HISTORICAL NOTE

The town of De Soto, Nebraska was named in honor of the Sixteenth Century Spanish Explorer, Hernando De Soto. The town was platted in 1854 and incorporated by the territorial legislature on March 7, 1855. De Soto served as the county seat from 1858-1866 when the seat was moved to Fort Calhoun. De Soto no longer exists at the present time.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection consists of the municipal records of De Soto, Nebraska on 1 roll of microfilm arranged in one series: (1) Minutes of the De Soto City Council, 1857-1873.

This collection relates to the municipal affairs of De Soto, Washington County, Nebraska, 1857-1873. These records were loaned for microfilming by the Washington County Historical Society in 1970.
