COBB COUNTY 2005 COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

This document outlines Cobb County's 2005 Community Improvement Projects (CIP) to be adopted by the Board of Commissioners on June 14, 2005. It briefly describes the purpose of each capital improvement and corresponding funding. The 2005 CIP is intended to address the immediate needs of Public Safety and the Department of Transportation that affect the future of Cobb County and is to be primarily funded via a Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST).

PUBLIC SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

Replacement of 800 MHz Communication System

- Upgrade and convert radio system to digital technology to include voice and data radio communications system and mobile data services with increased connectivity to surrounding agencies.
- Seven additional frequencies will become available to meet current and future needs.
- Two additional tower sites are part of the upgrade to facilitate radio coverage where there are currently dead spots (no signal coverage), and to create a redundant microwave path.
- Additional system enhancements.

Jail Expansion

- Construct a functional jail expansion complex to include medium/maximum security housing
 units to accommodate approximately 864 violent offenders; facilities and beds to
 accommodate inmates with medical and mental health issues; support space to
 accommodate functions such as laundry, food service, maintenance and storage; corridor
 space to connect new and existing facilities; parking to accommodate staff and visitors;
 acquisition of any necessary new real property.
- Renovate existing facilities.
- Construct additional functional medium/maximum security housing units to accommodate up to an additional 1056 offenders, if funding is available.

New Courthouse

- Construct and prepare a new functional judicial complex to include a new approximately 240,000 square foot Courthouse to be located on Haynes Street, between Washington Avenue and Lawrence Street, east of the existing courthouse, to accommodate increased case loads and new judges assigned to Cobb County.
- The new Courthouse will expand the existing Central Court Complex to include a Juvenile Court, provide offices for the District Attorney, provide additional space for the Victim Witness Unit, expanded security and inmate holding facilities, as well as a larger jury assembly area.
- Parking, covered walkways, and other improvements associated with the new complex are anticipated to be included.
- The new Courthouse will be constructed to provide maximum protection to the public, judges, and staff.

TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS

The transportation improvements fall into the categories which are shown below. Each category is broken down into component areas with a brief description. Following this introductory summary are program descriptions and project lists for each of the components.

Congestion Relief and Mobility Improvements

- Thoroughfare Improvements Construct new roads, add new through lanes, and upgrade identified roadways to meet current design standards.
- Traffic Management Technology and Signal Timing Improvements Expand the county's advance traffic management system and retime traffic signals to reduce traffic delays and improve traffic flow.

Safety and Operational Improvements

- Roadway Safety and Operational Improvements Improvements such as correcting substandard sight distances, increasing lane widths to standard sizes, widening shoulders along identified roadways, adding turn lanes, and adding traffic signals where warranted.
- Intersection Safety and Operational Improvements Addition of turn lanes, sight distance improvements, intersection realignments, new or upgraded traffic signals.
- School Zone Safety and Operational Improvements Entrance improvements, turn lanes, entrance signalization, bus lanes, sight distance improvements, signage, installation of sidewalk, crosswalk, and pedestrian signalization.

Infrastructure Preservation

- Resurfacing Extend the service life of existing roads by patching potholes, milling, leveling, and complete resurfacing. Roads would be resurfaced on average every 20 years instead of the current cycle of every 30 years.
- Drainage System Improvements Upgrade and repair existing roadway drainage systems.
- Bridge Rehabilitation/Replacement Replace obsolete or weight restricted bridges. There are currently 27 bridges that are weight restricted, 14 of which are in need of immediate replacement, while the other 13 require major rehabilitation.

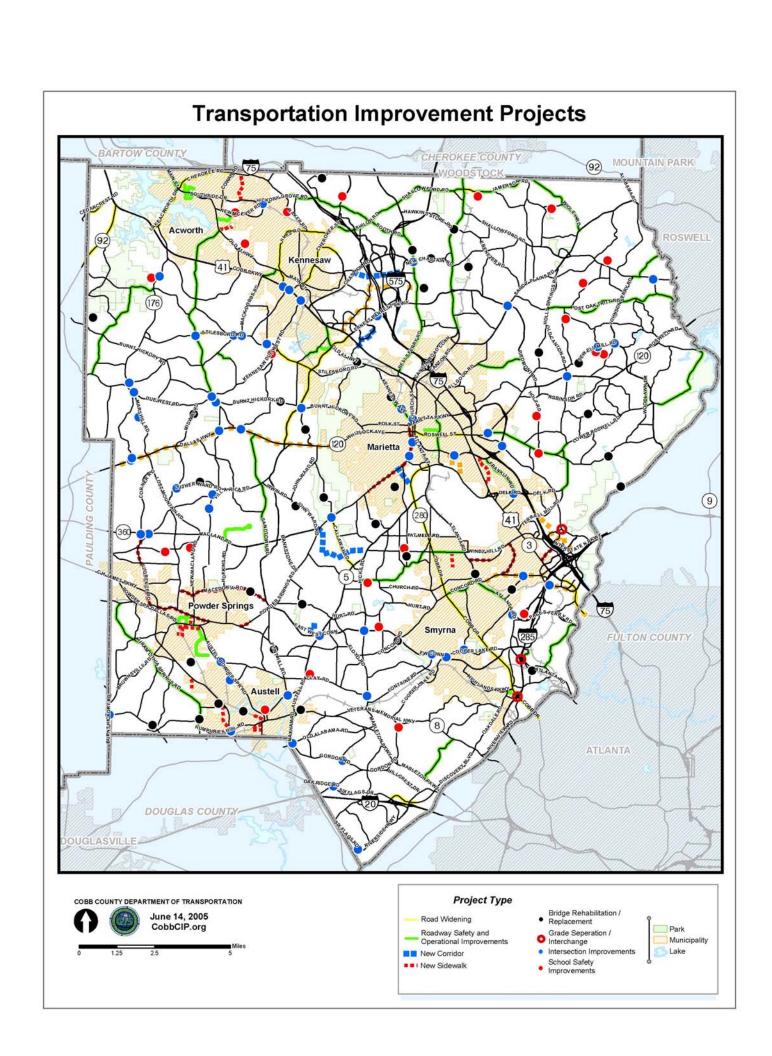
Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements

- Sidewalks Construct sidewalks and multi-use paths to promote transportation alternatives and increased recreation. As with previous programs, sidewalks near schools have the greatest impact and would be given priority. A citizen's oversight committee would help determine the placement of sidewalks.
- On Street Bicycle Improvements Implement the Cobb County Bicycle Transportation Plan's bicycle-friendly on-street system.
- Multi-use Trails Development of a comprehensive network of off-street and greenway multiuse trails.

THOROUGHFARE IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

Improve Cobb's thoroughfares to increase capacity, reduce congestion, and enhance safety through construction and operational improvements.

Needs Assessment

- Improve roadway design to provide increased capacity and safer thoroughfares.
- Add new lanes where needed.
- Add new roadways where needed.
- Eliminate at-grade intersections at extremely congested intersections.
- Make operational and safety improvements, such as improving horizontal and vertical geometry; adding turn lanes at major intersections, increase travel lane widths and improve drainage.
- Add sidewalks and bike lanes where needed.

Congestion Relief and Mobility Improvements

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT, TRAFFIC SIGNAL TIMING AND PLANNING

Purpose

- To expand Cobb County's advanced traffic management system by installing additional fiber network for communication and data transfer to local traffic signal controllers; and surveillance cameras for monitoring traffic incidents and traffic conditions.
- To rebuild wood pole traffic signals and improve traffic signal display.
- To upgrade existing traffic signal cabinets and controllers to the current advanced traffic signal software/hardware.
- To retime existing traffic signal systems every 3 years to obtain the most efficient traffic signal timing for the current traffic demands.
- To provide for the expansion and upgrading of the department's transportation technologybased systems.

Needs Assessment

 The additional fiber optical cable, surveillance cameras, signal equipment and improved signal timing will improve the operation and maintenance of the over 500 traffic signals Cobb County operates.

Safety and Operational Improvements

ROADWAY SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

To make operational and safety enhancements by the addition of horizontal and or vertical alignment (geometric) improvements, lane and shoulder widening, sight distance improvements, turn lanes, traffic signals and sidewalks.

Needs Assessment

A number of Cobb County roadways, constructed years ago, do not meet the current standards for geometrics, sight distance and lane widths. Due to development and population growth, these roads now carry high traffic volumes which can lead to safety issues. Safety and operational characteristics of these roads would be enhanced by these improvements.

Safety and Operational Improvements

INTERSECTION SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

To improve the safety of vehicular and pedestrian movements at identified intersections.

Needs Assessment

- Determine appropriate improvements based upon accident analysis, traffic volumes, available sight distances, existing roadway alignments, pavement and shoulder conditions, pedestrian accessibility, and other relevant factors.
- Needed improvements may include additional turn lanes, hill cuts or other sight distance improvements, intersections realignments, new or upgraded traffic signals, sidewalks, and other improvements to enhance safety and/or intersection operation.

SCHOOL ZONE SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

Since 1998 the Cobb County School District has built seven new schools. The District will construct an additional nine new schools of which five will open in the fall of 2005. This will increase the need for safety and operational improvements at the entrance and nearby intersections of these new schools as well as at many of the existing schools.

Needs Assessment

- Transportation improvements in school zones include providing safe access for pedestrians, bicycles and vehicles.
- Pedestrian improvements could include the installation of sidewalks, crosswalks, and pedestrian signalization.
- Vehicular improvements could include intersection/entrance improvements, turn lanes, entrance signalization, bus lanes, sight distance improvements, signage and pavement markings.

Infrastructure Preservation

RESURFACING

Purpose

To provide funding for a resurfacing program for a portion of the roadway network maintained by Cobb County.

Needs Assessment

- Approximately 2,400 miles of county maintained roads that require periodic maintenance over their service life such as patching potholes, milling, leveling, and complete resurfacing.
- Through normal budgeting, Cobb County resurfaces, on average, each road every 30 years. Experience has shown that the pavement lifecycle of a road is 20 years on average.

Work Program

- All roads are evaluated by staff for attributes such as pavement condition, age, functionality, and anticipated traffic.
- Roads are assigned a numerical rating that is used to prioritize them for resurfacing.
- The prioritized list of roads will be presented to the Cobb County Board of Commissioners for implementation.
- Over 1,000 miles of roads will be resurfaced as part of this program.

DRAINAGE SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

To provide for the maintenance and repair of existing drainage facilities and to construct new improvements within the roadway right-of-way to enhance roadway drainage.

Needs Assessment

Cobb County has over 2,400 miles of existing roadways requiring constant drainage maintenance activities.

Deteriorated or insufficient drainage structures can lead to:

- Local flooding
- Impacts to roadway safety
- Roadway damage
- Private property damage
- Increased erosion
- Increased sedimentation

Work Program

- A work program will be developed to identify and prioritize those locations where drainage
 facilities under and adjacent to the roadways have deteriorated to the point where they no
 longer function as intended or require preventative maintenance. Appropriate improvements
 will be developed and corrective measures taken to eliminate the problem areas.
- The prioritized list of drainage needs will be presented to the Cobb County Board of Commissioners for implementation.

Infrastructure Preservation

BRIDGE REHABILITATION/REPLACEMENT

Purpose

To ensure the structural integrity and operational safety of bridges and box culverts by replacing or rehabilitating low sufficiency rated bridges and box culverts and weight restricted bridges.

Needs Assessment

- Bridges are inspected biannually by Georgia Department of Transportation and assigned sufficiency ratings from 0 to 100 based on their structural, operational, and functional attributes.
- Bridges with low sufficiency ratings require greater attention. Eventually low sufficiency bridges will continue to deteriorate and be posted with lower and lower weight restrictions until, at some point, they will have to be closed.
- Currently 14 bridges have sufficiency ratings of less than 50; 18 bridges have sufficiency ratings between 50 and 60; 27 bridges are weight restricted.
- The structural and operational conditions on the remaining 175 bridges will continue to deteriorate over time resulting in declining ratings.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements

SIDEWALKS

Purpose

To provide pedestrian facilities that are safe transportation alternatives to the automobile, providing access to major activity centers including schools, parks, trails, transit stops and stations, commercial centers, and shopping.

Needs Assessment

Cobb County continues to experience one of the highest pedestrian injury and fatality rates in Georgia. The sidewalk program will be designed to address the following goals:

- Improve safety by reducing injuries and fatalities that result from automobile/pedestrian conflicts.
- Close gaps by connecting missing segments of sidewalk along roadways and pedestrian walkways.
- Improve access and connectivity to community facilities, schools and regional activity centers.
- Improve current and future facility design by removing barriers, providing sufficient infrastructure, safe crossings, and pedestrian amenities to encourage walking.
- Currently there are approximately 500 pending sidewalk requests received from various sources including the general public, public officials, and organized citizen groups.

Work Program

For this program, Cobb DOT staff will evaluate and prioritize sidewalk projects to be implemented based on predetermined criteria established by a Citizen Oversight Committee and the Cobb County Board of Commissioners. Staff will make recommendations to the Board on which projects to proceed.

Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements

ON STREET BICYCLE IMPROVEMENTS

Purpose

Continue the implementation of the Cobb County Bicycle Transportation Plan's bicycle-friendly onstreet system.

Needs Assessment

On-street bicycle improvements are necessary as a part of the transportation network to enhance safety and to facilitate and promote the usage of alternative modes of transportation. Bicycle facilities include wide curb lanes, bike shoulders, and striped bike lanes to assist bicyclists in sharing the roadway with other modes of travel. These bicycle facilities will enhance safety, ease congestion and improve accessibility, mobility, and air quality.

Work Program

- Bicycle friendly on-street mobility accommodations continue to be evaluated.
- The Cobb County Bicycle Transportation Plan identifies corridors where on-street bicycling improvements could be made.
- For this program, Cobb DOT staff will evaluate and prioritize bicycle improvement projects to be implemented based on predetermined criteria established by the Cobb County Board of Commissioners.
