A D Henderson – Deceased 17th March 2005

Eastern Suburbs Vice-President for 10 years, was born at Bronte on 18 February 1917, but was educated at Parramatta High School, also the Alma Mater of Australia's Test cricket captain Richie Benaud.

Allin started with Easts 4ths in 1937, skippered the 3rds to rise to reserve and first grade a three quarter, mainly winger. He played with the firsts from 1939 until he went away with the AIF in 1941. He did not return to football until 1947.

In 1948 Allin began 11years of coaching. He was coach of Easts fourths 1948-53 (six seasons). Reserves 1954-55, firsts 1956, 57, 58. Easts 4ths were premiers in 1950, runners-up in 1953, reserves 1955 premiers.

Allin continued to serve Easts as a selector, committeeman and in 1966 was made Vice President, his association with the club spanning more than 30 years.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure in submitting to members my initial report as President. In reviewing our scorecard I would describe the year as a reasonably successful one in most if not all facets of our club, punctuated by significant changes in several areas either imposed upon us or implemented by us.

In brief some of the numerous 2005 highlights being as follows:

- 1st Grade finished in 4th place in the NSW Premiership, making the minor semi-finals of the Toohey's New Cup for the first time since its inception.
- 4th Grade ended in 4th place in the Henderson Cup.
- 1st Grade Colts concluded the season in 4th position, narrowly losing their minor semi-final by 1 point.
- We retained a majority of players from 2004 and conducted a strong recruitment program, with a number of "professional" players joining our club from the Brumbies in particular.
- Adam Wallace-Harrison, our 1st Grade Captain was selected for the end of year Wallaby tour of Europe.
- Adam and Tamaiti Horua were selected in the Australia A team to play the NZ Maori.
- Initiated inaugural Greg Smith Memorial Shield to be played annually between Easts and Randwick.
- Gate takings increased substantially over 2004 and we hosted two successful rugby functions for members, sponsors and guests.
- Implemented a successful ground management plan in conjunction with council and supporters, that significantly improved the playing surface of Woollahra No. 1.
- Introduction of regular email newsletters improved our communication to members and sponsors significantly.
- Our active membership has increased to 793 members with a much improved database integrity.
- We welcomed a new major sponsor to our club, whilst total sponsorship income increased significantly over 2004.
- We have hosted numerous "elite" sporting teams at Woollahra including the Wallabies, Auckland, NSW Country and the Kangaroos to name a few.
- Poker machine revenue has increased and we have developed a strong relationship with the Eastern Suburbs Bridge Club.

On the negative side:

- The NSW TAB cancelled our TAB facility and service agreement as part of their turnover review process. The loss was only weeks prior to the Melbourne Cup.
- Our net result for the year returned a loss, primarily due to a number of extra-ordinary non-recurring items. (refer Treasurer's Report).
- We have had to review and reduce the type of functions conducted at the club due to potential risk of conflict with our neighbours.

- The number of games we host at Woollahra has reduced substantially due to changes in the NSWRU Premiership format, this has had a negative impact upon bar revenue.
- We were forced to shift dates of a couple of rugby functions, however those conducted at the start and end of the season proved to be successful.

So, all in all I am confident that a majority of members would agree, it has been a reasonably successful year and importantly a year in which we substantially improved our on field rugby performance. It goes without saying of course that our challenge is to build on our 2005 result and improve further, to ensure Easts retains a position as a financially secure top tier rugby club in Australia with success across all competitions we compete within.

It would be remiss of me if I did not recognise and congratulate our senior coaching staff of Michael Doyle, Scott Bowen and Mark Bell for repositioning Easts as one of the top performing clubs in the Sydney Rugby Premiership. A dedicated and talented group of players and management staff of Adam Crane and Matt Ramsay supported these fine coaches.

Space does not allow me to go into too much further details other than noting on behalf of the Board of Directors I would like to thank all coaches, managers, volunteer and support staff inclusive of time keepers, managers, co-ordinators, gear stewards etc for their tireless efforts throughout the season and I encourage all members to read the respective team reports as acknowledgment of their individual efforts.

Mid year, the Board of Directors agreed that it was no longer viable to continue with the consolidated role of General Manager and Head Coach, undertaken by Michael Doyle over the last two years. Therefore the position was made redundant at the end of September 2005. Simply it was considered the role was too vast and extensive for any one person and that in future, football operations and licensed club management needed to be separated to ensure the correct focus and attention to deliver the sustainable results.

Since that time Michael Doyle has also decided to put on hold his immediate coaching career and has after a selection process been offered and accepted the Rugby Management role. Michael assumed this “new” role in November.

As a result I am also pleased to confirm that our senior 1st Grade coaching staff for 2006 to be:

I would personally like to thank Michael on behalf of the Board. Michael assisted greatly in turning this club around 180 degrees from 2002 where we made a substantial financial loss, and our rugby performance was well below expectations.

To the family and friends of members and past members who have passed away during the year, I extend on behalf of the club our deepest sympathy.

Without the support of our kind sponsors of all sizes and types, I doubt if we would be where we are today or what we are today. Clearly without your generous financial support Easts Rugby would not be able to fulfill the important role we believe we play in the health and well being of our community.

To the wonderful support and administration staff at Easts, Jeni, Bek and Brad all of whom have carried out their roles and functions with enthusiasm and passion under at times difficult circumstances, I and the Board also thank you.

To my fellow Board Members, thank you for your support and expertise throughout my first year as President. Your skills and tireless investment in time is invaluable in ensuring our Club's viability and longevity.

Finally to our membership, players, supporters and suppliers, I would also like to thank you for your ongoing support of Easts Rugby. I encourage you all to do all you can to promote "our" club in a positive light and to patronise the club whenever you can in the coming year.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Overview

The financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2005 are included in the Annual Report for your review. The results show a loss of \$19,613 compared to a profit of \$88,379 in 2004.

While this overall result is disappointing, a number of one off costs relating to legal disputes, employment costs and bad debts have masked what would otherwise have been a pleasing financial result.

Revenue

While bar trading is significantly lower than last year, it should not be forgotten that the 2004 takings benefited from the Rugby World Cup. Nevertheless, the revised competition format during the year was certainly damaging to our trade. Full credit to the House team who managed to keep our margins at levels close to 2004 continuing the improvement on previous years.

Sponsorship income and membership income have both been success stories in 2005, reversing the declines that have been experienced by both in recent years. Thanks to Alan Williamson and Rob Stenberg respectively for their efforts in these areas. The decline in the number of functions being held at the Club continued in 2005 with our income from this area being minimal. Thankfully, this was offset by the income we received from the Bridge Club for rent of the function room, a relationship we are hoping to develop further in 2006. The two fundraising lunches held in the clubhouse were both very successful thanks to the generosity of the members and the friends of the Club who volunteered their time to speak at these functions.

Expenditure

Our 2005 results were impacted by a number of one off costs including:

- Legal fees relating to dispute with caterer.
- Write off of 2004 sponsorship debtor.
- Increased workers compensation costs following armed robbery in late 2003.
- General Manager redundancy costs.

Cost of player payments also increased when compared to 2004 although I thank Craig Irwin and Mike Doyle for keeping these under control and within the agreed budget.

Financial position

Continued improvement in financial discipline has enabled us to further reduce our trade creditor balances. This has been possible by also improving our debtor collections with all balances outstanding at year end now collected.

I submit the financial report to members.

Notes to the Financial Statements FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2005

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial report preparation requirements of the Corporations Act 2001. The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity. Eastern Suburbs District Rugby Union Football Club Limited (“the Club”) is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Application of Accounting Standards

This special purpose financial report has been prepared for distribution to the members to fulfil the directors’ financial reporting requirements under the Corporations Act 2001.

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report, as described below are, in the opinion of the directors, appropriate to meet the needs of members:

- a) The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis of accounting including the historical cost convention and the going concern assumption.
- b) By virtue of Accounting Standard AASB 1025: Application of the Reporting Entity Concept and Other Amendments, the requirements of Accounting Standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and other professional reporting requirements do not have mandatory applicability to the Club in relation to the year ended 30 September 2004 because the directors have determined that the Club is not a reporting entity. However, the directors have determined that in order for the financial report to give a true and fair view of the Club’s performance, cash flows and financial position, the requirements of Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements relating in Australia to the measurement of assets, liabilities, revenues, expenses and equity should be complied with.

Accordingly, the directors have prepared the financial report in accordance with Accounting Standards and other professional reporting requirements in Australia with the following exceptions:

The accounting policies used in the preparation of this report are consistent with those of the previous year.

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

Notes to the Financial Statements FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2005

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES *(Continued)*

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

Income Tax

The company considers its operations to be exempt from income tax under Section 50.5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 in that the Club was established for the encouragement and promotion of the game of Rugby Union.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost. All assets, excluding freehold land, are depreciated over their useful lives to the company.

The Directors by Resolution have acknowledged the substantial involvement by the foundation members of the Club in its establishment in 1962 in providing the Club House and its amenities to members. A conservative estimate of the value of this work is \$400,000. The Directors have resolved to record as a permanent record this asset as a note to the Accounts. The Club House is built on leasehold land and no guarantee can be given that this amount would be realised if the Club House were sold.

Depreciation rates used for each class of asset are:

Leases

Leases of fixed assets, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset, but not the legal ownership, are transferred to the company, are classified as finance leases. Finance leases are capitalised, recording an asset and a liability equal to the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Leased assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives where it is likely that the entity will obtain ownership of the asset, or over the term of the lease. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for the period.

Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Costs are assigned on a first-in first-out basis.

Notes to the Financial Statements FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2005

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES *(Continued)*

Employee Entitlements and Benefits

Employee entitlements expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, annual leave and sick leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at their nominal amount. Contributions are made by the economic entity to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

Liability of Members

The liability of the members is limited. Clause 6 of the Memorandum of the Association of the Club provides that every member of the Club undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Club in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member or within one year afterwards for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Club contracted before the time at which he ceases to be a member of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up the Club for the adjustment of the rights of contributories amongst themselves such an amount as may be required not exceeding four dollars. At 30 September 2005 the number of the members was 793 (2004: 612).

Cash

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and at call deposits with bank and financial institutions.

Revenue

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST) where applicable.

Restatement of prior year balances

2004 revenue and expense items have been represented to conform with 2005 categories. This has not changed the net result. Changes include:

- Reallocation of certain house related costs from administration to house expense (eg cleaning, Foxtel).
- Separate reporting of revenue not specific to house such as member subscriptions as other.
- Allocation of General Manager/Head Coach salary between coaching and administration salaries.
- Allocation of superannuation costs to relevant wage expense.

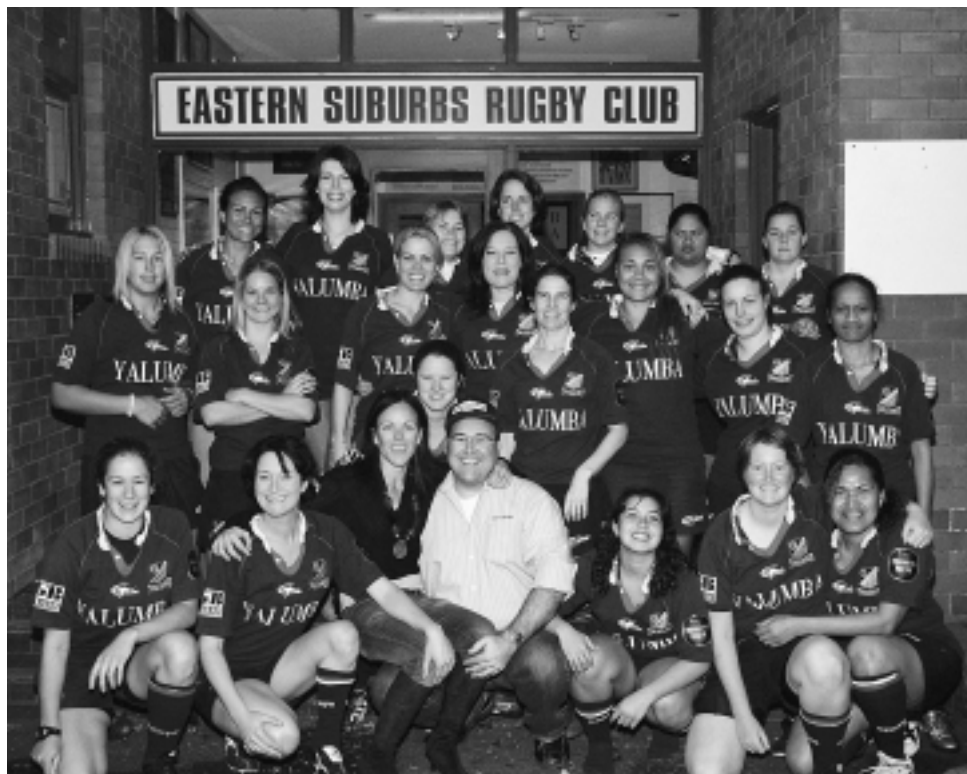
