

PRESS BOX: The Kentucky State press box is for working press/media only. Each seat is equipped with a power outlet for convenience. Radio, film, and coach's booths are located on the press box level. Admittance to the press box is by credential only.

PRESS CREDENTIALS: Credentials for working media at Kentucky State's home games against Lenoir-Rhyne College, September 3; Fort Valley State University (Homecoming), October 8; Miles College, October 22; and Stillman College, October 29, will be handled by Ron Braden, Sports Information Director, 502-597-6019 or rbraden@gwmail.kysu.edu

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Photo Credentials will be issued for sideline photography only.

MEDIA WILL CALL: Press or photo credentials which have not been mailed can be obtained at the Media Will Call window located at Alumni Stadium ticket booth.

MEDIA PARKING: Media Parking at Alumni Stadium is available on a limited basis. Request for parking should be made when applying for press and/or photo credentials.

TELEPHONES: The KSU football press box is equipped with one courtesy telephone line with long-distance capabilities for use by the media on a first-come, first-serve basis. The KSU Sports Information Office strongly suggests each media outlet with deadline restrictions to order their personal phone lines by contacting Mike Rosenstein at 502-597-7000.

VISITING RADIO: The official visiting radio broadcast should be designated in writing by the visiting team's Sports Information Director. Phone lines must be installed for all visiting networks, who should contact Mike Rosenstein at 502-597-7000.

PRESS SERVICES: The KSU Sports Information Office will provide a complete pre-game packet, including fact sheets, statistics, and a game program prior to kickoff. During the contest, KSU will provide play-by-play and statistics reports for the first and second halves, as well as final statistics. A hospitality area is also available to the media.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS: KSU head coach Fred T. Farrier will be available for comments approximately 25 minutes after each game in the designated interview room. Players will also be available for comments at that time.

FOOTBALL PRACTICE: KSU Football practices are generally open to the public. If you wish to attend practice, contact Ron Braden at the Sports Information Office at 502-597-6019 or by e-mail at rbraden@gwmail.kysu.edu. Practices usually begin at 3:15 p.m.

Kentucky State University History

From its modest beginnings as a small normal school for the training of black teachers for the black schools in Kentucky, Kentucky State University has grown and evolved to become the state's unique, small, liberal studies institution, serving students without regard to their race, age, sex, national origin, or economic status. In addition to instruction, research and public service have produced important, although secondary, emphases at the University.

The University was chartered in May 1886 as the State Normal School for Colored Persons, only the second state-supported institution of higher learning in Kentucky. During the euphoria of Frankfort's 1886 centennial celebration, when vivid recollections of the Civil War remained, the city's 4,000 residents were keenly interested in having the new institution located in Frankfort. Toward the end, the city donated \$1,500 - a considerable amount in 1886 dollars - and a site on a scenic bluff overlooking the town. This united display of community enthusiasm and commitment won the day. The new college was located in Frankfort despite competition from several other cities.

Recitation Hall (now Jackson Hall), the college's first building, was erected in 1887. The new school opened on October 11, 1887 with three teachers, 55 students, and John H. Jackson as president.

In 1890 the institution became a land-grant college, and the departments of home economics, agriculture, and mechanics were added to the school's curriculum. The school produced its first graduating class of five students in the spring of that year. A high school was organized in 1893. This expansion continued into the 20th century in both name and program. In 1902, the name was changed, and again in 1926 to Kentucky State Industrial College for Colored Persons. In the early 1930's the high school was discontinued, and in 1938 the school was named the Kentucky State College for Negroes. The term "for Negroes" was dropped in 1952. Kentucky State College became a university in 1972, and in 1973 the first graduate students enrolled in its School of Public Affairs.

Over the past 25 years the University's enrollment and faculty have more than doubled, and 29 new structures or major building expansions have enhanced the Kentucky State University's 511-acre campus, which includes a 203-acre agricultural research farm.

The year 1986 marked the University' centennial anniversary and its evolution over the previous century into a coeducation, liberal arts institution.

Thorobred Football Outlook 2005

This time of the year football coaches all over the country at every level of competition are chomping at the bit in anticipation of the upcoming football preseason training camp. Coach Fred T. Farrier, newly appointed head football coach for Kentucky State University, is no different.

Coach Farrier, who will be entering his first season as a collegiate head coach, replaced last years interim head coach Cornell Burbage. Farrier is taking over a program that has finished the past two seasons 7-4 with a chance to win the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SIAC) each year.

"I have watched Kentucky State University from afar and KSU has all the makings to be a champion on the field and in the classroom," Farrier added. "It's an exciting time for KSU as a whole and I'm proud to have a chance to put my personal touch on an already established entity."

According to Coach Farrier the Thorobreds are in great shape. There is a lot of optimism on and around campus. The players are excited and working harder than they have worked before. All things considered, the Breds are off to a solid start to the 2005 season. After completing 3 weeks of morning workouts and 2 full weeks of spring practice, the Breds finished with an exciting spring game that the players played hard in and enjoyed.

"The theme for this year is "You Make the Choice," said Coach Farrier. "We are asking our players to make the conscious decision to be a champion," Coach Farrier adds. "This includes in the classroom, around campus, in the community and on the field. We are changing a mentality and our kids love it. I feel like we have a great start to the season."

A look at the Thorobred Offense:

Running backs

The running game will return two veterans in Roni Robinson and Cassius Chambers. The coaching staff is expecting Robinson and Chambers along with David Thompson to compete in preseason camp for the starting tailback position. Robinson is coming off of a very productive spring where he made a lot of improvements and put himself in position to compete. At fullback, Nick Moore is the starter after a solid spring. We expect Maurice Hicks and Terrell Sowell to battle it out for the backup spot and push Moore for playing time. Incoming freshman Michael Wright will add depth at this position.

Quarterback

Shawn Johnson returns with the most experience after splitting time last season with Joe McBride. Brandon Adams moves back to quar-

terback after playing wide receiver last year and will challenge Shawn for the starting spot. Both had a very productive spring and showed signs that they are very capable of running the new offense. Incoming freshman Caleb Midera comes to Frankfort with impressive prep credentials and will stake his claim to become the Thorobred signal caller. This position has depth and we are in good shape.

Offensive line

The Breds' return 2 starters from last year's team, Travis McCullough and Wayne Jones. There will be some gaps to fill with the departure of some seniors. Artavious Williams, Tony Senat and Tavares Dishmon will have a chance to earn starting spots. Incoming freshmen Jonathan Fowlkes, James Jenkins and Phil Leonard should all add depth and compete for playing time once they learn the new offense.

Tight ends

Danny Hawkins, the basketball player, will show his versatility as the starter at tight end. Zach Davis will challenge Hawkins for the starting spot and give the Thorobreds an added dimension of having two very capable tight ends.

Fred T. Farrier

Head Football Coach

Fred Farrier comes to Kentucky State University as the 29th head football coach in Thorobred history. Coach Farrier comes to Frankfort from Raleigh, North Carolina where he was the offensive coordinator and associate head coach for the 2004 season.

While at Shaw, the Bears won the CIAA conference championship and Pioneer Bowl, defeating two SIAC teams along the way. The Bears were very successful offensively in the CIAA conference and placed two offensive players on the All-CIAA 1st Team, one player on the 2nd team and two players on the Daktronics All-Southeast Region Team. The Bears were able to win the CIAA championship in football after only two seasons of NCAA football since reviving the program in 2002.

As associate head coach at Shaw University Coach Farrier was responsible for managing all aspects of the team's budget, travel, hotels, meals and transportation. Coach Farrier was also the co-host for the weekly Shaw Bears radio show.

Coach Farrier joined the Tennessee Tech coaching staff shortly before the 2001 season to work with the team's receivers and had a huge impact on the record-setting success of the Golden Eagle passing game for three seasons. He also served as the Golden Eagle recruiting coordinator, coordinating their nation-wide effort to attract top talent to Cookeville. In three seasons at Tech, Farrier helped the Golden Eagle offense establish 36 offensive school records with several standout receivers. During his time in Cookeville the Golden Eagle receivers recorded eleven 100-yard plus receiving games.

His coaching career began at Michigan State, where he served two seasons as a graduate assistant coach with the Spartans. He coached with the MSU wide receivers in 1998 and 1999 under head coach Nick Saban, including working with NFL standout receivers Plaxico Burress and Gari Scott.

Coach Farrier was the wide receivers coach and recruiting coordinator at Saginaw Valley State University in 2000. That season he was privileged to coach the GLIAC conference player of the year and All-America selection in Brian Dolph. In 2000, the Cardinals won the GLIAC conference title and a berth to the NCAA Division II playoffs.

Farrier's knowledge of the game is also well documented, including two articles published in Coach and Athletic Director magazines. "Blocking With A Purpose" was published in September, 2002 and "Winning At The Line Of Scrimmage: 5 Steps To Beating Press Coverage" was published in April, 2003. Farrier had a third article published in the Black Coaches Association Journal in January of 2004, titled, Professional Development: 10 Steps to Develop Better Coaches. In April of 2005, Coach Farrier was published in The Extra Point magazine with an article titled Establish Your Run Game.

Coach Farrier was a participant and graduate of the 2005 NCAA Coach's Academy's Advanced Coaching Program that identifies outstanding minority coaches in football with the potential to become Division I-A head coaches. Coach Farrier also received his master's degree from Tennessee Tech in May of 2005 in Instructional Leadership.

During his collegiate playing career, Farrier earned two letters as a wide receiver at the College of the Holy Cross. The Crusaders posted an 11-0 mark in 1991, while garnering the East Coast Athletic Conference Team of the Year Award and sporting a 20-game winning streak from 1990 through 1991. Farrier also played basketball and received his bachelor's degree in economics and accounting in 1994.

During his prep career at Cleveland Heights (Ohio) High School, Fred was a two-time all-conference selection in both football and basketball. Coach Farrier and his wife, Danita, reside in Frankfort with their son, Fred II.

Thorobred Football Outlook 2005 continued

Wide Receivers

The Thorobreds will be very young at wide receiver. Derek Talbert and return Jeremy Douglas will have the most experience, Jeremy Douglas. We will expect big things from Juwan Jones and Jerome Bryant. Someone will have to step up for us at this position.

A look at the Thorobred Defense:

Linebackers

The Breds return two starters from last year's team in middle linebacker Kelvin Harvey and outside linebacker Tim Vaughn. Randy Driver will most likely join as the third starter after making the switch from safety. Look for Ray Huff and Joe White to push for playing time and add depth at the position.

Defensive line

We took a big hit from graduation but will be held steady by defensive ends Jason Sneed, Abraham Jackson and Innoent Verneuil. Inside we will be led by junior Herbert Maze and Rob Beal should challenge for the other inside spot. Dwight Cummings and Morris Jordan should provide depth.

Secondary

This is the most experienced group on the team. We will be led by returning senior starters at corner in Marcus Wright, a preseason awards candidate, and Brandon Fairley. Courtney Reed, Josh Enoch and Slyving Bordeaux will add depth. Robert Brown will be the starter at strong safety after making the switch from linebacker. Leonard Banks emerged from spring as the starter at free safety. Jermaine Washington, Terrell Henderson and Kerry Guy will also compete for a starting spot at safety in preseason

A look at the Thorobred Special Teams:

Special Teams

The kicking game is one of the more experienced areas for the Thorobreds and that experience will be counted on to lead to improved special teams play. The Thorobreds finished in the top half of the conference in every phase of the kicking game. Returning kicker Stephen Harris handled all of the kicking duties last season. As a freshman, Harris averaged 37.0 yards a punt and also connected on 29 of his 33 extra point attempts. Marcus Wright will once again handle the kick and punt return duties after leading the Thorobreds and ranking fourth in the SIAC in punt returns with a 15.1 yards per return average. As a junior he also finished third in kick returns with a 29.4 yards per return average. Also look for Jerome Bryant and Derek Talbert to help with the kick and punt return responsibilities.

Gregory Green, a native of Cleveland, Ohio, comes to Kentucky State University from Tuskegee University. Coach Green spent four seasons at Tuskegee (2000-2004) serving as their Defensive Coordinator, Defensive Line and Special Teams Coach.

While at Tuskegee, Coach Green's defense registered a perfect 12-0 season in 2000 which earned the Golden Tigers a National Black College Championship, Pioneer Bowl Championship and was named Sheridan Black Network Team of the Year. In 2001, the Golden Tigers recorded an 11-1 record which included a SIAC Championship and Pioneer Bowl Championship. In 2002, the Golden Tigers were 10-1 and gained another SIAC Championship and in 2004, they went 10-2.

Before his tenure at Tuskegee, Green served three years (1989-92) as an assistant football coach at his alma mater, Winona State University, Winona, Minn. He later took a position at John Marshall High School in Cleveland, Ohio and worked there for one year as the defensive coordinator, 1992-93. Green spent one year, 1993, as the defensive coordinator for the Cleveland Falcons, a semi-pro team in Cleveland, Ohio. From 1995-2000, he held positions at Savannah State University, Savannah, Ga., as the recruiting coordinator (strength coach), head tennis coach and defensive line and line-backer coach, respectively.

Green is a 1992 graduate of Winona State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in psychology. He is currently working on a master's degree in psychology at Winona State University.

He played collegiate football at 1-AA Sam Houston State University (Texas) in 1985 and 1986, winning two conference championship rings. In addition, Green spent time with the Cleveland Browns and Dallas Cowboys of the National Football League.

In addition to his football duties, Green coached the men and women's tennis teams at Tuskegee. His women's tennis team captured the 2000 SIAC Tennis Championship and Green was named the SIAC Coach of the Year. In 2004, Green guided his Tuskegee men's tennis team to the SIAC Championship and an NCAA Tournament berth. He received SIAC Coach of the Year honors for both teams in 2004. He led the 2005 Tuskegee men and women's tennis teams to SIAC championships and berths in the NCAA Region Tournament. The SIAC named him Coach of the Year for women and the Tournament Coach of the Year for men and women in 2005. He also served as the head tennis coach at Savannah State for four years and was named the SIAC Coach of the Year twice. His tennis teams only lost two conference matches in four years at Savannah State.

Green was named the 2004-2005 Tuskegee University Department of Athletics' Coach of the Year.

As defensive line coach in 1990 at SSU, the Tigers' defense was ranked as the #1 defense in the nation. While serving as linebacker coach in '95, SSU had the #1 defense against the pass.

Coach Green, who had a NFL internship with Mike Ditka's New Orleans Saints in 1998, is a member of the American Football Coaches Association and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Green and his wife, Jacquelyn, are the proud parents of four children: Kira, Kesha, Jazmine and Gregory Jr.



Jay Miller Assistant Coach -Linebackers

Coach Miller comes to Kentucky State by way of Delta State University, where he spent the 2004 season coaching the safeties and special teams on a team ranked in the top 10 for much of the season. At Delta State, Miller coached 2 all-conference defensive backs and helped guide the Statesmen to a third place finish in the Gulf South Conference after playing one of the toughest schedules in the country.

Prior to Delta State, he spent the 2001, 2002, and 2003 seasons at Norcross High School in Gwinnett County, Georgia. At Norcross, he coached quarterbacks, running backs and served as Special Teams Coordinator coaching a number of All-County performers.

Miller began his coaching career in 1999 at P.K. Yonge High School in Gainesville, Florida where he coached the wide receivers. During his two-year stint at P.K. Yonge from 1999 to 2000, he was part of back-to-back district championship teams and coached 2 All-District players.

Miller was a standout wide receiver and All-Europe baseball player in high school, playing overseas at the International School of Brussels, Belgium. He went on to play collegiate baseball at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia; where he earned his B.A. in Biology. After graduating in 1999, he went on to earn a Master's degree at the University of Florida in 2001.

Miller resides in Georgetown and enjoys fishing, playing golf, and spending time with his family. He is married to the former Tonya Lynn Brown of Oxford, Florida and they have a son, Jackson.

Coach Boykin is entering his first season as an assistant coach on the Thorobred staff. He brings 15 years of college football experience to the program. He spent the last two seasons at Ball State University as the Running Backs coach and the Special Teams Coordinator. In 2004 he coached the Mid-American Conference freshmen of the year, Adell Givens.

Coach Boykin began his coaching career in 1995 at Otterbein College, where he worked with the Wide Receivers and Special Teams. In 1997 he moved on to Akron University as a graduate assistant coach, working with the Wide Receivers. Coach Boykin next moved on to Boston College in 1998, as a graduate assistant coach again working with the Wide Receivers. In 1999 Coach Boykin moved to full time status, at Tiffin University where he was the Special Team Coordinator and the Wide Receiver coach. There he coached, 3 All-Conference players, and a 1st Team All-American. In 2000 Coach Boykin went back to his alma mater, Youngstown State University where he spent 3 seasons as the Special Teams Coordinator and Wide Receiver coach. In 2003 Coach Boykin moved on to Ball State University, where he coached the Running Backs and was the Special Teams Coordinator.

Coach Boykin was a three-year starter at Youngstown State University; helping the Penguins to 1991, 1993 and 1994 NCAA Division 1-AA National Championships. Boykin, who completed his career ranked second in school history with 150-career receptions and fifth with 1,980 career receiving yards, and was Youngstown State University, Offensive Player of the year as a senior in 1994. Coach Boykin played professionally for the Canadian Football League's Hamilton Tiger Cats in 1994, plus spent the 1995 season in Spain with the Albany Firebirds of the Arena Football League.

Coach Boykin received his Bachelor's in communications in 1995. He is a native of Kent, Oh. In his spare time he enjoys golfing, working out and being with his family.

Kenny Wilhite will be entering his first season with the Thorobreds. Wilhite brings a wealth of experience and enthusiasm to the Thorobreds program.

Wilhite, a St. Louis, MO., native, was a standout junior college quarterback at Dodge City Community college in Dodge City Kansas. He was a two-time all-conference and first-team junior college quarterback who gained 1500 yards rushing and passing for 28 touchdowns in a 2 year career. As a senior at Nebraska, he was voted honorable mention All-Big Eight by league coaches, while leading his team with 7 knockdowns, and was tied for the team lead in interceptions with three. One of his interceptions was returned 49-yards to set up the winning score in a victory at Missouri. Wilhite's 6 interceptions as a junior left him one short of a Cornhusker season record.

After a great college career, Wilhite signed a free agent contract with the Chicago Bears in 1993. He was released on the last cut day and was signed with the Canadian Football Leagues' (CFL) Sacramento Goldminers. During a 51/2 year span, Wilhite played for 3 different CFL teams. His best year was in 1996 with the Ottawa Rough Riders. That year he made 43 tackles and three interceptions, returning them back for 119 yards. He was second CFL in punt returns with 718 yards on 70 punts and led the CFL with 1,167 yards in 57 kickoff returns. His 2,245 all-purpose yardages ranked him third in the CFL. That year he also finished 3rd in MVP voting for the CFL behind Doug Flutie.

Wilhite has five years of coaching experience on the collegiate level. He started at New Mexico State University as Volunteer Assistant Defensive Back Coach for two seasons. He then back to his alma mater Dodge City Community College as defensive Back Coach for one season. After that, he spent three seasons at Emporia State University.

Coach Wilhite has a daughter named Kianna L. Wilhite.

Kris Sweet, a 1996 graduate of Carson-Newman College, begins his first season as an assistant coach with the Thorobreds.

Sweet came to Kentucky State University from Presbyterian College after serving as offensive line coach for the past five seasons. Before going to Presbyterian, Sweet was the defensive ends coach at Elon College during the 1999 season.

Prior to his stint at Elon College, Sweet spent one season as center and guard coach at the College of the Holy Cross in 1998 and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Tennessee Technological University in Cookeville, Tenn., where he worked with former Blue Hose offensive coordinator Jeff Fela.

Sweet, a native of Salem, Va., played football at Carson-Newman College, earning three varsity letters on the gridiron. During his career with the Eagles, he was a member of three South Atlantic Conference regular season championship squads and each team advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs. Sweet's teams compiled a three-year mark of 25-8-1 and a 19-2 mark in the SAC.

Sweet earned a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education from Carson-Newman in 1995 and he earned his master's degree of education at his alma mater in 1996.

Thorobred History

Origin of the "Thorobred" nickname

Many people believe Kentucky State got its nickname of Thorobreds from the fact that the state of Kentucky is noted for its horses and the famed Kentucky Derby. But this is not true. Dr. Henry Cheaney, a retired professor at Kentucky State, says the name was coined back in the early 1930's by Henry Arthur Kean. Kean was the coach of the football, basketball and baseball teams back in those days and it was said the nickname came from one of his great football teams which included National Championship teams in 1934 and 1937. The story goes that he was talking to a spectator about one of those great football teams and said "these boys run and play like a bunch of THOROBREDS." That name was finally adopted as the official nickname for all Kentucky State Athletic teams.

Thorobreds 1997 Bowl Appearance was the 7th

Kentucky State's appearance in the Pioneer Bowl in December 1997 was the seventh bowl contest in which the University has participated.

The Breds played in the Orange Blossom Classic in 1935 when it beat Florida A&M 19-10. In 1928 A&M topped the Breds 9-7. In 1971, A&M beat the Breds 27-9 and in 1975, 40-13.

Other bowl appearances came in 1943 when the Breds beat Prairie View 19-13 in the Prairie View Bowl which was discontinued in 1962, and in 1948 when Kentucky State beat North Carolina A&T 23-13 in the Vulcan Bowl.

Kentucky State has won 11 National Championships

Kentucky State has had eleven National Championship teams in its athletic history. The Kentucky State basketball team, which won three straight NAIA Championships in 1970-72, leads the way. The 1971 track team won the NCAA College Division Championship, the 1964 cross country team won the NCAA College Division Championship, and the 1934 and 1937 football teams were National Champions. The 1981 women's basketball team won the NAIA National Championship.

Lucias Mitchell coached all three basketball championship teams; Dr. Ken Gibson was the track coach; Dr. William Exum the cross country mentor; Henry Arthur Kean the football coach; Ron Mitchell the women's basketball coach; and Ralph Pardue the golf coach won the National Minority College Golf Championship in 1998. Ron Braden, as golf coach, won the university's first national championship in the new millennium, winning the 2000 National Minority College Golf Championship.

Henry Arthur Kean

Henry Arthur Kean was appointed Head Coach and Athletics Director at Kentucky State in 1931. He became known as "Kentucky's molder of championship grid teams." He claimed that his team was given the nickname "Notre Dame" not only because a number of players made All-American on the gridiron but because he instilled in his players a confidence within themselves which lasted long after the gun had ended the game.

A native of Louisville and a graduate of Fisk University, where he had the distinction of being a four-letter man, Henry Arthur ranked as one of the most versatile athletes ever turned out by that school. He earned his graduate degree in Physical Education from Indiana University. He was the topic of sports conversation as far back as the decade of the 1920's, when he was a star in football, basketball, baseball and tennis.

Upon graduation, H.A. Kean taught Mathematics for ten years at Louisville's Central High School, where he also served as Coach. To further advance his coaching techniques, he took special courses under Knute Rockne and other famous

coaches. With his excellence in that field, he earned an enviable record as a football and basketball official, being called hundreds of miles to officiate in some of the biggest college games in the country.

After Kean took the position at Kentucky State University, the Thorobreds established a record of having traveled more miles than any other college in history. They played in four major conferences and in all of the "Bowls". They dominated football for ten years. They were National Champions three times and Midwest Athletic Association Champions ten straight years.

Two of Kean's players, Joe (Tarzan) Kendall and George (Big Bertha) Edwards were selected on every All-American team during their respective years of service. It was concluded that his record was not based solely on Kean's coaching ability but due to some extent, to his ability as a leader of youth and maker of men.

Henry Arthur Kean left KSU in 1943 to accept a position as Coach at Tennessee State in Nashville where he served until his death in 1955.


