West Wimmera Shire, Victorias best kept secret

Enjoy living in Victoria's best-kept secret. The West Wimmera region is renowned for its tranquillity and peacefulness.

With a population of approximately 4,860, the West Wimmera Shire Council spans a large 9,024 sq kms. The main townships are Edenhope and Kaniva with smaller townships of Apsley, Dergholm, Goroke, Harrow and Serviceton.

West Wimmera Shire is centrally located in the South Eastern Australian "Food Bowl" between Melbourne and Adelaide, stretching along the Victorian and South Australian borders.

This is an ideal area to work, bring up a family or retire. Within the major towns of Edenhope and Kaniva, there are social, sporting and recreational facilities, together with a high level of infrastructure.

Noted for its natural attractions and many unique and exciting country events, West Wimmera Shire boasts generous open spaces and low density housing, complemented by significant natural vegetation and a number of wetlands and lakes including Lake Wallace in Edenhope. We offer some of the most envied qualities of rural living in Australia—space, freedom, climate and opportunity with some of the best farmland in the State.

The clean spacious environment, generous open spaces and natural surrounds, clean air and quality environment are the incentives for new residents and visitors to this area. Complemented by significant natural vegetation, our many lakes and wetlands offer a perfect haven for wildlife and bird-life as well as a variety of recreational activities.

West Wimmera Shire has over 230 bird species recorded within our geographic region, including unique and endangered birds—in particular the Red Tailed Black Cockatoo.

Traditionally, cropping has included wheat, oats and barley, however farmers are now diversifying to other crops—for example canola, chickpeas, triticale and white clover to name a few.

The Neuarpurr area is known for producing approximately 20% of the World's and 80% of Australia's white clover seeds. This area of the Shire relies on bores and pivot irrigators for these crops.

Diversification in the industry has also lead farmers to grow olive trees and blue gums as well as potatoes, onions and carrots. Breeding of sheep for wool and meat brings billions of dollars to the Victorian economy. Cattle and sheep feedlot development continues.

Along with the agriculture industry, West Wimmera Shire has manufacturing; retailing and viticulture industries in operation just to name a few. An Industry Survey has been conducted and results show that there are abundant opportunities for prospective businesses and development of existing businesses within the Shire.

Located approximately halfway between Melbourne and Adelaide and stretching from the Big Desert in the north to the Glenelg River in the south, West Wimmera Shire offers much for the traveller to do – the large variety of accommodation makes West Wimmera the ideal base for your full day or half day trips to many parts of Victoria and South Australia.

For the tourist we have natural attractions like Baileys Rocks (500 million year old green granite rocks), homesteads and other buildings built by the Chinese in the early 1880's during the pioneering days; flora and fauna, historic buildings, museums, bric-a-brac and craft stores.

West Wimmera Shire Demographics

The population of the West Wimmera Shire in 1996 was 4,933, which consists of 2,374 females and 2,559 males.

Most residents were Australia-born and speak English.

Approximately 22% or 1,072 people were attending some form of education from Kindergarten to University.

18% of population had a qualification, and that could be in business and administration, health, social and culture, natural and physical services, education, engineering, building fields and agriculture.

Of the population, 31% were employed fulltime and 11% were employed part-time. Less than 1% of the population were looking for employment.

The main industry within the West Wimmera Shire was agri-business (52%). The remaining 48% is made up of trades listed from - health and community services, retail trade (6%), education, manufacturing, government administration, construction, wholesale trade (3%), accommodation and food handling businesses [Cafés or restaurants] (3%), transport and storage, mining, communication services, finance and insurance, and cultural and recreation services. The majority of the businesses within the Shire are home-based and/or small businesses. The majority of businesses within West Wimmera are small (employing less than 10 staff).

1,230 families own their homes and 270 families are renting.

The average age within the Shire was 38 years, the average individual income was \$200-299 per week and the average family income \$300-499 per week with the average household size 2.5 people.

Information was compiled from the 1996 Census

2001 Census night was 7th August.


In Victoria on 7th August 2001 the average age was 32 years and family size was 2.6 people.





Other Points of Interest

Location - Goroke is situated on a main highway between Frances (SA) and Horsham (Vic). Other close regional centres include Hamilton, Mt. Gambier, Naracoorte and coastal resorts such as Robe (approximately ½ to 1½ hr drive).
