BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Furnas was one of the early territorial pioneers, who came to Nebraska from Ohio on April 6, 1856. Very shortly after his arrival he began the publication of the Brownville Nebraska Advertiser, one of the most influential of the early newspapers, continuing as editor and publisher until 1867.

Formerly a Whig, Furnas joined the newly formed Republican Party. He was particularly active in political affairs, and served four terms in the territorial Legislature.

During the Civil War he was a colonel in the Army, commanding three regiments of Indian troops in the Indian Territory. He resigned his command and returned to Nebraska to organize the Second Nebraska Cavalry, which saw service against the Sioux on the Western frontier. After his regiment was mustered out of service, Furnas was appointed agent of the Omaha Indian Agency and held that position from 1864-1868.

Furnas' one term as governor, 1873-75, was not particularly successful, and feeling that he didn't have a chance at re-election, he withdrew from active participation in politics at the end of his term, spending the rest of his life in the nursery business and as a proponent of better agricultural methods in Nebraska.

He was instrumental in creating the State Board of Agriculture and served as its first president and later as its secretary for approximately two decades. The latter position consisted almost entirely of planning and arranging for the Nebraska State Fair held annually in September. In addition, he served as a commissioner to several national and international expositions. He was an active participant in several agricultural, horticultural and other related organizations and served as president of the International Fairs and Expositions and the American Fair Association. Furnas was one of the organizers of the Nebraska State Historical Society, and for many years served as president.

He is the author of numerous agricultural pamphlets, several articles in the Proceedings and Collections of the Nebraska State Historical Society and editor of Arbor Day, a collection of articles published in 1888.

He married Mary Elizabeth McComas on October 29, 1845, and they were the parents of eight children. Mrs. Furnas died on April 1, 1897, and Furnas was married for a second time on December 25, 1899, to Susannah Emswiler Jameson.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of forty-one manuscript boxes and three shelved volumes of material which is arranged in eight subgroups. Subgroup one through
