An Early Trauma Patient in Southern Arizona

Jeff Milton was an early Arizona border lawman, who was shot in the left arm. Dr. George Goodfellow of Tombstone operated on his shattered arm, and he regained function, although the arm was shorter than his other arm. This is visible in both of these photographs of Milton. Often known as the first U.S. Border Patrolman, Milton came to Arizona in 1887 as an inspector with the United States Customs Service until 1889. In 1904, he joined the Immigration Service, then part of the Department of Commerce and Labor, as a "Mounted Chinese Inspector" guarding the border against the illegal entry of Chinese into the United States. However, Milton has always been known as the first Immigration Border Patrolman even though the Border Patrol was not officially organized until he had completed 20 years of service. He retired on June 30, 1932, at the age of 71. He died in Tucson, Ariz. on May 7, 1947.(See

The organized trauma care system has been working in Southern Arizona longer than in any other part of the nation, thanks to Dr. Goodfellow, who is often considered the first civilian trauma surgeon. While in Tombstone in the 1880's, he developed the technique, still in use, of mandatory laparatomy for all abdominal gunshot wounds. Dr. Goodfellow later practiced in Tucson at St. Mary's and at his own hospital in the Orndorff Hotel. He did the first trauma surgery in Southern Arizona, and later the first trauma surgery in Tucson.
