Telephone line rental is now included in the Freebox subscription (29.99 euros) in non-unbundled areas

Free enables subscribers to entirely do away with line rental charges

Customers located in non-unbundled areas are now, without any additional cost, going to be able to stop paying separate line rental charges as line rental is to be included in their €29.99 per month Freebox subscription, just as it is possible for subscribers in unbundled areas. The line rental charge is currently €15 a month and will be going up to €16 a month in 2007. Free is the only operator so far to offer this service in non-unbundled areas without any additional charge.

The Freebox package, which has been continuously enhanced over the years with the regular introduction of new services while its price has remained unchanged ever since it was first launched in 2002, is available at the price of 29.99 euros per month all inclusive, even in non-unbundled areas, and offers:

- Internet access at speeds of up to 10 Mbit/s download and up to 1 Mbit/s upload
- line rental (a saving of €15 per month)
- free number portability, so that customers can continue to receive calls on their old number
- a whole range of telephone services provided free of charge, including a telephone answering service, customisable ring-back tones and the barring of calls without CLI, etc.
- unlimited inclusive calls to all landline numbers (including those operated by third-party local loop operators) in mainland France, Guadeloupe and Martinique (excluding short numbers and special numbers) and to landline numbers in the 25 most popular destinations for calls from France (such as the USA, the United Kingdom, China and Portugal, etc.)
- the Freebox, with an integrated WiFi-enabled router (no rental charge)
- an unlimited number of email addresses
- 10 GB of personal webspace

Free's subscribers located in non-unbundled areas can now opt to stop paying a separate line rental charge by going to their customer account pages online and following the migration procedure.

Customers should not, under any circumstances, cancel their telephone line subscription themselves. It will be cancelled automatically when their access-line order is processed.
