"Artistic Achievement in Nature Appreciation"

Aesthetically appreciating nature is one common and valuable way in which human beings interact with the natural world. This talk constructs a new model of aesthetic appreciation of nature based on an analogy between nature appreciators and performing artists.





This model is able to account for the artistic contribution of nature appreciators, an element that is usually overlooked and is crucial to understanding the theoretical nature and practical implications of nature appreciation.

Professor Lintott, a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, teaches in the Department of Philosophy and Religion, Appalachian State University.
