Introduction

Set in the fictiticious London Borough of Walford, E20, EastEnders focuses on the multi-racial community who live and work in and around Albert Square.

Since the first episode – broadcast on 19 February 1985, at 7 pm, to an audience of 17 million viewers – it has captured the imagination of audiences around the globe. Addicts know the families, love the nice characters, hate villains and trouble-makers, and discuss the major storylines as if they were events happening in their own lives.

Fan clubs have sprung up world-wide and the BBC's official EastEnders internet site at **www.bbc.co.uk/eastenders/** is one of the most visited on the web.

EastEnders moves effortlessly between comedy and tragedy, and though it never shies away from dealing with social issues, it is good family entertainment, enjoyed by people of all ages.

EastEnders is consistently winning viewers' awards, but it has also been awarded Best Drama at BAFTA, an unique accolade for a soap. In all, *EastEnders* has won 34 awards, including several Best Actor and Best Actress. Barbara Windsor, who plays pub landlady Peggy Mitchell, was awarded the Member of the Order of the British Empire in the New Millennium Honours List.

With average weekly audiences of 20 million in Britain, *EastEnders* scores consistently high in the ratings. Christmas episodes do especially well, often topping the hotly contested chart. Two episodes share the highest-ever ratings: 25 December 1986 when 27.9 million views tuned in to watch pub landlord 'Dirty Den' Watts serve divorce papers on his neurotic wife, Angie; and New Year's Day, 1987, when Tiffany Butcher was killed.

EastEnders is put together by five/six production teams in rotation and a large pool of established writers. The series' headquarters is at BBC Elstree where it has its own specially built lot.

A number of BBC books and videos have been published to accompany the series, and several of the stars have had hit records in the pop charts.

Last month, *EastEnders* celebrated its 15th birthday. The BBC invited viewers to phone in their votes for their favourite episode and was besieged with callers. As the soap's popularity continues to grow, it's certain that EastEnders will still be topping the charts in 15 years' time!

The Murder in the Club

Matthew Rose reduced his former nightclub boss, Steve Owen, to a quivering wreck in revenge for the months he wrongly spent behind bars over the killing of Saskia Duncan.Matthew pushed him to breaking point by pouring what Steve thought was petrol around him and convincing him he would be set alight.

The Crash

The Mitchell twins' bust-up was typically violent. When Grant slept with Phil's ex in revenge over Sharongate, Phil snapped. After holding Grant at gunpoint, he drove their car into the Thames, with both of them in it.

Den Watts

David Wicks

The lecherous love-rat began his sojourn in Albert Square by trying to seduce Bianca Jackson, unaware that she was his daughter. His affair with Cindy Beale caused a scandal, but he ditched her when she left lan, then had brief fling with Bianca's married mum Carol before he took himself abroad.
