- A1 The **National** BFWG awards listed are in respect of the academic year 2007-2008 and are for women research students entering into their final year of formal study towards a PhD degree whether it be for writing up or research. (This assumes the application is made during the period of the competition). The **International** awards listed are mainly for the year 2008-2009 and can have different criteria to the National awards.
- A2 The chief criterion for offering awards is *academic excellence*, as evidenced by a proven ability to carry out independent research. Financial need and ineligibility for awards from other funding bodies do not constitute primary considerations.
- A3 Awards are for work in any branch of learning in the country of the applicant's choice, provided study is currently being undertaken in GB, except where stated.
- A4 Age is immaterial except where stated. BFWG does not discriminate on grounds of race or ethnic origin, nationality, marital status, disability or sexual orientation.
- A5 Funding sought often exceeds the amount of the award being offered. However, experience has shown that other

- awarding bodies with larger funds frequently make additional awards based on BFWG's earlier recommendation.
- A6 The *INTERNATIONAL* awards are open to all National Federations and Associations (NFAs) affiliated with the International Federation of University Women (IFUW). BFWG is a NFA. When applicants are of equal ability, preference normally will be given to members of a NFA. In certain cases interviewing by a NFA prior to recommending an applicant is required.
- A7 Travel costs from GB to the country of your research will not be paid to applicants successful in an *International* award.
- A8 It is not a condition to belong to BFWG or IFUW except where stated. Those interested in joining can do so online or tick the appropriate box on the coupon provided in this leaflet if paper copies are preferred.
- A9 Any changes in a recipient's plan of research, subsequent to the application, must have the prior written approval of the BFWG Academic Awards Committee.
- All papers must be word processed/typed in English.
- A11 The recipient of an award must submit a written report on the work completed between three and six months after the end of the award period.
- A12 The financial assistance given by any of the awards in this leaflet shall be acknowledged in any published material embodying the results of the work carried out.
- A13 The BFWG Academic Awards Committee has the right to withdraw any of the funds.
- A14 The BFWG Academic Awards Committee is unable to enter into correspondence once decisions have been reached

She studied at the London School of Medicine for Women, practised at the Nuffield Orthopaedic Peripheral Nerve Injury Unit in Oxford, lectured in Anatomy at the Royal Free Hospital London, was Professor Emeritus and also a member of the BFWG Academic Awards Committee and the IFUW Fellowships Committee.

### BFWG 3: Mary Bradburn Scholarship

Dr Mary Bradburn took her first maths degree and her PhD at Royal Holloway College where she spent by far the largest part of her life. She held postdoctoral fellowships in Edinburgh and New Zealand. She was appointed Senior Lecturer in the Royal Holloway College Mathematics department at the age of 26. She was also Dean.

### BFWG 4: Eila Campbell Scholarship

Professor Eila Campbell read Geography, gained her MA with distinction in the History of Cartography, later became Professor of Geography at Birkbeck College, and was awarded the Murchison award of the Royal Geographical Society

### BFWG 5: Margaret K B Day Scholarship

Miss Margaret Day, Treasurer of BFWG, read physics at St Hilda's Oxford

### **BFWG 6: Beryl Mavis Green Scholarship**

Dr Beryl Green was a Head Teacher before entering Lucy Cavendish College to read for a PhD in the Department of Architecture. She was deeply religious and had a lasting love of the fine arts. These skills were used to great advantage in her life as Bursar of Wesley House.

### **BFWG 7: Kathleen Hall Fellowship**

Dr Kathleen Hall had a special interest in the promotion of education at any level of girls and women in or from countries of low per capita income.

An early graduate of Bedford College, London, Miss Helen Joseph wished to encourage more women to enter the fields of her prize

Miss Barbara Northend studied French and Italian at Bedford College and after obtaining a teaching diploma taught in

a variety of schools before being appointed to headships in Leamington Spa and Worcester. She was, sometime, the Director of the Festival of Languages for the West Midlands. The factors which influenced pupils in their choice of foreign languages to study were the subject of her research.

### BFWG 10: Marjorie Shaw Scholarship

Dr Marjorie Shaw studied French and in 1946 was awarded a Doctorat de l'Université de Paris. She was appointed Senior Lecturer to the Department of French at Sheffield University. She edited 'Current Research in French studies'. Her own contributions were mainly in the field of 19<sup>th</sup> century French literature.

### BFWG 11: Johnstone & Florence Stoney Studentship

Dr Florence Stoney OBE, MD, BS was the pioneer of x-ray and ultra-violet light treatment at both the Royal Free and Garrett Anderson hospitals later heading the radiological department of the Fulham Military hospital and becoming President of the British Society of Radiologists. Miss Edith Stoney, her sister, a physicist and first Treasurer of BFWG, donated money in memory of her father (Johnstone Stoney) – who coined the word 'electron' - and her sister Florence.

### AAUW 1: Rose Sidgwick Memorial Fellowship (annual award)

Rose Sidgwick read modern history at Oxford and was appointed a history lecturer at Birmingham University when later she added WEA social studies lectures to her history. In 1918 she travelled to the USA as a member of an Educational Mission from British universities 'to encourage the intercourse between the universities of both countries'. The International Federation of University Women (IFUW) offers a limited number of international fellowships and grants to women graduates for advanced research, study and training. IFUW's competitions are held every two or three years. The most recent competition covered the 2005/06 academic year. As full details of the 2008/09 competition will not be available until March 2007, much of the information given below is based on the previous competition.

### Who can apply?

- 1. All applicants must be women graduates who are members of IFUW's National Federations and Associations (NFA) BFWG is a NFA and to IFUW International members.
- 2. The awards are intended for the second and subsequent years of a doctoral programme and for post-doctoral studies. A small number of awards may be available for Masters' level studies.
- 3. Students in any branch of learning may apply; however, priority is given to proposals related to IFUW priorities. These include the issues outlined in IFUW's Programme of Action, as well as to the improvement of the status of women and girls or women and to promotion of women in scientific and technological careers.
- 4. The awards are available for use in any country (unless otherwise stated); preference is given to women whose work will be carried out in a country other than their home country or the one in which they received their previous education.

### What are the other restrictions?

- 5. Fellowships are for 8-12 months of work. They are meant to encourage advanced scholarship and original research. Applicants must be well advanced in their research. First year doctoral students and applicants just beginning their research are not eligible.
- 6. Grants are for a minimum of 2 months of work. They are given to help women graduates to obtain specialized training and to carry out independent research.
- 7. IFUW Recognition Awards are for a minimum of 2 months of work.
- 8. All candidates must have obtained admission to the proposed place of study prior to applying to IFUW's competition. A letter of admission from the university of institution where the research is taking or will take place must accompany the application.
- 9. No assistance is given for attending conferences or for direct family support.

10. The awards are not renewable.

What is the application procedure?

- 11. Members of IFUW's national federations and associations must obtain the application package from and apply through their respective national headquarters.
- 12. If *recommended* by BFWG after interview, IFUW's own papers will then have to be completed and sent by BFWG together with their letter of recommendation, to reach Switzerland between 1 September and 1 October 2007. BFWG has a supply of these papers

Selection Criteria for awards IFUW 1/10:

- Motivation for research, study or training
- Originality and feasibility of proposed plan of research/study/training
- Extent to which the specialized knowledge and skills to be acquired will benefit others or further the applicant's career
- Planned work or activity after completion of the research/study/training
- Preference will be given to candidates whose research/study or training is to be undertaken in a country other than the one in which the applicant received her education or in which she habitually resides
- Special consideration will be given to proposals which relate directly to IFUW's priorities.
