KALEV, EDUCATION DIRECTOR

Your children continue to amaze me! I have spent the past month watching as they have continually risen to the occasion, gone above and beyond, and hung in there...they have proven again and again that they are tougher than they look, good sports, as well as compassionate and caring...



Beginning with the toughest color war challenge ever, I saw incredible leadership from the heh class students and fantastic team work and determination from all of the students. They searched through an "ancient" machzor (High Holy Day prayer book) for clues to the services and prayers (I didn't realize that the version that we have at TBE doesn't have the English titles...) and even though it was hard, and they regularly needed to ask for help, they did not quit, and they patiently persevered. Those who chose to do creative tasks showed ingenuity and fearlessness in the face of their peers. The original Sukkah decorations that they created were thoughtful and holiday oriented, and even "out of the box" as two teams took the boxes from some art supplies and created mini-sukkot with tiny decorations of their own that can beautify our Temple sukkah. The students who wrote original prayers for the High Holy Days (They will continue to hang in our halls for all to see for a while.) showed insight and care for their families, our community and the world. And those who threw themselves into the task of creating an original music video to the traditional song "Apples and Honey on Rosh Hashanah" showed bravery, humor, and musical talent as they performed for their peers at the end of the day. And while the yarok (green) team deserves a Yasher Koach for their win...all of the teams showed how good they are at the things that truly matter. And not to be out done, the youngest members of our community should be mentioned for their patience and good humor as they waited for their gifts to arrive from the older kids. They are the heart of our school as their cheerful calls of hello and giggling greetings fill our halls as they pass from one activity to the next.

Only one week later the sixth and seventh grades were once again put to the test as they headed off for the first two-night Shabbaton we have ever had...in the rain! They didn't let a little wet weather get them down! They participated in all of the activities, from themed learning with Rabbi Hammerman, Jonathan Ostroff and I to Madrichim led games and sports with equal enthusiasm and energy. Even though it was a new camp that took some adjusting, they worked together to get from place to place, learned the brachot so that they could eat, and won a ton of color war points. The sixth graders showed their thoughtfulness as we discussed friendship. They described how important friendship is in life, how in times of need they can be the rocks that get us through. As all conversations that involve friendships in middle school should, we rounded this very important conversation with a discussion of Lashon HaRa (gossip) and the pain that it can cause. The next day the seventh grade delved into the concept of being created in God's image: how we might see many of God's traits within ourselves, whether they are compassion, protection, love, faith or truth. Both groups showed incredible spirit as they cheered each other on in the talent show, sang song after song in a sing off, and raced each other to the buzzer in an "Absolutely Impossible to Answer Trivia Game." Even during the services and blessings after the meals they showed amazing ruach (spirit) and focus. The main highlight, though, was when they took care of each other. One of the best moments to witness was that of a group of boys from one class, who were playing a game, went out of their way not only to invite, but to convince a boy from the other class to join them. Once he did, they walked him through the rules, shared stories and jokes together and made the whole experience a positive one for them all.

This month has left me with wonder of and pride in our youth. What an incredible beginning to a new year. I wish for us all to have such strength, energy, grace and joy. Thank you for sharing your children with me.

#### THE HAZZAN'S VOICE



Periodically, I have been reminding you about the outstanding American Jewish Music CDs being recorded and distributed by the Milken Archives. Monthly, I have been receiving these CDs of

gems of Jewish music composed by the most distinguished American Jewish composers and recorded by world renown orchestras, choruses and soloists, instrumental and vocal.

This month's selection features two of Leonard Bernstein's popular selections his "Kaddish" Symphony No. 3 and his "Chichester Psalms." Each has been recorded previously, but now we have both compositions on one CD recorded by the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Choir and orchestra conducted by Gerard Schwarz.

Leonard Bernstein's own commentary on "Kaddish" is most revealing.

"Every son, at one point or other, defies his father, fights, him, departs from him only to return to him - if he is lucky closer and more secure than before. All our great Judaic personalities of the past, including Abraham, who founded Judaism and Moses and the prophets all agreed with God. They argued with God the way you argue with somebody who is so close to you, that you love so much, that you can really fight. You know how the more you love someone, the more you can get angry with them, and when you have a reconciliation, the more close you become than ever. Something like that happens in the course of this piece."

The production of each of the two selections on this CD is first rate and deserves to be listened to over and over again.

I anxiously await the arrival of next month's release. What I do know is that whatever it may be will be a most welcome addition to my library.

What's better is that with the cost of

shipping included, each CD costs a mere ten dollars due to the generosity of the Milken Archive of American Jewish Music.

#### THE JEWISH APPROACH TO MEDICAL ETHICS

The Adult Education Committee is pleased to present a symposium on *The Jewish Approach to Medical Ethics* to be held on Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup> from 7:30-9:30 p.m. The purpose of this program is to shed light on the very important and timely issue of the ethical dimensions of health care and explore these issues from a fresh perspective. The keynote speakers for the program are: Dr. Joel Roth, of the Jewish Theological Seminary in New York City, and an expert of *halachah*, or Jewish law including medical ethics, and Dr. Justin Schechter a practicing psychiatrist in Stamford and Chairman of the Ethics Committee at The Stamford Hospital. Dr. Schechter has advanced training in bio-medical ethics from Montefiore/New York University School of Medicine. The moderator is Dr. David Marks who is the Health and Science Editor on WCBS TV and has appeared as a medical expert on "Today," "Good Morning America," MSNBC, Court TV, and the Fox News Channel.

It is very exciting to bring experts of this stature to address these issues. The medical, ethical and social dilemmas of healthcare decision making have grown increasingly complicated due to advances in medical science and technology. It is our hope that this seminar will help identify and clarify the issues and situations people might face as patients or family caregivers in the intricate, intimidating and somewhat alien environment that is modern medicine. The program will also address Jewish medical ethics as derived from Jewish law.

With Dr. Marks career as an award-winning health reporter as well as a practicing physician and our keynote speakers, we can be assured that pertinent and relevant information about "hot button" medical ethics topics can be addressed both from a Jewish and medical points of view. We anticipate a lively discussion with questions and comments from the audience.




