THE MATCH-UP

■For the 33rd time in the history of its program, the University of Florida will be making a post-season bowl appearance as the Gators will meet lowa in the Outback Bowl on Monday, Jan. 2, 2006 in Raymond James Stadium at 11 a.m. ET. The Gators enter the game with an 8-3 record overall and a 5-3 SEC mark, while lowa went 7-4 overall and 5-3 in Big 10 play.

ABOUT THE OUTBACK BOWL

■The Outback Bowl is a January bowl game matching teams from the Southeastern and Big Ten Conferences. Known as the Hall of Fame Bowl from Dec. 1986 to Jan.1995, Outback Steakhouse became the title name sponsor of the bowl in April of 1995. Since 2000, SEC teams are 12-7 against teams from the Big 10.

GATORS IN BOWL GAMES

- ■Florida was the only school in the nation to defeat two teams that are playing in BCS bowl games this year. On Oct. 29, the Gators defeated Georgia, 14-10, and on Nov. 26, UF concluded the regular season with a 34-7 victory over Florida State.
- ■Florida enters the game with a 14-18 all-time record in bowls, and is 4-3 against Big Ten members it has faced in those contests (Illinois 1-0, Iowa 1-1, Michigan 0-1, Michigan State 0-1, Penn State, 2-0). (FOR A GAME-BY-GAME LOOK AT THE GATORS IN BOWL GAMES, SEE PAGE FIVE OF THIS RELEASE).
- ■The Gators are making their 15th-straight bowl appearance to extend their current school record. The mark is the longest active streak among SEC teams and the third-longest in the nation:

- ■Florida is making its 12th January bowl game appearance in the past 13 years. Today's game is UF's 16th January bowl game in school history.
- ■For the seventh time in the past nine seasons, the Gators will be playing in a bowl game in the state of Florida (1999 and 2002 Orange Bowls, 1998 and 2000 Citrus Bowls, 2003 and 2004 Outback Bowl). The Gators have won six of their last nine bowl games played in Florida and are 11-6 all-time in bowl games played in the Sunshine State.
- ■Today's game marks the 39th appearance for the University of Florida in Tampa. The Gators are 21-14-3 all-time in their previous games in the city. Florida won its first game ever played in Tampa with a 44-0 victory over Tampa AC on Dec. 20, 1912. Florida has concluded its season in Tampa four times (1933, 1935 and 2003, 2004); the first two were Gator victories 1933: Maryland W, 19-0, 1935: South Carolina W, 22-0. UF has shutout its opponents in 11 of the Gators' 21 victories in Tampa (FOR A COMPLETE GAME-BY-GAME LOOK AT FLORIDA IN TAMPA SEE PAGE 12 OF THIS RELEASE).
- ■The game marks the third appearance in the Outback Bowl for Florida in the last four seasons as the Gators lost to Michigan in 2003, 38-30, and Iowa in 2004, 37-13. In addition, UF co-defensive coordinator Charlie Strong went to the Outback Bowl twice while at South Carolina. In 2001 and 2002, USC played Ohio State and both times South Carolina won the game. In 2001, the Gamecocks defeated the Buckeyes, 24-7, and the next season USC came out on top, 31-28.

COACH MEYER IN BOWL GAMES

■Coach Meyer enters today's game looking for his third bowl victory in the last three years. Only 14 other coaches in the nation have led their teams to bowl wins in each of the last two years and only two of the other coaches are in the SEC (Georgia's Mark Richt and Auburn's Tommy Tuberville have led their teams to wins in each of their last three bowl games).

GATOR STORYLINES

- ■Florida enters today's game looking for its first bowl victory since 2001. With a win, this year's Gator squad would become the first in school history to beat Tennessee, Georgia, Florida State and a bowl opponent all in the same season.
- ■Florida will enter its bowl game looking to win nine games in a season for the first time since 2001. The Gators look to close out a year with a consecutive wins (includes bowl game) for the first time since 1997. UF has only ended a year with back-to-back victories three times in the last 19 seasons since doing it in 1985.
- ■Florida attempts to get its fourth win against a ranked opponent under head coach Urban Meyer. No first year coach in Florida history has defeated more than three ranked foes in his first season with the Gators (Meyer and Galen Hall, 1984).
- ■As of games played through Dec. 4, 2005, University of Florida players rank in the top three in the SEC in the following categories: Chris Leak, third in total offense (219.2); Chad Jackson, first in receptions/game (7.3); Chad Jackson, third in receiving yards/game (74.9); Chad Jackson, third in scoring TDs (11); Chris Hetland, first in field goal pct. (85.7);Brandon Siler, first in fumbles recovered (7); Dee Webb, first in passes defended (13); Jeremy Mincey, first in tackles by an end or lineman (61).

TELEVISION

The game will be broadcast on ESPN. The broadcast team is Mark Jones, Chris Spielman and Rob Stone.

THE GATOR RADIO NETWORK

The Gator Radio Network team of Mick Hubert (play-by-play), Lee McGriff (color) and Steve Babik (sideline) will broadcast the contest. Scot Brantley joins Babik as co-host of pregame, along with regular commentator James Jones. WFXJ radio (930-AM in Jacksonville) serves as UF's flagship station. The pre-game show begins two hours before kickoff. There is also a 90-minute show following the conclusion of the game.

SATELLITE RADIO

Florida football can be heard on Sirius Satellite Radio. The channel is TBA and fans can log on to www.sirius.com for more information.

- ■Today's game will be the 10th bowl game UF head coach Urban Meyer has participated in (all as a coach). As a head coach, Meyer is 2-0 in bowl games. At Utah, Coach Meyer led the Utes to a 17-0 win over Southern Mississippi in the 2003 Liberty Bowl and in 2004 Utah defeated Pittsburgh 35-7 at the Fiesta Bowl. No coach in the nation that has taken a team to a bowl games in each of the last two seasons has allowed less points than Coach Meyer-led squads.
- ■Including bowl games, bye weeks and mid-week games, Coach Meyer-led teams are 12-2 all-time when having more than one week to prepare for a game.

MOST WINS BY A FIRST-YEAR FLORIDA HEAD COACH

■With a win today, UF head coach Urban Meyer would tie Ray Graves (1960) and Steve Spurrier (1990) for the most wins by a first-year Florida head coach (nine).

FLORIDA HEAD COACHES IN BOWL GAMES

■Prior to today's game, Florida head coaches are 3-5 in their first bowl games with the Gators. The last time a UF head coach won his first bowl game with the Gators was when Charley Pell led UF to a 35-20 victory over Maryland on Dec. 20, 1980 in the Tangerine Bowl. Since then, Florida head coaches have gone 0-4 in their first bowl games. Only Coach Pell, Bob Woodruff and Ray Graves won their initial bowl game as the Gator head coach.

FLORIDA VS. IOWA

- ■Today's meeting between Florida and Iowa will be the third between the schools. The first meeting came in the 1983 Gator Bowl as UF came away with a 14-6 victory. The two met in the 2004 Outback Bowl, where the Gators were defeated by Iowa, 37-17.
- ■Florida head coach Urban Meyer and Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz were on opposite sidelines for the first time in 1986. Coach Meyer was a graduate assistant at Ohio State, while Coach Ferentz was the offensive line coach for the Hawkeyes. Ohio State won the game 31-10, however, the next season lowa defeated the Buckeyes, 29-27, in Columbus with both still at their respective schools. UF cornerbacks coach Chuck Heater was also involved in those games as Ohio State's secondary coach.
- ■Including Coach Meyer (Ohio State) five members of the UF coaching staff have coached in the Big 10. Steve Addazio (Indiana); Chuck Heater (Ohio State, Wisconsin) and Greg Mattison (Michigan, Northwestern, Illinois) have also coached in the Big 10 Conference.
- ■University of Florida co-defensive coordinator/defensive line coach Greg Mattison is the father of Iowa sophomore defensive end Bryan Mattison.
- ■University of Florida running backs coach Stan Drayton coached and played for Iowa offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe at Allegheny (Pa.) College. Drayton was a three-year running back and a member of the 1990 Division III national championship team. He was the running backs coach at Allegheny in 1993. O'Keefe was head coach at Allegheny from 1990-97.

FIRST-YEAR COACHES VS. NATION'S TOP TOTAL DEFENSES

This season, there are 23 head coaches who are in their first season in Division I-A. Of those teams, Florida's scoring offense is sixth, however, no other team ahead of the Gators on the list has had to play more of the nation's top 25 ranked total defenses and none have matched up against fewer of the nation's total defenses that rank lower than 80th nationally (all totals include opponents through Dec. 4):

FLORIDA AT HOME UNDER COACH MEYER

- ■With a 34-7 victory in "The Swamp" to close out the regular season, Florida head coach Urban Meyer led the Gators to a 6-0 home record in 2005. In doing so, he matched Steve Spurrier (1990) for the most wins by any Gator head coach at home in his first year with the program. Coach Meyer also became the ninth UF head coach to be undefeated at home in his initial campaign. Other Gator head coaches to do so include: G.E. Pyle (1909), Charles McCoy (1914), William Kline (1920), J.A. Van Fleet (1923), H.L. Sebring (1925), D.K. Stanley (1933), Galen Hall (1984), Steve Spurrier (1990).
- ■Dating back to the 2004 season, Florida has won eight straight home games. The last time UF won eight consecutive home games was an 11-game stretch that went from the start of the 2000 season until Dec. 1, 2001, against Tennessee.
- ■Coach Meyer has started his UF career with a 6-0 home record. The streak matches Charles McCoy (1914) and J.A. Van Fleet (1923) for the second-best start by any coach in Gator history in terms of beginning a career without being defeated or tied at home.

COACH MEYER IN HOME GAMES

- **•**UF was the only team in the SEC to go undefeated at home during the 2005 season. UF posted a record of 6-0 in "The Swamp" to become the first Florida squad to do so since 2000.
- ■Starting in 2001, when he began his head coaching career at Bowling Green, Coach Meyer's teams have posted a 28-2 record in home games. Meyer-coached teams join four other squads to have suffered two or fewer losses at home during that period:

FIRST-YEAR UF HEAD COACHES VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- ■Urban Meyer is the only first-year coach in school history to defeat Tennessee, Georgia and Florida State in his first full season with the Gators. Coach Meyer and Galen Hall are the only head coaches to defeat three ranked opponents in their first season at the helm of the program.
- ■Urban Meyer is the only coach in Florida history to defeat two teams ranked No. 4 or higher in his first season (No. 4 Tennessee and No. 4 Georgia). UF has defeated two teams ranked in the top four in the same season three times in school history (1991, 1996, 2005).

UF ESTABLISHES NEW GAME DAY EXPERIENCES

A number of new experiences for Gator fans have been put in place for the 2005 season:

The Gator Walk

Fans are able to greet the team upon arrival at the stadium two hours prior to kick off when the team participates in the "Gator Walk." Fans are welcome to join the UF cheerleaders, mascots and pep band to wish the team well two hours prior to home contests. The Gators will exit team busses on the corner of University Ave. and Gale Lemerand Drive and walk along the sidewalk into Gate Eight of the stadium and across Florida Field on its way to the locker room.

The Swamp Things

On April 27, 2005, University of Florida students who participated in a UF Student Government and University Athletic Association-sponsored contest voted to name the student section at Florida Field "The Swamp Things," a name Coach Meyer endorsed following the vote. Tyler Boehling was the student with the winning entry. Boehling was recognized on opening night this season. He will also receive two tickets and accommodations to the 2005 Florida-Georgia football game in Jacksonville.

As part of the plans for the section, 20,000 blue "Swamp Things" t-shirts were distributed by UF Student Government courtesy of Pepsi.

The Fight Song

At the conclusion of every home contest, the Florida football team will join the band in the Northeast corner of the stadium to join Gator fans in singing UF's Alma Mater and the school fight song.

SCOUTING IOWA

- ■The 2006 Outback Bowl berth for Iowa marks its fourth-straight January bowl game, with all four coming in the state of Florida. Iowa lost to Southern California in the 2003 Orange Bowl, but won against Florida in the 2004 Outback and LSU in last year's Capital One Bowl.
- ■The Hawkeyes' offense has produced 20or-more points in all but two of their games a 23-3 setback at lowa State and a 31-6 loss at Ohio State. They are averaging 30.5 points per game
- ■lowa's leading rusher, Albert Young has netted 1300 yards this season with eight touchdowns, numbers good enough to garner him second team All-Big 10 honors behind Minnesota's Laurence Maroney.
- ■The Hawkeyes' offense has produced 20or-more points in all but two of their games – a 23-3 setback at Iowa State and a 31-6 loss at Ohio State. They are averaging 30.5 points per game.

- ■Head Coach Urban Meyer is the fourth coach in school history to lead his team to victory over the first ranked opponent he faced at UF (No. 4, Tennessee, W, 16-7). The other three coaches who accomplished this feat were Galen Hall (1984), Ray Graves (1960) and Bob Woodruff (1950).
- ■First-year head coach Urban Meyer faces his school-record matching sixth ranked opponent. In 2002, Ron Zook took on a school-record six foes ranked in the polls during his initial campaign. Overall, UF first-year head coaches are 12-24 vs. ranked opponents. A look at the individual coaching records vs. ranked foes:

- ■Urban Meyer became only the second coach in school history to lead the Gators to a victory vs. the first top-five opponent they faced (No. 4, Tennessee, W, 16-7). Past UF coaches were 1-7 against the first program they took on ranked inside the top-five nationally. Ray Graves was the only coach to defeat his first top-five ranked opponent (10-6, W, at Alabama, 1963).
- ■Florida's 16-7 win against Tennessee marked the 50th game of Urban Meyer's career as a head coach. Following the game, his record as a head coach stood at 42-8 (.840), the best record through 50 games of any current head coach in the SEC.
- ■Florida completed the toughest month in school history, facing three top 15 teams in the same month for the first time in the history of the program this October. UF last faced three ranked teams in the same month in 1991, but they were in the top 20 and not the top 15. This October, Florida took on then-No. 15 Alabama, then-No. 8 LSU and then-No. 4 Georgia.

SQUAD NOTES

- ■During the 2005 regular season, UF defeated the SEC champions for the third time in the last four years as the Gators knocked off then-No. 4 Georgia, 14-10, on Oct. 29. The Gators also defeated the ACC champions with a 34-7 victory over Florida State on Nov. 26.
- ■Florida closed out the regular season with a 34-7 victory over Florida State. This marked the first time UF has defeated FSU in back-to-back regular season meetings since the 1985-86 seasons.
- ■The 2005 squad became the fourth in school history to defeat Tennessee, Georgia and Florida State in the same regular season (1984, 1991, 1995). Florida did not trail at any time against any of those three teams this season and became the only squad in school history to accomplish that feat.
- ■Florida's win over Vanderbilt on Nov. 5 secured the 18th consecutive winning season for the Gators, which is the longest active streak in the Southeastern Conference.
- ■This year, Florida continues to take care of the football. Through 11 games, UF has lost only five fumbles (lowest total in the SEC). The school record for lowest amount in a season is five (1994). In 2004, UF lost eight fumbles, which tied Ole Miss for the third-lowest total in the league. Urban Meyer-coached teams have not fumbled the ball in eight of 58 games, and have not lost a fumble in 25 of 58 games. Only once in 58 games have Meyer-led teams lost more than two fumbles (at Texas A&M, Sept. 6, 2003).
- ■Coach Meyer has stated one goal of the offense is to get the ball in the hands of the best players. UF's top three receivers (Chad Jackson, Dallas Baker and Jemalle Cornelius) have accounted for 151 of the 216 receptions this season and the three have brought in 13 of Florida's 14 TD receptions by a receiver this season.
- ■Urban Meyer's offense at Utah last year scored on all but two trips inside the 20-yard line and his teams have scored on 87.8 percent of all trips inside the Red Zone in his five years as a head coach. Team totals of Urban Meyer-coached squads over the last five seasons:

UF IN PRO STADIUMS

- ■UF is 27-23-1 in Pro Stadiums
- ■UF has played four games in a professional stadium against a Big Ten team four times in its history (Chicago was one of the original members of the Big Ten Conference).
- ■UF has appeared in two bowl games in Tampa, the 2003 and 2004 Outback Bowls.
- ■UF has played in at least two professional football stadiums in the last eight seasons including this one. The Gators have played in at least two pro stadiums in 11 of the last 12 seasons.
- ■Nineteen of UF's contests in professional stadiums have come in either the SEC Championship Game or a bowl game. UF is 8-11 in those games
- ■UF is 1-1 in national championships played in professional stadiums.
- ■Including today's game, Florida has appeared in a pro stadium in Tampa seven times in the history of the program. UF played in Tampa Stadium on four occassions and made its first appearance in Raymond James Stadium against Michigan in the 2003 Outback Bowl:

- ■From 2001-04, Urban Meyer's teams ranked fourth nationally in time of possession, averaging 32:01 per game. This season, the Gators have averaged 32:22 to their opponents' 27:27. UF's average ranks first in the SEC. UF's time of possession this season is the best in Florida records dating back to 1986.
- ■Florida's average starting field position of the 33-yard line is tied with Georgia for the best average in the SEC.
- Florida has turned the ball over 12 times this season. The total is tied for the third-lowest nationally and tied for the lowest in the SEC, as Alabama also has only 12 turnovers (as of Dec. 4, 2005).
- ■Coach Meyer-led teams have not trailed at the conclusion of 60 of the last 71 quarters of play.

THE OFFENSE

- Florida had just six yards of total offense in the first quarter against Florida State, however, the Gators finished the game with 284 yards.
- ■Against Florida State, UF's offense converted three straight Seminole turnovers into points during the third and fourth quarters. An interception led to a field goal and a pair of fumble recoveries resulted in touchdowns.
- ■Three different Gators had a carry of at least 10 yards against Florida State: DeShawn Wynn (13), Markus Manson (11) and Chris Leak (11).
- ■Florida is the only school in the SEC to score 49 points or more against a league opponent in two games this season.
- ■UF has outrushed nine of 11 opponents this year. Through 11 games a season ago, UF had been outrushed by five opponents.
- ■On a 16-play drive spanning the end of the third quarter against Tennessee and beginning of the fourth quarter, the Gators converted 4-of-5 third-down conversions and ate up 7:42. The drive resulted in a field goal that put the Gators ahead, 16-7. Florida's fourth quarter drive that helped seal the win marked only the second time in the last 17-plus years UF put together a fourth-quarter scoring drive of longer than 7:40. Prior to that, UF had an 8:51 drive against LSU on Oct. 1, 1988, that went 18 plays for 83 yards and resulted in a field goal. Against USC in 1999, the Gators went on a 15-play, 68-yard drive that lasted 7:47 and resulted in a field goal in the fourth quarter
- ■The Gators had three scoring drives of 12 plays or more against Vanderbilt, including a 13-play, 79-yard drive that went 7:36 to start the game and a 16-play, 80-yard drive that lasted 8:38 in the fourth quarter. UF has not had a drive longer than 8:38 since at least 1993.
- ■The Gators' 49 points in the first half of the UK game were the most points UF has ever scored in the first half vs. a SEC opponent in school history. UF scored 42 points in a half against an SEC opponent twice versus LSU (Oct. 12, 1996) and South Carolina (Nov. 11, 1995). UF finished the game with 49 points, which are the most scored by an SEC team against a league opponent in a game this season.
- A season ago, Urban Meyer's offense was one of only two in the nation to rank in the top 20 in passing (263.7 ypg, 19th nationally) and rushing (236.1 ypg., 13th nationally).
- ■Last season, Urban Meyer's offense was the only one in the nation to score 30-or-more rushing touchdowns and 30-or-more passing touchdowns (36 rushing and 33 passing).

QUARTERBACKS

- ■In his final outing of the 2005 regular season, Chris Leak finished 19-for-28 for 211 yards and two touchdowns against Florida State. Leak's 211-yard performance marked the first time this season he has thrown for 200-or-more yards in three straight contests. He has also thrown multiple touchdowns in the last three games marking the first time he's done that this season as well.
- ■Chris Leak's six rushing touchdowns this year are tied for the second-best single-season total by a Gator quarterback in school history:

■Florida quarterbacks have thrown just seven interceptions this season, which is one per every 49.2 pass attempts. The total currently ranks as the best in school history.

- ■Entering the bowl game, Chris Leak is fourth in the category of most touchdowns responsible for by a Gator. Leak has been involved in 73 (63 passing, 10 rushing) and is one behind Shane Matthews (74 pass, seven rushing, one receiving).
- Chris Leak has a career completion percentage of 60.6, which is just ahead of Danny Wuerffel (60.5) for third on UF's all-time chart.
- ■Chris Leak's 20 touchdown passes against teams ranked in the AP top 25 since 2003 are the second-highest amount by any active quarterback during that time span and his 288 completions and 3,403 passing yards are the most by any player in the nation vs. ranked foes.
- ■Chris Leak made his 32nd career start against Florida State. Leak now owns an 21-11 record in starts on the collegiate level. Shown below are the consecutive starts leaders among 2005 Division

- ■Florida quarterback Chris Leak is 67-11 in his last 78 games as a starting quarterback. He won 46 in a row at Independence High School and then his first start at Florida (at Kentucky). His 11 losses have been to Ole Miss, Florida State, Iowa, Tennessee, LSU (twice), Mississippi State, Georgia, Miami, Alabama, and South Carolina

RUNNING BACKS

- ■DeShawn Wynn is ranked in a tie for 71st nationally in rushing touchdowns with seven this season.
- ■The Gator running backs have averaged 5.0 yards per carry on 254 runs and have lost only one fumble this season.
- Against Georgia, Kestahn Moore started his fourth game of the season. He was the first true freshman to start at running back for Florida since Robert Gillespie on Oct. 17, 1998, vs. Auburn. Including Moore, there have been only eight true freshmen to start at the position for the Gators since 1972.
- ■DeShawn Wynn gained a career-high 109 yards on a career-high 19 carries (5.7 avg.) against Georgia. It marked the third time in his career he reached the century mark. Wynn averaged 5.8 yards per carry in his previous outing at LSU. This marked the second time in his career (and the first time against SEC foes) that he has averaged 5.0 yards per carry or more in back-to-back contests.
- ■At Kentucky, DeShawn Wynn became the first Gator to score four touchdowns twice in his career, as he previously accomplished the feat against Florida A&M on Sept. 13, 2003.

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- ■Chad Jackson is tied for 19th nationally in receiving touchdowns with nine. He has averaged a touchdown catch every nine receptions this season. Jackson's 81 receptions are tied for eighth nationally this season and rank first in the SEC. Jackson looks to become the fourth different UF receiver to lead the league in receptions since 2000.
- Chad Jackson's nine receptions against Florida State raised his total this season to 81. His performance already ranks second on Florida's all-time single-season chart and is the most by a Gator junior in school history. The total is also the sixth-highest in SEC history: SEC Single Season Receptions

- ■Chad Jackson went over 1,000 yards in his career in the Kentucky game and has established a career high with 81 receptions.
- ■Phil Trautwein made the first start of his career against Florida State when he lined up at tight end wearing number 86.
- ■Through 11 games this season, the UF receivers have carried the ball 25 times for 160 yards and three touchdowns. The Gator offense averages 6.4 yards per play when a receiver carries the ball.
- ■While returning the second-half kickoff against Tennessee, Andre Caldwell fractured the femur bone in his right leg and will miss the remainder of the season. Jemalle Cornelius missed the Mississippi State game with an ankle sprain.
- Chad Jackson's 80-yard touchdown catch against Louisiana Tech this season was the second of 80or-more yards in his career (81, at Tennessee, 2004). Jackson joins Jacquez Green and Ricky Nattiel as the only Gators ever to catch two touchdown receptions of 80-or-more yards in their UF careers.

INSTANT REPLAY

For the 2005 season, the rules committee is allowing several varying systems to implement video replay, as determined by each conference or institution.

Plays that MAY be reviewed:

- 1. Governed by sideline, goal line and end line:

- b) Pass complete/incomplete/intercepted at sideline, goal line and end line.

- a) Pass ruled complete/incomplete/intercepted in the field of play and end zones.
- b) Touching of a forward pass by an ineligible re-
- c) Touching of a forward pass by a defensive player.
- d) Quarterback (passer) forward pass or fumble (if ruled incomplete, the play is finalized).
- e) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing beyond the line of scrimmage.
- f) Illegal forward pass or illegal handing after change of possession.
- g) Forward or backward pass thrown from behind the line of scrimmage.

3. Other detectable infractions:

- a) Runner ruled not down.
- b) Forward progress errors with respect to first down.
- c) Touching of a kick.
- d) Number of players on field.
- e) Clock adjustments.
- f) Fourth-down/try fumble plays.

- ■Against Kentucky, Jemalle Cornelius (eight catches, 138 yards) and Chad Jackson (nine catches, 105 yards) became the first Gator duo to go over 100 yards in the same game since Reche Caldwell (115) and Jabar Gaffney (101) did so against Tennessee on Dec. 1, 2001.
- ■In the game against Wyoming, Chad Jackson (three receiving, one rushing) became the eighth player in UF history to score four-or-more touchdowns in a one game, however, he is the second to do so in a season-opener joining Jack Jackson, who did so in 1994 against New Mexico (all of which were TD receptions). His 24 points scored are the most by an SEC wide receiver in a game this year.
- Chad Jackson's three touchdown catches against Wyoming were the most for a UF receiver since Jabar Gaffney had three against Auburn on Oct. 14, 2000. They also tied Robert Redd (vs. Ohio, 10/5/02) and Paris Warren (vs. Colorado State, 11/6/04) for the most by an Urban Meyer-coached receiver.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- ■In the Florida State game, Florida opened with the following offensive line (LT Randy Hand, LG Tavares Washington, C Mike Degory, RG Steve Rissler, RT Lance Butler). Degory, Hand, Butler and senior Tavares Washington have seen action in 148 games combined and have started 133 between them. JimTartt started the game against Mississippi State at left guard after lining up at right guard to start at Alabama and Kentucky.
- ■In the Florida State game, Chris Leak was sacked just two times against one of the nation's best defensive lines in Florida State. FSU entered the game with 33 sacks on the season, which led the ACC.
- ■Mike Degory has started each of the 49 games of his collegiate career, marking the second longest active streak in the nation. Degory's streak is one away from matching the school record, as Larry Kennedy started each of the 50 games during his UF career:

■UF center Mike Degory is one of five active players who have been named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List (presented to the nation's top center) three times in his career. He joins David Castillo (Florida Sate), Ryan Cook (New Mexico), Greg Eslinger (Minnesota) and Russ Tanner (Georgia). Degory was named one of six finalists for the award this season.

THE DEFENSE

- ■Florida's defense ranks third in the conference in total defense and seventh in the country, as the Gators are allowing 289.8 yards per game. UF's rushing defense is fourth in the conference and 10th in the nation as it allows 97.7 yards per contest.
- ■In UF's eight wins this season, the Gators have allowed 2.3 plays of 20-or-more yards per game. In Florida's three losses the total is double as the Gators have given up 4.6 per contest.
- ■In the last decade, co-defensive coordinator Charlie Strong became the only coordinator in the

- ■The SEC was the only conference in the nation with three teams ranked inside the AP preseason top 10 (No. 3, Tennessee; No. 5, LSU; No. 10, Florida).
- ■In nine of the past 10 seasons, the SEC has had five-or-more teams ranked in the AP preseason top 25. In 2003, the SEC had four and in 2001, the SEC had six (including preseason No. 1 Florida). Every other season, the year started off with five league teams ranked in the AP top 25 to begin with.

nation to hold Florida State to under 50 yards rushing in back-to-back seasons. In 2004, UF allowed only 34 yards rushing to the Seminoles and this season the Gators held FSU to 49 rushing yards.

- ■Florida allowed Florida State to score only seven points, marking the lowest amount a Gator squad has allowed the Seminoles to score since 1981.
- ■The Florida defensive unit did not allow FSU to convert a third down in the first half (0-of-6). In the third quarter of the game, FSU averaged 0.7 yards per rush and had two yards on three carries. Six of FSU's first seven drives went for nine yards or less and nine of 14 on the game went for 14 or less.
- ■Florida's defense has dropped opponents for a total of 325 yards on tackles for loss this season. The total ranks as the highest amount in school history since the record was kept in 1983. The unit has accounted for a loss of 554 yards this season on total tackles for loss (qb sacks and tackles for loss combined). The amount is also the largest in school history since the record began being kept in 1983.
- ■UF opponents have turned the ball over 30 times this season, which is the top total in the SEC and tied for the eighth-highest total nationally.
- ■UF opponents are completing just 51.2 percent of their passes, which is 11th-best nationally and fourth in the SEC.
- ■Florida's 32 sacks are tied for the 20tht highest total nationally and are tied for the third-highest total in the league. Florida's 32 sacks this season are the most by a Gator team since 43 in 1999. A dozen players have accounted for this year's total, while only eight from last season did so. The secondary has totaled seven sacks this year already compare to only one last year.
- ■The Florida defense has recovered 15 fumbles this year, compared to only seven last year, and has forced 11 fumbles after only forcing six in 2004.
- ■Nearly half of Florida's opponents drives this season (61-of-131) have gone for less than 10 yards. UF has been in the Red Zone 50 times this season, while opponents have only entered it on 32 occasions.
- ■Opponents are 19-of-64 (.296) on third-down conversions against the Gators this season in the first half. Opponents are 14-for-73 (.191) when attempting third and seven or longer on the Gators and 8-for-49 (.163) in third and 10 or longer situations. UF's third down defense is ranked 21st nationally this season.
- ■The Florida defense has held its opponent's top rusher to under 100 yards in 18 of the last 23 games. The Gators have held opponents under 100 yards net rushing in seven of the last 10 wins dating back to last year.
- In the last 36 games, the Gators have scored points off turnovers in 27 games. 100 of UF's points this season have come off turnovers.
- ■The Gators rank third nationally in turnover margin this season, while Urban Meyer-coached teams rank second nationally during the last five years in turnover margin (+70) after forcing 150 turnovers and committing just 81 in 58 games.

■The Florida defense is under the direction of co-coordinators Charlie Strong and Greg Mattison. Mattison came to Florida from Notre Dame, where he was the defensive line coach/recruiting coordinator from 2002-04. Chuck Heater, UF's recruiting coordinator and cornerbacks coach was the defensive coordinator at Colorado State from 1991-92. Between the three, they possess 18

years of experience at the defensive coordinator position.

■The Florida defensive staff has 107 years of combined collegiate coaching experience: Chuck Heater (29), Doc Holliday (27), Greg Mattison (29), Charlie Strong (22).

LINEBACKERS

- ■Earl Everett was second on the squad against Florida State with seven tackles. His 67 stops this season are the best total on the squad. Everett's total is tied for 19th in the SEC (as of Dec. 4).
- ■Brandon Siler has recorded at least half a tackle for a loss in nine of the Gators' 11 games this season. The only games he did not record a tackle for a loss in were against Louisiana Tech and South Carolina.
- ■This season, linebacker Brandon Siler leads the SEC with seven fumble recoveries. No other player in the league has more than four recoveries.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- ■Jeremy Mincey is second on the Gator squad with 61 tackles this season. The total is tied for 30th in the SEC this year and leads all defensive linemen. Mincey looks to become the first defensive lineman since Robin Fisher (1979) to lead UF in tackles. No defensive end has ever led the Gators in tackles since 1973, when tackle stats were kept or available.
- Jarvis Moss came away with 1.5 sacks against Florid State to raise his season count to 7.5. His total leads Florida this year. Moss needs 1.5 more to break on to Florida's all-time single-season chart despite not getting into the regular rotation until the Kentucky game.
- ■Jeremy Mincey has had at least one tackle for a loss in nine of 11 games this season. His 10.5 lead the Gators this season. Mincey needs 3.5 more to break on to UF's all-time single-season chart.
- ■On Monday, Sept. 19, starting defensive end Ray McDonald underwent surgery to repair meniscus tears in his right knee and a partially torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee suffered in the game against Tennessee. From that point, he was expected to be out 4-6 weeks. He returned to play two snaps LSU on Oct. 15, and increased his action against Georgia on Oct. 29.

SECONDARY

- ■A member of the Gator secondary has had a sack in five of the 11 games this season. CB Nick Brooks had one against Wyoming, safety Reggie Nelson had one against Louisiana Tech and Kentucky and two against Mississippi State. Safety Jarvis Herring had one against UT and Mississippi State. Nelson's four sacks rank second on the squad and have averaged to drop opponents for a loss of 8.0 yards per sack.
- ■On Thursday, Sept. 29, defensive back Nick Brooks underwent surgery to correct cartilage damage in his left knee.
- Against Vanderbilt on Nov. 5, cornerback Vernell Brown fractured his fibula on a punt return. Fromthat point, Brown was expected to be out for 4-6 weeks.
- ■Florida's defense has intercepted 52 passes since 2003, when Charlie Strong took over as defensive coordinator. The three-year total is the fourth-highest total in the nation over the time period and is the best among SEC teams.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- ■Florida's special teams rank ninth nationally in net punting (38.0 per punt), while the Gators' punt return defense is second best nationally allowing 3.4 per return. UF's kick return average this season of 22.4 would be the best for the Gators since 1998 (23.3).
- ■Against Florida State, Reggie Lewis returned a blocked field goal 52 yards for a touchdown. In research dating back to 1979, the Gators had not returned a blocked field goal for a touchdown.
- ■Florida scored just its second defensive extra point in school history against South Carolina when Dee Webb returned a blocked PAT for two points in the second quarter.
- ■Marcus Thomas' blocked field goal in the Florida State game was the fourth blocked kick of the year by the Gators and the second by Thomas in as many games as he blocked an extra point against South Carolina. UF has blocked two field goals, a punt and an extra point this season. Since UF records began being kept in 1978, the total is tied for the fourth-most in school history:

FSU entered the game ranked first in the ACC and 22nd nationally with 12.4 yards per punt return. This marked the seventh time this season the Gators have held an opponent to one yard or less on punt returns this year.
- ■UF has held the SEC's top two punt returners (Georgia's Thomas Flowers and LSU's Skyler Green) to two returns for nine yards.
- ■Eric Wilbur has had a punt of 50-yards or longer in seven of Florida's 11 games this season.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2006

THE SCHEDULE

■UF opens the season on Sept. 2, 2006, against Southern Mississippi in Gainesville. The Gators start the year with five of their first six games at home for the second time in three seasons. Florida is 33-15-3 against members of Conference USA all-time, having last matched up with a member of the conference in the 2002 season opener against UAB, which the Gators won 51-3.

THE TEAM

- ■Entering the 2006 season, UF's returning leaders in each of the following departments are projected to return: rushing, passing, receiving yards, interceptions, kick returns, fumble recoveries, scoring, field goals, total offense, punting, kickoffs, all purpose yards. UF should also return five of its top seven leaders in tackles.
- ■The Gators should return seven starters on offense and lose four, while the defense will return seven starters and lose four. After losing four two-year starters heading into 2005, the Gators should lose five going into 2006 (LT Randy Hand, RT Lance Butler, C Mike Degory, DE Jeremy Mincey, and SS Jarvis Herring).
- ■Overall, the Gators should return 27 players who made at least one start during the 2005 regular season. They should also lose only nine players who started at least one game after losing only six going into the 2005 season.
- ■UF should return each of the eight players who accounted for the 11 runs of over 20 yards in the 2005 regular season. In addition, the 2005 Gator roster is projected to include the eight different players who accounted for each of UF's 29 receptions of 20-plus yards in the 2005 regular season.
- ■Going into 2005, the Gators brought back seven players who began playing for UF in the fall semester of 2001. In 2006, Florida is projected to bring back 11 (Dallas Baker, Jemalle Cornelius, Brian Crum, Gavin Dickey, Reggie Lewis, Steven Harris, Jermaine McCollum, Tremaine McCollum, Ray McDonald, Kenneth Tookes and DeShawn Wynn).

THE OFFENSE

- ■Returning to the offense should be WR Dallas Baker, WR Chad Jackson, WR Jemalle Cornelius, WR Andre Caldwell, RG Steve Rissler, QB Chris Leak and RB DeShawn Wynn. Departing are LT Randy Hand, LG Tavares Washington, C Mike Degory and RT Lance Butler.
- Of the 15 players that have rushed the ball for Florida this year only one was a senior (Randy Hand, who had a 1-yard run against Florida State). Of the 13 players that have catches, none are seniors this season. Of the 16 players that have scored points for the Gators this season, none are in the 2005 senior class.

THE DEFENSE

- ■Returning to the defense should be DE Joe Cohen, DT Marcus Thomas, DT, Steven Harris, LB Brandon Siler, LB Earl Everett, CB Dee Webb, and Reggie Nelson and Kyle Jackson who split time at FS this season. Departing are DE Jeremy Mincey, LB Todd McCullough, SS Jarvis Herring and CB Vernell Brown.
- **UF** should return six of its top seven tacklers on the defensive line.
- ■For the second straight season, UF should only need to replace two member of its secondary. The Gators are projected to bring back members of the team that accounted for 10 of UF's 15 regular season interceptions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

After losing its top place kicker, kickoff specialist and long snapper heading into the 2005 season, Florida is project to return its key players in each of those areas for 2005 as well as Eric Wilbur who has handled punting duties since 2003. Wilbur is expected to be joined by place kicker (Chris Hetland), kickoff specialist (Jonathan Phillips) and long snapper (James Smith).

ATTENDANCE NOTES


- ■In 2004, Florida ranked seventh nationally in average attendance with a total of 88,409.
- ■The attendance for the Tennessee game on Sept. 17, 2005, of 90,716, established a school record. The previous school record stood at 90,707, set against Wyoming in the 2005 season opener on Sept. 3. The school record setting crowd as the largest to ever watch a football game in the state of Florida. The state has hosted 12 Super Bowls, two BCS national title games and have featured a team that went on to win at least a share of the national title in a bowl game 18 times.
- ■The attendance for the season opener (90,707) was the largest opening-day crowd in Florida history. The previous record was 90,011 against San Jose State in the 2003 opener. The Gators opened the 2004 season against Eastern Michigan in front of a crowd of 90,009.
- ■The attendance of Florida's game at Tennessee (109,061) on Sept. 18, 2004, was the largest ever to see a Gator team play.
- ■The attendance for the 2004 Florida-Georgia game was an AllTel Stadium record (84,753). The previous record of 84,433 was set at the Florida-Georgia game in 2002.
- ■In 2004, the Gators sold all available season tickets (78,300). That figure continues to rank as the second-highest in the state of Florida history for any team - collegiate or professional.
- ■The Gators have ranked among the nation's top-15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 23 years (1982-2004) and have ranked among the nation's top-eight schools in each of the last 14 years (1991-2004).
- ■UF's average of 90,405 fans per home game in 2005 ranked as the best single-season mark in school history. The mark bettered that of the 2003 season in which the Gators averaged 90.176.
- Florida has a current streak of 102-consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. Here is where UF ranks nationally for current consecutive sellouts:

- ■Florida's home winning percentage of .887 (87-11) ranks third-best in the nation since 1990.
- ■The Gators had two significant streaks at "The Swamp" in the 1990s: a 23-game win streak from 1990-93 and a 30-game streak from 1994-99, In 98 home games since 1990, UF has scored 30 or more points 74 times and has held its opponent to 14 or less points 52 times.
- ■Since 1990, UF has outscored its opponents at "The Swamp" by a combined total of 3,946-1,551 (an average of 40.2 to 15.8 for an average victory margin of 24.4).
- ■Since 1990, Florida has lost only five times at home to a team ranked below the top five.

FLORIDA AND THE NFL...

■ The 2005 National Football League season began on Thursday, Sept. 8. All notes below reflect 2005 opening day totals and the 2005 NFL Draft.

GATORS AND THE NFL DRAFT

- Former Gator quarterback Rex Grossman's firstround selection by the Chicago Bears in 2003 marked the seventh-straight year and eighth time in the last 11 years that a Florida players has been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft. Florida's 26 first-round draft choices since 1983 is the thirdbest total in the nation. Since the first NFL Draft in 1936, a Florida player has been selected in the first-round 35 times, covering 26 separate seasons. It marks the fourth-most number of years for a top pick by any school in the nation.
- One of only two schools to have had at least one first-round draft selection in 17 of the last 23 drafts.
- UF has had at least 40 players chosen in the NFL Draft for the decades of 1950, 1960, 1970, 1980 and 1990. UF already has 33 selections from the years 2000-05.
- The Gators had at least one NFL first-round draft choice for nine-straight seasons (1983-91). This marked the second-longest streak by any college in the history of the draft.

FLORIDA NFL NOTES

- ■Florida had 37 players on 2005 NFL opening day rosters, which tied for the second-highest total in the nation. Last season, UF's 36 players were tied for the fifth-highest total of any school in the country.
- ■Overall, Florida had 42 former players appear on 2004 NFL rosters throughout the 2004 sea-
- Florida's six wide receivers on 2005 NFL rosters ties Tennessee for the top total in the nation. Last season, UF's seven wide receivers on 2004 NFL rosters ranked as the highest total nation-
- UF's five running backs on 2005 NFL rosters is the second highest amount from any school nationally behind Miami (six).

Former Gator Emmitt Smith became the NFL's all-time leading rusher on Sunday, Oct. 27. 2002, with an 11vard run against Seattle the Seahawks in Dallas. Smith surpassed the longtime record held by Walter Payton, who rushed for 16,726 yards in his 13-year ca-



On April 12, 2003, Florida fans got the opportunity to recognize one of their own as Emmitt Smith was honored at halftime of the 2003 Orange and Blue Spring game.

Smith was a three-time All-American at the

University of Florida from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928 yards. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a firstround selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. On Friday, Feb. 4, 2005, Smith retired from the NFL. Smith starred for 13 seasons with the Dallas Cowboys and spent the last two years with the Arizona Cardinals. He finished his career with 18,355 rushing yards and 164 rushing touchdowns, both of which are the highest totals ever posted in NFL history.



Columbus Freshman Player of the Year honor.

- ▶ Went 6-3 as a freshman starter, the highest winning percentage of a rookie QB in the country, and was 6-1 against SEC teams.
- ▶ Ranked second in SEC history for a true freshman in yards (2,167), completions (168) and touchdowns (14).
- ▶ Became the second Gator freshman QB to defeat three top-15 teams during his rookie season, lifting the Orange and Blue to wins over No. 4 Georgia, No. 6 LSU and No. 9 Florida State. Kerwin Bell had accomplished the feat in 1984 (No. 8 Georgia, No. 11 Auburn and No. 12 Florida State).

- ▶ Is 210-of-334 on the year with 2,361 yards, a completion percentage of .629, 18 touchdowns and six interceptions.
- ▶ Ranks third in the SEC with 214.6 yards passing per game and is third in total offense with 219.2 yards per game.
- ▶ Leak's 18 touchdown passes are third in the league, just behind co-leaders Jay Cutler of Vanderbilt (21) and D.J. Shockley of Georgia (21).
- ▶ Is fourth among SEC quarterbacks in pass efficiency with a mark of 136.4.
- ▶ Has thrown for three or more touchdowns three times this season: Wyoming (3), Kentucky (4) and Vanderbilt (3).
- ▶ Rates second on the Gators behind DeShawn Wynn (seven) with six rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ Has carried the ball 92 times this year for a net of 50 yards (0.5 average).
- ▶ Became the first quarterback since Kerwin Bell (1985-86) to defeat Florida State in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Led the Gators to a 34-7 rout of the Seminoles by going 19-for-28 for 211 yards and a pair of touchdowns, with one interception.
- ▶ Leak's performance marked the first time this season he has thrown for over 200 yards in three-straight games.
- ▶ He has also fired multiple touchdown passes three games in a row and six times in 2005.
- ▶ Finished 18-of-31 for 210 yards and threw two touchdown passes at South Carolina, 31 yards to Chad Jackson and 11 yards to Billy Latsko.
- ▶ Was sacked five times by the Gamecocks and his interception on a tipped pass led to USC's first score of the after-
- ▶ Chosen as the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his heroics in the triumph over Vanderbilt.

- ▶ Completed a career-high 32 passes in 41 attempts for 257 yards and three touchdowns in the double-overtime win over Vanderbilt.
- ▶ Matched a career-high with two rushing touchdowns and gained a career-high 67 yards on 12 attempts (5.6 average).
- ▶ Leak's rushing total was the highest for a Florida QB since Terry LeCount gained 108 yards against Georgia on Nov. 5, 1977.
- ▶ Became the second Gator quarterback to lead the team in rushing this season, as Josh Portis had 45 yards against Wyoming.
- ▶ Had not thrown an interception in his last 91 attempts entering the South Carolina game.
- ▶ Completed a passes to 10 different receivers in the win over Vandy and six of them had multiple catches.
- ▶ Oddly enough, Leak's longest passes were 16-yard completions to Markus Manson and Jemalle Cornelius.
- ▶ His 78 percent completion rate (32-for-41) was his second-highest this season, just shy of the 25-for-32 (78.1) effort versus Kentucky.
- ▶ Was 15-for-20 with 108 yards and a touchdown pass to tight end Tate Casey in UF's 14-10 win over No. 4 Georgia.
- ▶ Also had a three-yard TD run on the Gators' opening possession of the game, a 13-play, 80-yard drive.
- ▶ Leak's TD pass and run against UGA marked the third time he's done both in a game this season. He only accomplished that in two games each of his previous two seasons.
- ▶ Joined Danny Wuerffel are the only quarterbacks in school history to beat four top-10 teams away from Gainesville (at LSU, at Arkansas, at Florida State and vs. Georgia in Jacksonville).
- ▶ Leak has not thrown an interception against the Bulldogs during his career.
- ▶ Had a rough afternoon at LSU, finishing 11-for-30 for 107 yards and zero touchdowns.
- ▶ His passing yardage was the lowest since he became a starter.
- ➤ Carried the ball 12 times but had -32 yards rushing and was sacked four times.
- ▶ Threw for 244 yards against Mississippi State by going 18-for-33. Had two interceptions and one TD pass.
- ▶ Gained 15 yards on six carries, including a three-yard rushing touchdown.
- ▶ Was 16-of-37 for 187 yards and no touchdowns and threw two interceptions at Alabama.
- Streak of pass attempts without a pick ended at 117 in a row, tying Wayne Peace (1981) for the third-longest stretch by a

Gator QB. Danny Wuerffel holds the record with 121 set between the 1995-96 seasons.

- ▶ Leak's last interception had come on the final play of the 2004 Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl versus Miami (Fla.).
- ▶ Turned in his sixth career 300-yard effort by going 25-for-32 for 319 yards and a season-high four touchdowns against Kentucky. The Gators are 6-0 when he goes over 300 yards.
- ▶ The four TD tosses were the secondmost of his career, shy of the six he had against South Carolina on Nov. 13, 2004.
- ▶ Fell three yards short of matching his career-best for yards, 322 against Arkansas last season.
- Was a sizzling 21-for-26 for 298 yards and four TDs in the first half versus the Wildcats.
- ▶ Completed passes to nine different receivers in the game.
- ▶ Directed the Gators to touchdowns on seven-straight possessions in the first half, including five drives over 50 yards (70, 87, 72, 67, 58).
- ▶ Leak was 5-of-5 passing on third down vs. Kentucky and is now 14-of-16 passing on third down in the last two games.
- ▶ Completed 17-of-26 passes for 179 yards versus Tennessee.
- ▶ Was 9-of-11 passing on third down against the Vols, converting six attempts for a new set of downs.
- ▶ Spread the ball out to five different receivers, including four who had multiple catches.
- ▶ Streak of nine-straight 200-yard passing efforts was halted by UT.
- ▶ Had a season-high 17-yard scramble on 3rd and 9 in the third quarter that set up a field goal and gave the Gators a 13-7 lead.
- ▶ Leak's two rushing touchdowns through the first two games of the season equaled Alex Smith's number of rushing TDs through the first two games of the 2004 season at Utah.
- ▶ Threw for two touchdowns and rushed for two scores in the 41-3 win over Louisiana Tech.
- ▶ With 219 yards passing against the Bulldogs, Leak went over 200 yards for the 20th time in his career to match Doug Johnson for fifth on the school's all-time list
- ▶ Completed passes to five different receivers, four of whom had receptions of over 20 yards.
- ▶ Leak's 80-yard scoring toss to Chad Jackson was his second-longest TD throw, just behind an 81-yarder to Jackson at Tennessee last September.

- ▶ Gained 16 yards on seven carries (2.3 avg.) and set a personal-high with two rushing TDs, each from a yard out.
- ▶ Had entered the game with 15 career rushing yards on 139 carries.
- ▶ Made season debut against Wyoming by going 26-for-34 for 320 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions.
- ▶ Established a school record with 17 consecutive completions, surpassing Steve Spurrier's mark that was set during the 1966 campaign. His 26 completions were also a career best.
- ▶ Moved into a tie for fourth on the SEC's all-time list for completions in a row. Tennessee's Tee Martin holds the standard of 24 straight against South Carolina in 1998.
- ▶ Hooked up with Chad Jackson three times for scores (26 yards twice, 7 yards).
- ▶ Exceeded the 200-yard plateau for the 19th time in his career and went over 300 yards for the fifth time.
- ▶ Leak attempted 34 passes without an interception against Wyoming. Only five quarterbacks attempted more nationally without throwing a pick.
- ▶ Named to the Watch Lists for the Walter Camp Football Foundation Player of the Year Award, the Davey O'Brien Award and the Maxwell Award.
- ▶ Appeared on one of *Sports Illustrated's* three regional covers for the publication's College Football Preview issue.
- ▶ Leak's appearance marked the sixth time UF football had been featured and the first time since 1996, when Danny Wuerffel was on a commemorative edition celebrating the Gators' national championship.
- ► Second-team quarterback on the SEC Coaches' Preseason squad behind Vanderbilt's Jay Cutler.
