a workmanlike and consistent season for Bahen...captured 52 wins and 156 in-the-money finishes ranking 13th overall...recorded four wins over the final five days of the meet...had an average win payout of \$18.29...a \$2 wager on all 445 of Bahen starters would have yielded a profit of \$92.28.

Career

first career win was aboard Micheline on July 7, 1986 at Woodbine...won second race aboard Micheline as well...first stakes victory came aboard Green Noble in 1990 with his first Woodbine stakes win on Desert Waves in the 1993 Heresy Breeders' Cup Stakes...career began to take off in 1990, capturing 10 wins at Woodbine...his win total increased each year up to 1997 with marks of 19, 35, 53, 69, 88 and 102...thrust into the spotlight in 1995, piloting eventual 1996 Horse of the Year, Mt. Sassafras to a third in both the Queen's Plate and Grade I Molson Export Million, and a head-bob loss in the Breeders' Stakes...won the 1996 Canadian Oaks aboard Sovereign Award winning sophomore filly, Silent Fleet...had a career season in 1997, setting lifetime marks in virtually every major category including wins (102), purse earnings

1999, Barton was riding during the winter in California when a racing accident at Golden Gate resulted in fractures of several vertebrae in his back and forced him to think about retirement...after recovering from his injuries, the call of horse racing was too strong to keep Barton away...he returned to Northlands Park in the fall of 1999, and rode the entire 2000 season at Stampede Park, finishing in a tie as the colony's leading rider...he also led Northlands Park with eight stakes that year...following the Alberta racing season in October, Barton made the move east where he quickly picked up eight wins and nine seconds in 75 starts at Woodbine...he picked up full time in 2001, making his way up the rider standings.

Other Notes

bought and ran a pizza/pasta restaurant in Alberta when considering retirement following his injury.

in his first full season at Woodbine, Barton made an immediate impact...he cracked the top 20 with 38 wins and \$1.9 million in earnings...he also captured four stakes, winning the Addison and Elgin with Bold n' Fancy; the Display with Tails Of The Crypt; and the Ontario Lassie with What A Breeze...had an average win payout of \$17.73...his 14.4% winning percentage at route distances was sixth in the riding colony.

Career

Barton began riding at age 16...rode at bush tracks in Utah before riding in New Mexico...moved to California where he rode at Turf Paradise...soon Barton made the move to Canada, heading to Winnipeg to ride at Assiniboia Downs, before switching to Calgary after only one season in Manitoba...rode for several years in Alberta before heading west to Hastings Park in Vancouver...in

after making his move to Woodbine in 2000, Boulanger made the most of his first full year of riding...he ranked fifth with 75 wins, tied in third with eight stakes and fulfilled a career dream winning the Queen's Plate with Dancethruthedawn...also won the Labatt Woodbine Oaks with the Sam-Son Farm filly...won stakes with Treasureinmyhand (Fury), Soundtrack (Ontario Colleen), Nymphenburg (Victoriana), Streakin Rob (Coronation Futurity), Boston Twist (Glorious Song) and Elektraline (Bessarabian)...earned \$9,489 in purse money per mount, second only to Todd Kabel (\$9,779).

Career

born in Edmonton, Alberta, Boulanger travelled to Washington at age 19 to begin his race-riding career winning his first race aboard a three-year-old gelding named Cool Sham...went on to win three straight jockey titles at Longacres, breaking Gary Stevens' record for most wins in a meet with 247 in 1991...continued to ride with success at tracks in northern California, winning the 1992 California Derby with Treakster at Bay Meadows and the All-American Handicap at Golden Gate Fields with Gum...in 1994, he moved to south Florida, where he became a fixture at Calder Racecourse, winning a pair of jockey championships in 1994 and 1995, and at

Gulfstream Park, where he recorded a sixth place ranking in 1997...among the top horses he's piloted are Halo's Image, winner of the 1994 Calder Derby and Tropical Park Handicap; Sharp Appeal, winner of the Hialeah Turf Cup; Blazing Sword, winner of the 1997 Calder Derby and Built For Pleasure, the 1996 Fountain of Youth Stakes winner, scoring at 105-1 over Unbridled's Song...during the 1998 Calder season, he won 99 races and collected more than \$2 million in purses, including four stakes...made the move to Woodbine in June of 2000 and quickly climbed the riding charts finishing sixth overall despite missing more than two months of the season...has more than 2,600 career wins, over 7,400 top three finishes and over \$45 million in lifetime earnings.

Other Notes

rode Chilito in the 1998 Kentucky Derby...rode throughout 1998 and 1999 with intense pain from two cracked vertebrae...made his return from back surgery in 2000...rode at Gulfstream Park during the 2001 winter...started exactly 543 races in both 2000 and 2001, winning 78 in 2000 and 75 in 2001.

ranked tied in 18th with 42 wins...was seventh in third place finishes with 60...posted a solid 14.6% win percentage aboard two-year-olds, ranking sixth among riders...won stakes aboard Hopeful Moment (Shepperton), Nowyouseeit (Juvenile Colts), and Atlantic Fury (Cup and Saucer).

Career

earned his license at age 16...his first winner was a five-year-old named Noble Run...riding career soon came to a halt when he was involved in a nasty accident where he sustained a major shoulder injury...therapy to rehabilitate the shoulder was unsuccessful and he flew to Toronto in 1987 for surgery to repair the damage...in 1994 in race ready conditions, Slade returned to the track...he earned his first stakes win aboard two-year-old Judith's Wild One in the 1996 Colin...breakthrough season came in 1999 winning 60 races, six stakes and collecting personal highs in almost all categories including wins and rank...during that season, Slade guided Great Defender to a track record mark of 1:08.17 for six furlongs, a record which still stands...he followed up in 2000 with a 48-win year despite missing a

month with a fractured vertebrae...made a memorable comeback winning the New Providence Stakes with a horse appropriately named Matter of Courage...a return he characterized as "A dream come true."

Other Notes

Slade teamed with Incitatus, a horse bred and trained by connections from his homeland of Barbados, to win three stakes in 1999 and 2000...learned tricks of the trade in the show jumping ring...brother Brett was formerly a Woodbine rider...at 5'8", Slade towers over many of his rivals.

heads into his 29th campaign leading the jockey colony in years of service, and continues as one of Canada's top riders...after leading the colony in stakes wins in 2000 (15) for the first time in his career, he did it again in 2001 (13)...guided two-year-old Rare Friends to wins in the Vandal, Swynford and Simcoe Stakes en route to juvenile championship honours...ranked fourth in the riders colony in wins with 89...won 15 grass races posting the second best turf winning percentage at Woodbine (17.4%) only behind Patrick Husbands...also won stakes with Chamul (Star Shoot), Wake At Noon (Jacques Cartier), Diadella (Canadian, River Memories), Meadow Gem (Duchess), Highland Mood (Passing Mood, Ontario Damsel), Galadriel (South Ocean), Poetically (Jammed Lovely), and Free Vacation (Flaming Page).

Career

began riding in 1973, winning 32 races that year... scored first stakes win aboard Bay Streak in 1975 Grey Stakes...won 158 races in 1980 earning a Sovereign Award nomination...only jockey to win two Queen's Plates in the 80's (Fiddle Dancer Boy in 1981, La Lorgnette in 1985)...one of only three active jockeys to win the Plate more than once (Kabel 2; Perret, 2)... greatest riding success actually came in the past five years...1998 was a career campaign as he conquered almost every major riding category and received the Sovereign Award as Canada's Outstanding rider... on July 17 of that year, Clark made history winning six consecutive races; a feat not accomplished since 1974 when Sandy Hawley turned the double hat-trick...1999 was no let down for Clark as he was named recipient of the prestigious Avelino Gomez Memorial Award... his 136 wins in '99 placed him second in the rider standings behind only Patrick Husbands...captured milestone win number 2,000 on Canada Day July 1, 1999...continued his excellent run with 136 wins and 15 stakes scores in 2000.

Other Notes

began riding career under the tutelage of noted trainer Gord Huntley...thought of as one of the track's finest gate riders and young horse specialists...hasn't ranked lower than fourth in the two-year-old win category since 1992 (4th in 2001)...nicknamed "Sleepy"...daughter Cory Clark captured a Sovereign Award as Canada's Outstanding Apprentice Jockey in 2000.

now in his 21st year, Dos Ramos ranks second among Woodbine regulars in years of service behind only David Clark (1973)...had 49 wins in 2001 to be ranked 14th among riders...guided Ginger Gold to three stakes wins, capturing the Natalma (1st div.), Shady Well and Princess Elizabeth en route to Sovereign Award honours as Canada's top juvenile filly...Dos Ramos also won three stakes with Mysterious Affair (Whimsical, George C. Hendrie and Ballade)...won the Dominion Day Stakes aboard A Fleets Dancer, a ride Dos Ramos picked up while regular rider Robert Landry was injured.

Career

got first ride at age 18 aboard Dynamite Dolly at Greenwood finishing third...scored first career win aboard Lord Henry on April 20, 1981 at Greenwood...went on to capture the Woodbine and Greenwood Autumn meets later that year, compiling 142 wins...he earned a Sovereign Award as Canada's top apprentice jockey...winning 162 races (156 as an apprentice) in 1982, Richard was awarded with another Sovereign Award as the country's top apprentice...captured three of five meets that year including Greenwood Spring, Fort Erie Summer and Woodbine Autumn, amazing considering Richard missed three months...won his first stakes race aboard Myrthful Minx in the 1982 Canadian Handicap (first division)...has two Canadian Oaks wins (Playlist in 1986 and Plenty of Sugar in 1994)...finished second in the Queen's Plate in

1983 with Sir Khaled...two finest racing accomplishments have come for trainer Phil England and Steve Stavro's Knob Hill Stable...in the 1992 Molson Export Million, he guided Benburb over A.P. Indy, Alydeed and Technology at odds of 31-to-1 after taking over from an injured Larry Attard...in 1999 he thrilled Canadian racing fans engineering an improbable 18-to-1 win with Thornfield in the \$1.5 million Canadian International.

Other Notes

raised in Malton...credits veteran trainer John Mack for early development...spent early days at the racetrack walking "hots" for trainer Bill Marko after being offered the job virtually on the spot...spends time away from the track with wife Linda and daughters Stephanie and Melanie.

in 2001, Patrick Husbands became the first rider in Canadian racing history to complete the natural hat-trick, winning back-to-back-to-back Sovereign Awards as the nation's outstanding jockey...led the colony in mounts (853), in-the-money finishes (408), earnings (\$7,469,239), turf wins (24), and two-year-old wins (tied at 24)...Husbands lost a late season battle for Woodbine's riding title to Todd Kabel, finishing five wins behind at 140...Sovereign Award may have been clinched by his three Grade 1 wins (aboard Exciting Story in Belmont Park's Metropolitan Mile; aboard Dark Ending in Woodbine's Selene and with Numerous Times in Woodbine's Atto Mile)...won eight local stakes in total including Exciting Story in the Vigil, Expected Hour in the Victoria, Starbeau in the Bunty Lawless, Madame Red in the La Lorgnette, Jealous Forum in the My Dear and El Prado Essence in the Seaway Stakes.

Career

the youngest rider ever to win the prestigious Cockspar Cup in his hometown of Barbados at age 16, Husbands would capture the 1993 Barbados riding title at Garrison Savannah... after his 12-win rookie season at Woodbine in 1994, Patrick won 50 races in 1995...in 1998, Patrick finally broke through posting career highs in virtually every category led by 92 second half wins...he captured his first two Woodbine stakes wins (Royal North with Going to Extremes; Kennedy Road with Uncle Wager) and after a steady climb through the ranks, Husbands finished third in the jockey standings behind only David Clark and Todd Kabel...he parlayed his late season success in 1998 into a

stellar Sovereign Award winning 1999, a year in which he led the Woodbine riders colony in virtually every category... on November 19 of that year he set a new Woodbine single season record for earnings with \$5,326,708 surpassing the previous mark set by Todd Kabel in 1995...Husbands would easily break his own mark in 2000, recording \$8,123,227 in purse earnings and tallying Sovereign Award number two...he fell just short that year of his first major Canadian win when Williams News lost a heartbreaking nose decision to Mutafaweg in the \$1.5 million Canadian International...his Atto Mile win in 2001 easily made amends...it was a race he dedicated to his mother, who only days earlier had passed away.

Other Notes

became a Canadian citizen in November, 2000...stands 5' 4", 112 pounds... father was a jockey, his older brother Anthony is an outrider at Woodbine and brother Simon currently rides at Woodbine...credits trainer Reade Baker for his break in Canadian racing...goal is to win every major race in Canada.

In his first local year of riding, Jono Jones has made an immediate impact...he ranked eighth in the colony in wins with 57 and earned \$2.6 million in purses...captured first local stakes victory winning the Dance Smartly Stakes with Alexis...had a 16.4% win average at routes, ranking fourth at Woodbine...with his average win payout of \$18.98 Jones produced a very positive return on investment for

those betting on him...a \$2 wager on all 445 of Jones' starters would have yielded a profit of \$191.80...was also the leading rider in Barbados where he led the Garrison Savannah with 14 wins in 64 starts for earnings of \$295,185.

Career

received his apprentice license in 1990 at the age of 14 in Barbados...won his first race aboard Rugby Lass for trainer Liz Deane and owner G.H. King...at age 15 he won the United Derby on a horse named Overdraft, trained by his father Challenor Jones...went on to win four Derbies before his 21st birthday...rode for several years in Europe, in England for Sir Michael Stoute and galloping in France for

Nicholas Clement...won the Stallion Stakes in 1993 with Nobody Wants Me and again in 1998 aboard El Vagabondo...was the leading rider in both 1994 and 1995 in Martinique...was leading rider in both 2000 and 2001 in Barbados...moved to Woodbine in May 2001 following in the footsteps of fellow top Carribean-based jockeys Emile Ramsammy and Patrick Husbands.

credits his father and former champion jockey Venice

Richards as his influences in riding...at five foot six inches, he's one of Woodbine's taller riders.

the 2001 jockeys race came right down to the wire, with Kabel edging out Patrick Husbands for the Woodbine riding title, the third of his career...won 13 races over the last 10 days of the meet to clinch victory...it was the ninth consecutive time that Kabel was among Woodbine's top four riders...he led the colony in wins (145), route wins (66), main track wins (123), win percentage (20.2%), and in-the-money percentage (47.9%)...won 11 local stakes races (Only to You in the Nassau; Dream Launcher in the Victoria Park; Quiet Resolve in the King Edward; Mountain Angel in the Ontario Matron; Moonlight Affair in the La Provoyante and Classy' N Smart; Strut the Stage in the Toronto Cup and Charlie Barley; Healing Knowledge in the Algoma; Olympian in the Kennedy Road; and Nicholle's Devil in the Silver Deputy)...only David Clark had more stakes wins with 13.

Career

recorded first career win July 4, 1984 aboard Forli's Ainikel at Winnipeg's Assiniboia Downs...earned a Sovereign Award as Canada's top apprentice jockey in 1986, winning 131 races (none in Ontario), sixth overall on the continent that year... tested Toronto "waters" in 1987, finishing second at the Greenwood Autumn meet after a successful Assiniboia campaign...split 1988 and 1989 seasons between Winnipeg and Toronto...made permanent shift here in 1990...after consecutive sixth place finishes at the 1990 (71 wins) and 1991 (64) Woodbine meets, Todd emerged at the top in 1992, winning 114 races at Woodbine and a Sovereign Award as the country's top rider...in 1994, Kabel began to dominate when the money was on the line winning 15 stakes and 153 races at Woodbine...but it was his remarkable 1995 Woodbine season that puts him on a level all his own; his \$5.2 million in purse earnings in one season was a record that stood until 1999, his 193 wins at Woodbine is the second highest ever recorded at a local meet (Mickey Walls won 221 in 1991), his 28 stakes wins in Ontario is also a penultimate mark (Avelino Gomez registered 32 in

1966)...the highlight of that tremendous season came when he captured a spectacular win aboard Regal Discovery in The Queen's Plate...his 1997 season was capped off by a thrilling second place finish aboard Dawson's Legacy at 78-to-1 in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Hollywood Park...in 1998, Kabel broke the prestigious 2,000 win plateau aboard a horse aptly named The Great Won...during the '90's, Todd won 128 stakes, the most of any Woodbine jockey...he has already begun the new millennium with 21 more including another Queen's Plate win in 2000 with Scatter the Gold...Scatter the Gold also tallied victory in Fort Erie's Prince of Wales Stakes but was denied a Triple Crown finishing third in the Breeders' Stakes.

Other Notes

one of the best 'big race' jockeys' that Woodbine has ever seen...as a youngster, dreamt of a career as a jockey riding the young steers when the rodeo came to town...soon after, turned to Thoroughbreds and began riding under the tutelage of top Assiniboia Downs trainers; "Shorty" Grey and Emile Corbeil.

despite a tough mid-season injury, Landry emerged on top in several high profile races...won the Eclipse Stakes with Graeme Hall, the Durham Cup with A Fleets Dancer and the Maple Leaf with Catch The Ring...also guided Millennium Allstar through a high-profile three-year-old campaign which included a win in the Achievement Stakes and an eighth place finish in the Queen's Plate...also won the La Voyageuse with Torrid Affair...ranked 12th with 53 wins and seventh with \$3,361,586 in purse earnings...injury came in a riding incident on June 15, and the long-term effects did not allow the Toronto native to return to his regular riding schedule until July 14...he did however ride in the Queen's Plate in late June.

Chris Loseth

2001 Avelino Gomez Memorial Award Winner

On August 16, 1965 the legendary Johnny Longden became the first jockey in North America to record 3,000 lifetime wins when he guided Prince Scorpion to victory in the sixth race at Exhibition Park in Vancouver.

The historic feat made news across the continent. One of the people who read the story in Fort Nelson, B.C. was a 10-year-old named Chris Loseth.

"They had a big spread about John Longden winning all those races," recalls Loseth. "That was actually my introduction that there could ever be such a thing as making a living riding a racehorse. I thought, I'd like to do that."

Well, he has done it and done it well. And for his many achievements, Loseth was named the 2001 recipient of the Avelino Gomez Memorial Award.

The award is given to the person, Canadian-born, Canadian-raised or regular rider in the country for more than five years, who has made significant contributions to the sport.

Presented annually on (Labatt Woodbine) Oaks day, the award is in memory of Gomez, one of North America's most colourful and talented jockeys. Gomez died from complications after a three-horse accident during the running of the Canadian Oaks in 1980.

A life-size statue of the Cuban-born Gomez, who settled in Toronto and raised a family here, overlooks the Woodbine walking ring. A

replica is presented to each year's winner.

Loseth, born in Banff, Alberta, becomes the first British Columbia-based rider to win the award.

"I am extremely thrilled to win this award," said Loseth, 46. "I had the pleasure of riding with Avelino in 1976 at Greenwood. He was certainly a character and one of a kind. It was a great honour to have known him and win this award in his name."

Beginning his riding career in 1974 at Exhibition Park (now Hastings Park Racecourse), Loseth has enjoyed a record-breaking career.

Consider this.

Loseth guided Megeka Sauce to his 3,000th career victory in the first race of the day at Hastings Park on July 6, 1996.

He has 3,430 wins from 24,175 starts in his career through Tuesday, May 22, 2001.

On April 9, 1984, he won eight of ten races at Exhibition Park to tie a North American record that still stands. On three other occasions he won six races on a single card.

In 1976, he won the Sovereign Award as Canada's outstanding apprentice rider and then won the Sovereign Award as this country's outstanding jockey in 1984, becoming the first to win both.

He has won the Hastings Park riding title a record eight times.

He is the all-time stakes winning jockey at Hastings Park with 186 victories, 22 more than the next rider.

He was inducted into the British Columbia Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame in 1992.

Chris has also been a tireless worker with the Jockeys' Benefit Association of Canada, serving as the Association's President for the past four years and prior to that as Vice-president and Guild representative.

Loseth clearly embodies the true spirit of the Gomez Award. His contributions to the sport are enormous.

The second winner of the Gomez Memorial Award in 1985 was Johnny Longden. Little did Chris Loseth realize 36 years ago when he was reading about his hero that one day they would share the same award.

Loseth joins Ron Turcotte, John Longden, Sandy Hawley, the late Don MacBeth, the late Chris Rogers, Jeff Fell, Lloyd Duffy, Hugo Dittfach, Robin Platts, Larry Attard, Don Seymour, David Gall, Richard Grubb, Irwin Driedger, David Clark and 2000 recipient, Jim McKnight as Gomez honourees.

- scored 5,000th win of career aboard Mighty Massa on June 27, 1986 at Canterbury Downs
- inducted in Canada's Horse Racing Hall of Fame and awarded Woodbine's Avelino Gomez honour in 1986.
- returned to Woodbine in 1988 and picked up where he left off, earning his second Sovereign Award as Canada's outstanding jockey (1978)
- earned induction into the National Museum of Thoroughbred Racing's Hall of Fame in 1992
- won 6,000th race aboard Summer Commander on November 26, 1992 at Greenwood
- tied for most wins among jockeys in The Queen's Plate with four
- holds the mark for most wins among jockeys in the Canadian Oaks with eight
- captured 18 Woodbine riding titles, 13 Fort Erie meets, nine Greenwood championships, nine Ontario titles and eight Canadian honours
