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Des Moines Public Schools Minority Enrollment Report Executive Summary

November 2005

Racial minority enrollment in the Des Moines Public Schools is 36.0%, which is up from 34.3% last year. The percentage of minority enrollment in the Des Moines Public Schools has increased each year since 1989.

Hispanic students continue to constitute most of the minority increase. In 1996 the Des Moines Public Schools served an equal number of Asian and Hispanic students; each group made up 5.1% of the total enrollment. In 2005 the Asian students are 4.7% of the enrollment while the Hispanic enrollment (14.2%) is closer to that of the African Americans (16.5%). Since 2003 the African American percentage has increased about half a percent a year while the Hispanic population has increased about one percent.

Currently eight elementary buildings are not in compliance with state guidelines because their minority percentage is more than 20% greater than the district minority percentage. They are Adams, Edmunds, King, Madison, McKinley, Monroe, Moulton, and Wallace. Six had a minority percentage more than 20% greater than the elementary percentage of 37.7%. Additional schools have been added to the Voluntary Transfer Program to provide additional options for minority students and to reduce the future minority percentages in these schools.

The state defines students whose native language is other than English as Limited English Proficient (LEP). This year 3,703 students whose native language is other than English are enrolled in the Des Moines Public Schools, up from 3,514 in 2004. Last year 64.4% of the LEP students were Hispanic compared to 65.9% this year. LEP students constitute 11.8% of the students served in the district and 15.4% of the kindergarten enrollment.
