Subject: Hawaii Voter Survey on United States Senate Race

Dear Case for Senate:

You asked QMark Research & Polling to survey current voter attitudes with respect to the September 23rd United States Senate election between Senator Daniel Akaka and Congressman Ed Case.

The survey was conducted from April 21 to May 9, 2006 with 700 likely voters allocated throughout the state. Statistical weighting was applied to the data to show the results proportional to population on each island. The results have an overall margin of error of +/- 3.7 at the 95% level of confidence.

All respondents were asked which candidate they would likely support if the election were held today and the candidates were Akaka and Case. The results are as follows:

Akaka: 40%  
Case: 38%  
Don't know/refused: 22%

Respondents were then asked questions addressing various campaign issues such as relative age, experience and performance and transition and change in Hawaii's Senate representation, after which they were again asked which candidate they would likely support. The results are as follows:

Case: 44%  
Akaka: 39%  
Don't know/refused: 17%
