Freebox TV is now multi-device enabled!

Subscribers will now be able to use their Freebox to watch Free's TV channels on their computer screens as well as on their televisions

Free has enhanced its television service offering so that, within the next few days, it will be possible for all subscribers with access to its TV service to watch the Freebox TV channels not just on their televisions but also on their computer screens, which have been turned into televisions by the Freebox.

Having already turned the Freebox into a Media Center with the integration of its Freeplayer, Free is taking the convergence between computer and television a stage further.

Naturally, Free does not broadcast the television channels over the Internet. The signal is protected at the DSLAM (Digital Subscriber Line Access Multiplexer) level in order to guarantee the integrity of the channels broadcast over the ADSL line and to ensure that only subscribers are able to access them.

Free's infrastructure is such that it will ensure that access control is just as stringent as it is at the moment with just the one device.

This innovation has been introduced in response to demand from users, and gives households without a television (young people, people on restricted income, flatshares, etc.) access to television programmes. This will bring the number of users of Free's Freebox television service over the one million mark, which represents about 5% of the total number of French television viewers.
