

ARMCHAIR REMOTE CONTROL /PAPERBACK CADDY

Missing remote...no place to keep your book handy in your favorite chair???? Create our remote control – paperback caddy in fabrics to coordinate with your décor. They'll always be right at your fingertips when you're ready to watch a good movie or catch up on your reading!



Supplies You'll Need:

- Pfaff creative Embroidery Machine
- Pfaff creative Customizing for lettering – or substitute your favorite monogram card letters
- 1 – 10" x 24" double-sided quilted fabric for main piece
- 2 – 7" x 10" double-sided quilted fabric for pockets

NOTE: Adjust width of pattern pieces if your remote controls are extra-wide. Two remotes – each approx. 2 ½" wide – will fit nicely.

- 2 yds – 1 ¼" wide bias – press the long raw edges in towards the center
- Rayon embroidery thread
- Sewing thread to match fabric
- Embroidery stabilizer
- Temporary adhesive spray
- Fabric marking pen & ruler

Let's Get Started:

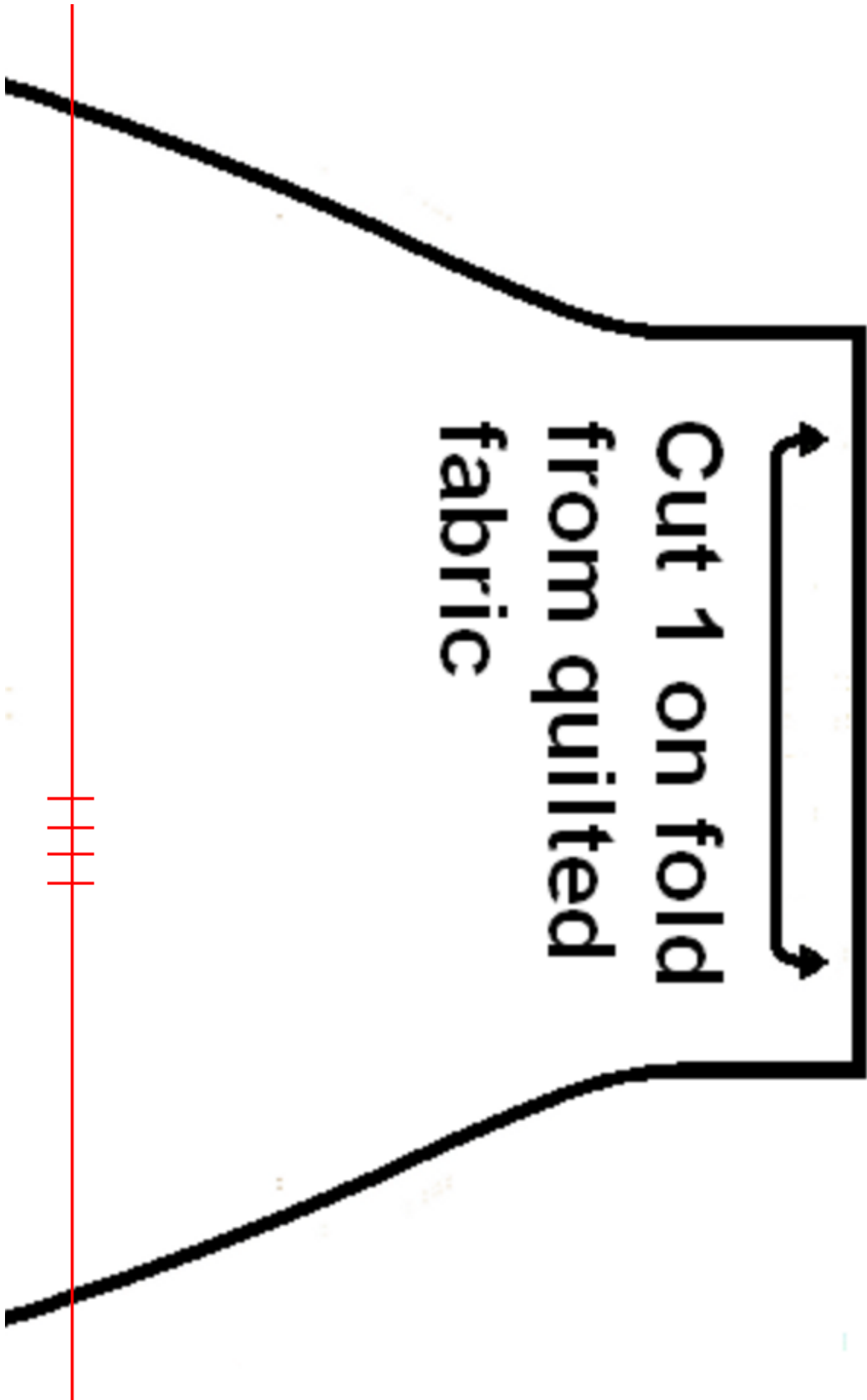
1. Cut out pattern and tape together along red lines (overlap notched line).
2. Cut out 1 main piece from double-sided quilted fabric.
3. Cut out 2 pocket pieces.
4. In Pfaff creative Customizing or on your machine (using your favorite monogram card) create the words REMOTE and CONTROL.

5. With the fabric marker, draw intersecting horizontal and vertical lines through the center of each pocket.
6. Hoop a piece of embroidery stabilizer and lightly spray with temporary adhesive.
7. Embroider lettering centered on the intersecting marks on each pocket (REMOTE on one pocket, CONTROL on the other).
8. Using your favorite method, bind longer top straight edge of pocket pieces.
9. Baste pockets on each end of main piece.
10. Using your favorite method, bind entire outer edge of caddy.
11. On one pocket, tack the binding at the very center – this will create two “pockets” for sliding your remote controls into.
12. **HANDY HINT!!!!** If your binding didn't turn out quite as pretty as you had hoped... simply cover up the edge with a satin stitch or other decorative stitching!!!! **EXACTLY** what I had to do when my binding didn't end up quite as pretty as I had wanted!!!
