Also, between 11am-12pm and 7am-8 pm daily, Commerce Casino offers a \$100,000 Super Jackpot for Hold'em. This requires a hand that loses with four sixes or better and at least once each month a lucky player wins this jackpot for himself and his fellow tablemates.

COMMERCE CASINO HOSTS TWO WORLD CLASS POKER TOURNAMENTS IN FEBURARY

The L.A. Poker Classic and WPT Invitational to Be Televised on the World Poker Tour

COMMERCE, CA – If you love poker, the place to be this February is at Commerce Casino. Play it or watch it, poker will take center stage in the heart of Los Angeles, when Commerce Casino hosts the L.A. Poker Classic Championship event Feb. 17-21 and the World Poker Tour Invitational Feb. 22-23.

The L.A. Poker Classic Tournament includes a series of poker events where poker players can still either buy-in or win their way into individual events by entering satellite tournaments. Scheduled are Limit Hold 'Em, Stud Hi/Low Split, Pot Limit Omaha High, 7-Card Stud, Omaha Hi/Low Split and Stud Hi/Low Split tournaments.

The showcase event to be televised on the World Poker Tour (Travel Channel, Wednesday nights at 9 p.m. PT/ET) is Commerce Casino's No Limit Hold 'Em Championship event. It has a \$10,000 buy-in and is expected to draw more than 400 players. The anticipated prize pool is more than \$7 million, and the first place winner will likely go home with a \$2 million payday. Feb. 16 is One Table Satellite Day - an entire day of satellites dedicated to win entry into the \$10,000 Championship event. "Our field will consist of poker professionals, talented amateurs and newcomers (both men and women) who are drawn to the game of No Limit Texas Hold 'Em because of the popularity of the World Poker Tour on television," said Tim Gustin, Commerce Casino's Casino Manager. "It'll be a lively and spirited tournament spotlighting some of Southern California's best versus top players from around the world. These kinds of prize pools are really stimulating the competition."

On the 22nd, you'll only be invited to play in the WPT Invitational if you are a film, television or sports celebrity, or a poker player who is already entered in the World Poker Tour Championship in April. The prize pool for the tournament is \$200,000. The celebrities will also be playing for a \$25,000 seat in the WPT Championship and \$5,000 for a charity of their choice.

However, if you'd like to watch either of these final tables (Feb. 21 and Feb. 23 respectively), it's first come, first serve in the viewing stands. The World Poker Tour reserves a limited number of seats for spectators during the filming of the shows. You'll want to come early in order to secure a seat.

The L.A. Poker Classic will air on The Travel Channel on during the WPT's Season IV, which begins airing in March.

CALIFORNIA STATE POKER CHAMPIONSHIP HOSTED BY COMMERCE CASINO EACH SEPTEMBER

Event Caps Commerce Casino's Year 'Round Tournament Schedule For Players of All Skill Levels

If you have a hankering to "try your hand" at tournament play—whether a novice or an experienced veteran—than the Commerce Casino has a full slate of opportunities for you. Get experience playing face-to-face with players of all skill levels and improve your game under tournament conditions. Who knows? It might be you playing for all that cash heads-up at the final table.

A good way to start out playing tournament poker at Commerce is the weekly \$100 buy-in Texas No Limit Hold 'Em Tournament on Tuesday at 5 p.m. and Thursdays at 11 a.m. This tournament includes one re-buy, meaning that if you lose your chips, you can spend another \$100 to play further, but no additional re-buys are permitted. If you lose that stack, it's time to adjourn to the snack bar. The stakes for this tournament generally feature an \$8000 prize pool, with first prize being in the neighborhood of \$3,200.

Players can then graduate to the Sunday 5 p.m. \$330 buy-in tournaments. These also each have a one optional re-buy policy. You will see many of the same poker faces week in and week out. The prize pool is usually is around \$33,000, with around \$18,000 to the winner.

In May, Commerce Casino hosts the Heavenly Hold'em Event, a well regarded series of tournaments that drew more than 5236 players in 2005 over its 17 days. Buy-ins run \$100 to \$1500 with a prize pools in the hundreds of thousands. In 2005, seven events exceeded \$100,000 and the biggest one capped out at \$395,275. This is a great introduction for the beginning tournament player.

Each year in leading up to Thanksgiving and the holiday season, Commerce also stages its Holiday Bonus Tournament. Played over 17 days, it features limit and no limit games with buyins of \$100-\$540-\$2,580. \$15,000 is awarded to the best all-around player, the person who records the highest point total for in-the-money finishes over the two weeks. At least two of the 17 events in the Holiday Bonus Tournament boasts a \$250,000 guarantee to the winner. The total prize pool for the two weeks is estimated at more than \$1 million.

In conjunction with radio station KLSX-97.1, Commerce Casino annually holds two "Play Like the Big Boys" tournaments for beginners. Lucky callers receive entry into the \$6,000 free roll tournament (a tournament that requires no buy-in, since the prize purse if put up by the sponsor or casino.)

Two major events complete Commerce Casino's year round slate of tournaments.

The California State Poker Championship draws the best of the West. This hotly contested No Limit Texas Hold 'Em event held annually in September (moved from May) stretches over three days. This past year proved to be the "coming of age" for poker aficionado Ben Affleck. Affleck graduated from celebrity poker player to true competitor by capturing the coveted title, plus \$356,400, and a seat at the World Poker Tour Championship in April. The \$10,000 buy-in tournament drew 90 players, including at least one former World Series winner. The 2005 dates are September 6-25.

But to join the real high stakes action, there's Commerce Casino's LA Poker Classic in February. This involves a whole month of tournaments, culminating in the No Limit Hold'em Championship event, one of the featured tournaments on the World Poker Tour that airs on the Travel Channel. From Jan.26-Feb. 21, 2006, poker players can pick their choice of poker tournaments, including one with a \$1 million guaranteed prize pool and five coveted seats into the \$10,000-buy-in Championship event. The entire series of events in 2005 drew 7622 players with a total prize pool of \$12, 573, 361.

The championship event attracts players from around the world for prize pools that are stratospheric... expected to be more than \$10 million in 2006. Millions can be wagered on one hand. For the past two years, 24-year-old players have won. In 2005, it was Michael "The Grinder" Mizrachi taking home \$1,859,909 to best 538 players. In 2004, victor Antonio Esfandiari, a magician-turned-poker-pro, showed the poker magic that netted him a cool \$1.4 million and a trip the WPT Championship. But you don't have to win or even make the final table to be in the money. Last year the 45th finisher walked away with a \$15,499 paycheck. To enter you, can either plunk down your \$10,000 buy-in or win a satellite tournament. Satellites are listed on the www.commercecasino.com website. The dates for the Championship event in 2006 are February 17-21. It's a chance to play with the legends and create a few memories of your own.

Estimated \$6 Million in Prize Money To Be Awarded over Three Weeks of Tournaments; \$50,000 to Best All-Around Player

\$1.5 Million Championship No Limit Hold'em Event Begins Sept 23rd

Commerce, CA (Aug. 15, 2005)– If Ben Affleck can do it, can you? Winning the California Sate Poker Championship, that is! In 2004, Ben Affleck became the first film star to win a major poker open when he captured Commerce Casino's California State Poker Championship, netting a cool \$356,400. It just goes to prove that anyone—film star, construction worker, lawyer or candlestick maker—has a shot at winning this coveted \$1.5 million event when the 2005 California State Championship hits the tables on Friday, Sept. 23 at Commerce Casino.

"It's an opportunity for a newcomer to really prove him or herself against very tough competition, including many of the region's leading professional players. COMMERCE CASINO HISTORY AND KEY FIGURES

Commerce Casino opened for business in August 1983 as the largest casino in Southern California and one of the first major casinos located outside of the Gardena area. It debuted with 80,000 square feet, 100 game tables and 500 employees. Commerce was the first of the California casinos to offer employee benefits.

A few milestones include the introduction of Asian games in 1986, Limit Hold'em and Stud Poker in 1987, No Limit Hold'em in 1993, "No Bust Blackjack" in 1996, and the first L.A. Poker Classic in 2002. The Crowne Plaza Hotel was incorporated into the property in October 2001.

Today, the Commerce Casino complex has 238,040 square feet, 91,694 of that is for gaming and the facility has 2400 employees. It pumps \$14 million into the City of Commerce tax base.

The property is owned by a large group of investors, and managed by a five-person Board of Directors. Commerce Casino President/CEO George Tumanjian is a founder and continues to manage the casino's operations. Prior to his tenure at the Commerce Casino he was a successful real estate developer.

The Chairperson of the Board is Jasmine Mgrdichian who has served in that capacity since 1996. Owning and operating a 25-table card club and hotel facility in Victorville, she has extensive experience in the gaming business.

Other Board members include Salvatore Federico, a real estate investor and restaurateur; Haig Papaian, Jr., who managed a family disposal business before investing in a variety of financial interests, and Harvey Ross, who has served as Vice President since 1984 and has had interests in vending machines and real estate.

POKER 101 AT COMMERCE CASINO

So you don't want to be left out. Everyone you know is playing poker and it's still Greek to you?

With the rising popularity of poker, there's no shortage of excellent how-to books on the market. Check with local bookstores for volumes by poker masters Doyle Brunson, T.J. Cloutier, David Sklansky and Phil Hellmuth. The WPT has a line of books that begin with Mike Sextons: *WPT Shuffle Up and Deal.*

A number of key publications are now easy to find on newsstands or at casinos. The best of these include *CardPlayer* Magazine, which features instructive articles and columns by other top players, and the new magazines *Bluff, All-In, Poker Pro, High Roller, Top Pair* and *PokerLife.*

And if you really want to step up a notch, try WPT Boot Camp, which comes to Commerce Casino on a rotational basis every few months, a fantasy camp for poker enthusiasts of all levels. The exciting two-day camp limits enrollment to 60 people, and tutors students on all aspects of competitive, tournament Texas Hold'Em Poker. Using uniquely developed courseware and WPT tournament video footage, students receive hands-on training filled with tips and tools to help them better understand the "tells," "reads," and strategies integral to improving their game, putting them on the "*Fast Track to the Final Table*[™]." The instructional core consists of select WPT tournament champions, WPT television commentator Mike Sexton, and poker expert Alex "The Insider" Outhred, who analyzes all hands played at WPT Final Tables. Other instructors include Ron Rose, Linda Johnson, Thomas Keller, Scott Fischman, Clonie Gowan and Mark Seif, as well as Karina and Chip Jett.

Watching the World Poker Tour on the Travel Channel on Wednesday nights at 9 p.m. will also provide insight on ways to improve your game. It will also remind you that not only beginners make bonehead mistakes.

Legendary Doyle "Texas Dolly" Brunson, Young Champion Gus Hansen and James Garner ("Maverick") were First Honorees

New Travel Destination Joins the California Scene, Just Down Freeway from Disneyland

First there was the Hollywood Walk of Fame, then the Rock Walk of Fame. In February 2004, a new tribute took its place alongside those renowned celebrations of achievement: **THE WORLD POKER TOUR POKER WALK OF FAME** at Commerce Casino in Commerce, CA.

THE WORLD POKER TOUR POKER WALK OF FAME inducted its first members at the Commerce Casino in a ceremony before top pros and celebrities in town for the World Poker Tour Invitational Poker Tournament. In the spring of 2006, three more renowned figures will join the growing list of honorees.

The WPT Poker Walk of Fame pays tribute to the men and women who have played the game at its highest level; contributed to its evolution and popularity; celebrated poker in film, television and literature; and who are making the game appealing for a new generation of poker fan.

The first honorees were:

- **Doyle "Texas Dolly" Brunson**—A holder of nine world championship titles, Brunson, in his 70s, is one of the most respected players in the game. He authored "Super/System: How I Made Over \$1,000,000 Playing Poker," a book which serves as the bible for aspiring pros and amateurs alike. For more than five decades Brunson has been a feared competitor and consummate gentleman, establishing the standard of excellence to which many aspired and few achieved. He recently won a WPT tournament with a \$1 million payout and had a tournament named in his honor.
- **Gus "The Great Dane" Hansen**—The handsome young Danish-born Hansen is widely regarded to be the best young poker player in the world. He burst onto the poker tour in its first year winning two major WPT tournaments and over \$1 million. Steely and hard-to-read, he is known for his unpredictable play and willingness to take huge risks. He represents the future of the game of poker.
- James Garner From 1957-60, Garner charmed the nation as the unflappable Brett Maverick, the skilled poker-player, who used his wits to get him out of scrapes—with the law and with outlaws. Cool, good-natured and likeable, he was one of television's first engaging Western heroes. Maverick became synonymous with poker and certainly helped to popularize the game.

The induction ceremony was staged on the doorstep of Commerce Casino, the Los Angeles region's most prestigious gaming establishment and full service entertainment/hotel complex. Commerce Casino is the world's largest poker room with more than 200 poker tables, featuring all variations of poker at all limits. Poker room to the stars of Hollywood, Commerce Casino has a rich history of poker in Southern California dating back to 1983.

"The World Poker Tour is bringing millions of new fans to the game of poker," noted Steve Lipscomb, WPT founder and President. "It is important that we—as a caretaker of the poker tradition--preserve the history of the game and pay tribute to those who are setting its new history. We need to recognize those players and individuals who are contributing to the game's storied past and insuring its continuity as America's favorite card game. We are delighted that Commerce has given us a home from this important tribute to poker's leading figures."

"With the huge resurgence of poker today by players and television viewers, we are playing host to many enthusiasts who want to venerate their favorite players and appreciate their achievements by strolling The World Poker Tour Poker Walk Of Fame," commented Commerce Casino's Casino Manager Tim Gustin.

COMMERCE CASINO COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Card players are not the only winners that benefit from the success and growth of the Commerce Casino. Low-income students wishing to go to college, children from impoverished homes and at-risk youth are all among the winners, too, thanks to Commerce Casino's community outreach program.

"Participating in programs that aid our community is a primary goal for us," says Tim Gustin, Casino Manager. "It is essential that we give back to the community to help those whose lives we can impact in a significant and powerful way. We would not exist but for the support of Commerce and its surrounding communities. Our workforce of 2400 is primarily drawn from this region as well. Thus, we are proud to be able to contribute additional funds back into the people who share our neighborhood."

Commerce Casino is the primary contributor and major supporter of the City of Commerce Scholarship program. In the early days of this 16-year-old program, only seven applicants applied for a total of \$2,000 in grants. In 2005, the scholarship program had 60 applicants who shared \$75,000, with the top scholar receiving \$7,000.

Noted John Griffo, Casino Operations Manager, who has been on the evaluating committee for the past 14 years, "I have never seen so many qualified applicants and brilliant young people. This is an ethnically diverse group of youngsters from our small city who are going to such prestigious institutions as Stanford, Georgetown and University of California at Berkeley. We were pleased to provide everyone one of them some amount of financial support."

Another program that Commerce Casino funds an annual Christmas program for disadvantaged children in the City of Commerce. Each year the casino handles the arrangements, books the entertainment, provides catering, and purchases the youngster's gifts for a holiday party, which is held at Commerce's City Hall.

Commerce Casino was also instrumental in the development of a new city Child Care Center. Commerce executives were among the leaders on the committee that secured financing for, the construction and establishment of a day care and after-school program.

Two youth groups that benefit significantly from Commerce Casino's largesse are the Montebello Commerce YMCA and the Rio Hondo Boys and Girls Club. The casino makes donations annually and for the YMCA, a major contribution was made to a capital fund to create a Family Wellness Center. The Montebello Commerce Y serves both children and seniors.

Commerce Casino also plays a role with the Sheriff's Youth Foundation, providing contributions that support toys for children as part of a holiday program, activities and centers serving at-risk youth and the organization's annual golf shoot-out and dinner.

Other law enforcement support initiatives that Commerce Casino supports are the California Highway Patrol CHP 1199 and the FBI G-Man program. These organizations provide aid to families of fallen officers, including college scholarships and family financial assistance.
