The Establishment of the EXPO'75 Association

À meeting of the founding fathers of what was soon to become the Japan Association for the International Ocean Exposition, Okinawa, 1975 was held on January 25, 1972. At this meeting, a proposal for the establishment of the Association as a non-profit corporation was adopted. The stated intention of the organization would be to gather knowledge and experience from various governmental, economic and cultural circles, aimed at insuring success in view of the meaning and purpose of the event, which commemorated the reversion of Okinawa.

The Japan Association for the International Ocean Exposition, Okinawa, 1975 was formally established on February 1, 1972, having been sanctioned by the Minister of International Trade and Industry, and was headed by Dr. Nobumoto Ohama. The Association'' Tokyo office was opened on the same day, whereas the Okinawa office was opened in Naha on February 25.

EMPLACEMENT

Selection of the site

The first important task for the preparation of the Ocean Exposition was the selection of a site.

On November 24, 1971, the Government of Ryukyus established the 'International Ocean Exposition Promotion Headquarters' with Mr. Chobyo Yara, Chief Executive of the Government of the Ryukyus island, as President. À site selection committee was then immediately organized and, on February 20, 1972, based on its report, the Government of the Ryukyus asked the Government of Japan to approve the environs of Motobu Peninsula as the Exposition site.

After studding the five items submitted by the Ryukyuan Government to justify selection of the site, the Japanese Government, in a February 29 Cabinet meeting decided to approve the proposal. 100Ha (250 acres)
