
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CENSUS 2001 BRADFORD DISTRICT WARD PROFILES 17. Keighley West

The ward of Keighley West stretches from the town centre southwards and westwards where it borders onto Worth Valley Ward. It contains the areas of Braithwaite, Guardhouse, Laycock, Fell Lane, Exley Head, Bogthorn, Ingrow and Bracken Bank.



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Population

The population of Keighley West is 15,784. It has an age profile similar to that of the District as a whole. 33.9% of the population is under 24 years of age. The average for the District is 35.9%. 14.7% of the population is over 65 years of age, compared to 14.4% for the District as a whole.

Household Composition

In Keighley West, nearly ¼ of households are all pensioner households. This is higher than the District average of 22.8%. The proportion of households comprising a couple with dependent children, 22.1%, is similar to the District average of 22.4%. 9.6% of households in this ward are lone parent families. This is higher than the average for the District - 7.4%.

Household Characteristics

Keighley West ward is similar to the District average in terms of household characteristics. There are fewer overcrowded households but the proportion of households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet is similar to the District average of 23.2%. Over one third of households do not have access to a car/van and 36.7%, have at least one person with a long term limiting illness, compared to 36.4% for the District as a whole.

Housing Type

Semi-detached houses account for nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ of the housing stock in this ward. 35.3% of all dwellings are terraced houses. The proportion of detached houses (9.4%) and the proportion of flats, conversions and shared dwellings (8.8%) are lower than the District average.

Housing Tenure

69.5% of households in Keighley West are homeowners. 21.4% of households rent accommodation from a social housing provider and 9.1% rent from a private landlord.

⁽²⁾ Overcrowding is defined as the number of households having one room too few for the household. A single person household is assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom. Families are assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom for each couple, lone parent, any other person over 16 years, each pair aged 10-15 years of the same sex, each pair formed from a remaining person aged 10-15 years and a child aged under 10 of the same sex, each pair of children aged 10 years and under and each remaining person. This is the definition of overcrowding used by government.

⁽³⁾ Households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet.

⁽⁴⁾ People who responded 'yes' to the question 'Do you have any long term illness, health problems or disability which limits your daily activities or the work you can do?' A prompt asked people to include any problems due to old age.

Work (1)

In Keighley West, 67.1% of all people between the age of 16 and 74 are either working or seeking work (economically active). This is just higher than the District average of 63.4%. The percentage of people who are economically active but unemployed is 6.4%. This is lower than the District average of 6.9%.

Of those who are economically inactive in this age range, 43.4% are retired. The remainder are students, people looking after families/home, the permanently sick or disabled, or people who are inactive for other reasons. The proportion of people who are permanently sick or disabled (20.1%) is higher than the District average of 16.7%.

Unemployment (1)

32.7% of the unemployed in this ward have not worked for two or more years. This is close to the District average of 31.9%. 10.5% of the unemployed have never worked. 25.7% are under 24 years of age and 18.9% are over 50.

Qualifications (1)

Nearly 40% of the population in this ward aged between 16 and 74 have no formal qualifications. This is higher than the average for the District as a whole, 35.1%. Only 9.2% have a professional / degree level qualification, compared to 15.9% for the District as a whole.

Ethnic group

96.3% of the population of this ward describe themselves as White. People with a Pakistani ethnic background are the second largest group at 1.6% of the total population, and there are small numbers from other ethnic groups.

Health and unpaid caring

In the 2001 Census, 10% of the population described their health as 'not good'. The average for the Bradford District is 10.1%. 18.8% of the population have a long term illness that limits their daily activities. This may include any problems related to old age. This is very similar to the District average of 18.5%. In terms of unpaid care, 9.9% of the population provide some form of unpaid care. Over ½ of carers provide over 50 hours of unpaid care a week.
