# Changes in bus service for the Ambaum-Delridge corridor begin Saturday, September 25, 2004

hanges are coming for riders along the Ambaum-Delridge corridor through Southwest Seattle to downtown Seattle. King County Metro Transit is revising its network of bus routes for Delridge, White Center, Burien, and neighboring areas in order to speed service to and from downtown Seattle.

Metro Transit worked with residents, bus riders, and a sounding board made up of area riders to develop these service changes. Since Metro's public open houses in January/ February, numerous changes have been made to the original proposals in response to public comments.
