




AUSTRALIA DAY PHOTOGRAPHY COMPETITION



Under new laws, they must now stay at school until they turn 16 or finish Year 10, whichever comes first.

The school has been planning for some time to ensure the smooth transition to the new system.

Previously young people could leave school at 15 without any requirement to undertake any further training or education.



Now, unless they are working a minimum of 25 hours a week, young people must stay in education or training until they turn 17 or complete their senior phase of education.

Our Year 10 students will work with their teachers to develop individual Senior Education and Training Plans, mapping their future goals and ways to achieve them.

With greater focus on choice and flexibility in their studies, they will receive the tuition, training and work experience to make the most of their individual talents and abilities.

These young people will also be the first to be eligible for the new Queensland Certificate of Education that replaces the current Senior Certificate in 2008.


