#### From the Planning Department:

#### **Coming to Terms with Growth**

Not too long ago, Ellington was targeted for a nuclear waste dump. Property values plunged, and tax assessments tubed. You couldn't sell your house if you wanted to.

My, how times have changed.

According to the U.S. Census Bureau, Ellington is the 6<sup>th</sup> fastest growing town in the State. As of July 2003, approximately 13,952 persons called Ellington home. From 2000 to 2003, the Town grew by 8%, adding 1,031 persons. By way of comparison, over the ten years from 1990 to 2000, the town grew by about 15%. For the last few years, median sales prices for homes and median family incomes have both been steadily moving up and up.

There is nothing inherently "bad" about growth. Hundreds of local people are employed in the construction-related trades, not to mention the many local engineers, lawyers, surveyors, bankers, and realtors who also rely upon development for their livelihoods. Families living in new homes also support local businesses, by purchasing goods and services in the community. And for most families, home value appreciation is an important means of accumulating personal wealth.

Therein lies the crux of the growth "problem." Our economic system is based on the primacy of individual freedoms, but the pursuit of short-term self interest undeniably affects our long-term collective welfare. Growth has costs, as well as benefits.

Therefore, on occasion, every community should evaluate whether or not its prudent to adjust the balance between the "me" and the "we," and land use regulation is the arena where opposing ideologies most often do battle. In terms of political economy, it's a big country. From libertarians to socialists to everything in between, we've all got an opinion, a right to express that opinion freely and an obligation to be engaged in important public policy decisions, hopefully in a civil manner.

any nuke dumps in Ellington's future, but I'm pretty sure there'll be a few more subdivisions and some new stores, probably a few less farms too. Tax rates will increase as will the demand for public services. There'll be more traffic and more budget referendums. Ironically, money that was set aside in the FY 04-05 budget to implement recommendations from the recently completed "Build Out" analysis was cut after the third budget referendum.

Supporting planning now, with relatively small investments, could reap enormous dividends in future years. To review or purchase a copy of the Build Out Analysis Report, stop by the Planning Office. A copy is also available for review at the Library. Make your own conclusions about the "we" and the "me." Then talk to your elected leaders to express your opinion. It's your town and your future.

## Property Tax Relief Program

The Town of Ellington is looking for volunteers to serve on an Ad Hoc Committee to study and investigate a Property Tax Relief Program for certain residents age sixty-five or over or permanently and totally disabled. Pursuant to State Statute 12-129n (b) the Committee shall undertake and complete within a period not in excess of sixty days following appointment, study and investigate with respect to such property tax relief and prepare a report to be presented to the Board of Finance regarding the fiscal effect.

#### **VETERAN'S EXEMPTION**

To qualify for a veteran's exemption an individual must have served during a period of war or recognized military conflict and been honorably discharged. Discharge papers (DD214) must be put on file in the Town Clerk's office by September 30<sup>th</sup>.

## DISABLED OR BLIND EXEMPTIONS

Qualifying persons should file for blind or disability exemptions on or before October 1<sup>st</sup>.

## BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY

Business Personal Property Declaration Forms will be mailed in September. These forms must be completed and returned to our office on or before November 1<sup>st</sup>. Failure to report business personal property by the November 1<sup>st</sup> deadline will result in a 25% penalty.

## FARM, FOREST AND OPEN SPACE

Applications for classification of land as farm, forest or open space must be submitted to our office between September 1<sup>st</sup> and October 31<sup>st</sup>. If the ownership of the property has changed a new application must be made in the new owner's name during this period to receive the designation.

### "Water" We Doing in Ellington?

From the Town Engineer......


There is no denying the importance of water in our lives—from the sustenance of life itself to our enjoyment of the summer months here in Ellington. In fact, there is no greater natural resource than water, so it comes as no surprise that Ellington is taking steps to comply with the federal program just recently implemented.

On January 9, 2004, the Water Management Division of the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection issued a mandate that towns file a general permit for the discharge of stormwater from small municipal separate storm sewer systems. A part of the Federal Clean Water Act, it is expected to reduce pollution in the surface waters across the country.

In order to comply with the General Permit, all towns in the State, with minor exceptions, were required to file a General Permit Registration Form with the DEP, which includes the following six minimum control measures to help reduce pollution in stormwater runoff:

- Public education and outreach
- Public participation
- Illicit discharge detection and elimination
- Construction site runoff control
- Post-construction stormwater management
- Pollution prevention and good housekeeping

As a means to educate the citizens of Ellington, this article will appear quarterly with suggestions for residents and business owners about measures everyone can take to help reduce pollution in the stormwater runoff and the surface waters of our Town. We must all take an interest in the welfare of our water—or our good fortune may run dry.

PARK FACILITIES: All parks are open sunrise to sunset.




